## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### WHAT WILL HAPPEN NOW?

It was stated in the High Court in Dublin last Friday that the effect of the recent decision of the Westford Circuit Court in the case of the 130-year-old Valuation system was that the system would appear unconstitutional. It is not clear from the judgment whether all farmers' profits would be assessable to income tax, regardless of the valuation system.

Mr. Justice Barrington who delivered his reserved judgment in the case the previous week found that the orders made by the Valuation Act, 1852, to the extent that they provided for the valuation of land, were inconsistent with the Constitution.

There would also be a declaration that the rateable valuations of the plaintiffs' lands as made under section 2 of the Act of 1852 were inconsistent with the Constitution and invalid and nugatory as a basis for the assessment and levying of any county rate.

Mr. Justice Barrington also declared that the assessment made by the Valuation Office in respect of the plaintiffs of any of the taxes, charges, contributions or payments required to be levied or paid under the Income Tax Act as applied to farm land by the Valuation Act, 1974 was inconsistent with the Constitution.

Counsel for the Attorney General said that the effect of the Court's declaration would appear to mean that, as of now, all farmers' profits would be assessable to income tax regardless of rateable valuations.

That is, where the situation now stands, as far as the law is concerned and whether or not this leaves the farmers in a better position than the one they were in under the P.L.V. system remains to be seen.

The principal problem which the High Court decision now poses for Local Authorities is yet another facet of the situation. It would appear that local homes may have to be built back drastically.

The Government would like to reimburse the local Councils for the loss of any rateable income which might result from the decision.

In the meantime, the Government will consider whether to apply a straightforward accounts system which would assess all farmers for income tax like other taxpayers or to continue with some alternative system to replace the exist-

### IT WAS SUNSHINE ALL THE WAY

### AUCTIONEERS v ARCHITECT IN CIRCUIT COURT FEES CLAIM

A dispute over the fees to be paid to a Dungarvan auctioneer has followed the sale of a farm for £57,500 ended up in Dungarvan Circuit before Judge Darragh P. Sheridan.

Plaintiff in the civil action was the firm of Fahey and O'Neill, Auctioneers and Valuers, May Street, Dungarvan, who claimed £2,855.75 fees for services rendered against Maurice Christopher an architect of Robert's Cross, Ring, Dungarvan.

The defence was a denial that that amount was owing to the plaintiff company, that a figure of £1,000 plus advertising expenses was the agreed amount, and in consequence of that statement the defendant had lodged the sum of £1,000 in court.

Mr. T. Stattery, B.I., instructed by Messrs Gordon and Co., solicitors for the plaintiffs, stated that the action concerned the fees due for the sale of the defendant's 32 acre farm at Stedding, Co. Wick, on February 26, 1979, for £57,500 and that the fee was a sum of £2,855.75.

Mr. Fahey went on to say that he was subsequently sold the farm of £57,500 and that the fee was a sum of £2,855.75.

Witness said that following the sale of the farm the defendant had stated to him that the fee was £1,000 and that he was to be paid £1,000.

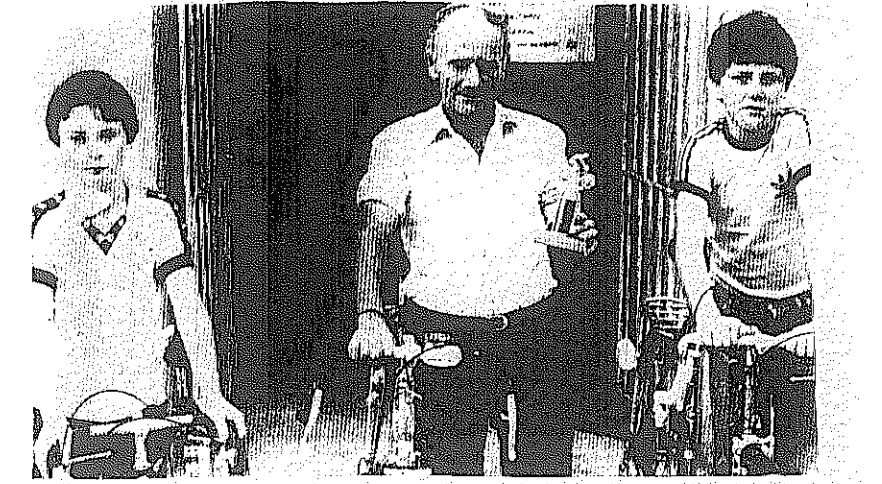

JUDGE TELLS CAPPOQUIN MAN 'YOU CAN CONSIDER YOURSELF VERY FORTUNATE'

Saying that by any yardstick his offence was a very serious one, Judge D. P. Sheridan told Michael Lennane, Dromena, Cappoquin at Dungarvan Circuit Court last week that he would adjourn his appeal against conviction for dangerous driving at Park Road, Lismore on April 20, 1981 but that he would have to give him the benefit of a doubt which had been created by the doctor's evidence and allow the appeal against conviction on drunken driving on the same occasion. Dr. James A. Callaghan, Lismore stated in evidence that on April 20, 1981, he had examined the appellant clinically in the Garda Barracks in Lismore at about 1.15 a.m. He found Lennane was able to walk a straight line and his co-ordination was good. "I felt," said the doctor, "that he was capable of driving although I might not have done as a passenger in his car."

A Captivating Street Of Memories By TOM TOBIN Ireland remains a nation of fascinating contrasts - particularly where past and present meet in a strange beauty. The slopes of Clare abound with these but the most unusual of all can be found in the shadow of 15th century Bunnary Castle within eight miles of Shannon Airport. It is a street of memories that recalls the Ireland of yesterday - the last 19th and early 20th centuries to be preserved in the old-type this of Colman's mustard to a bag of bulls' eyes can be bought from the young lady who is postmistress as well as keeper of the quality and taste of the varied selection of children's favourite sweets in their glass jars. On the corner of the street across the road is a row of shops which includes a hardware store, a grocery, an old printing works and a bakery. The printing machinery was taken there from Stoketown, Co. Roscommon where it is believed to have printed the Roscommon Herald at the turn of the century. This weekly newspaper which was founded in 1848 continues to be published in Boyle. MOST UNUSUAL At the beginning of the street is a beautiful thatched cottage, a pawnshop and a genuine old pub which was once a landmark in Limerick's colourful Edward Street. Perhaps the most unusual sight is the post-office box in brilliant red with its insignia of the Royal Mail - another authentic reminder of a bygone age. The interesting fact is that visitors can post a letter here in the knowledge that it will be delivered to its destination - local postmen see to that. There are two private residences along the street but of particular interest is the "Big House" on the hill overlooking the colourful panorama that makes Bunnary the most remarkable place of interest in Ireland today. This is an "living museum" where there is nothing phoney. Everything is authentic - down to the last detail and indeed, those moments of recollection.
