THE COLE GROWS

It is a fair question to ask: how many people who are drawing unemployment benefits and unemployment assistance (debt) would have seen this as their fate when in employment a few years ago? The shock of losing a job is something that only the one now suffering can explain. It is a blow that leaves a permanent mark for that reason, and people still in work while employment should be thankful for their good fortune.

With the announcement that the number of jobless in the country now well exceeds 150,000 and is rising, the situation is grave and is likely to get worse.

Where is it to end and when? It is too complicated to get deeply into the various aspects of what is undoubtedly a permanent feature of modern times not only in Ireland but all over Britain and the Continent. Thousands and thousands of healthy young men and women walking the streets with no hope for the future and it is not too difficult to realise what a situation like this can eventually lead to.

Yet there are those still in good jobs, sincere, one could say, who are at present prepared to put these jobs in jeopardy by demanding their full pound of flesh in the matter of further wage increases. Since the Government announced proposals for a wage freeze in the public sector, the union leaders of those employed in the public services have issued statements that all agreements would have to be honoured, the pay increases promised would have to be met or else.

It is only the small voice of reason which in these days it is a very small voice, must fall on the ears of the trade union leaders cutting through all the clamour about strikes and aggressive action. For that clamour should alarm the trade union leaders rather than put the flush of victory into their cheeks. Because what we have now is not a crisis for a Fianna Fail Government or for Taoiseach Charles J. Haughey but for the State and this means the crisis is a personal one for each and every one of us.

We must all therefore face up to the issue and more especially to our own unwillingness to face up to adopting the kind of remedies which we need to cure our national economic and social ills. Such remedies include a little more all-round effort, less self-indulgence especially in social interests, community co-operation and understanding and a realisation that we cannot maintain a much less improve on our standard of living on the basis of our current national effort and output.

The country is in one hell of a mess at matters stand and unless we are all prepared to work on these remedies as outlined above, and this includes the government and politicians, the sectional interests will win out but the country will lose and everyone will then go to the wall!

THE POLITICIANS MADE A BLUNDER

The Government's decision to increase Oireachtas allowances by up to 50% taken in the same week it imposed a pay freeze on the public sector has been properly described, in spite of the defence made for the decision, as disgraceful and blatantly hypocritical.

When news of the increases became public, "leaked" to the media it has been claimed by civil servants disgruntled by the pay freeze imposed on them, the public at large could hardly believe that the government no matter in what manner the increases may be justified, could pick such a time for making the decision.

WATERFORD BRIDGE CONTRACT SIGNED

The contract for Waterford's £8.1 million bridge over the River Suir, to replace the 70-year-old Redmond Bridge, was signed on Monday last by Waterford Corporation officials and officials of the Dublin-based firm of Irishness Ltd.

The new bridge will take four years to construct. It will have four lanes roughly on the site of the present bridge, with the opening span for shipping, the Mayor of Waterford said.

Mr. Connam said everyone in Waterford recognised the critical importance of the bridge to the region. He said that the bridge was Waterford's lifeline, and if it was limited to a low weight restriction, the consequences for the city—already hard pressed by job losses—would be incalculable.

For that reason the Corporation over the last ten years had now relaxed its efforts to provide a safe crossing. The deterioration of Redmond Bridge was so evident that it became necessary to replace it in the shortest possible time.

The city manager, Mr. Michael Doody, said that over the last ten years the Corporation had been beset by many problems—the fan-shaped area at the northern mouth of Redmond Bridge, the unsafe structure known as Terminal Street, and the difficulties with the opening spans of Redmond Bridge.
