PAYMENT OF TAX ON IMPORTS AT POINT OF ENTRY

The charge at the point of importation will, apply to all goods other than

(1) VAT exempted and zero rated goods.

entered for home use at the time of importation, to taxable goods imported for further

(i) Goods in transit or entered for transhipment.

(ii) Goods eligible for relief from customs duty at importation under existing temporary importation facilities or which would so qualify if they were imported from a third country — but see next paragraph,

(iii) Goods imported in circumstances which entitle them to admission without payment of customs duty, e.g. used personal and household effects and portable wedding presents imported on transfer of residence, goods imported within the travellers' personal luggage allowances, etc.

GOODS IMPORTED FOR FURTHER MANUFACTURE AND END-USE

(i) Goods imported for further manufacture and subsequent exportation (including inward processing goods) will be subject to payment of VAT at importation. The effect of the charge will however, be substantially reduced by the existing practice of othe Collector General of accepting monthly returns in the case of persons in a permanent

(ii) Goods on which Customs Duty would not be payable under certain EEC provisions, e.g. goods which qualify for a zero rate of duty subject to special conditions (certain "end-use" goods) are not exempt from VAT at importation

DEFERRED PAYMENT

Subject to participation in the Banks' Direct. Debiting Scheme an importer may defer until the 15th day of the month payment of Value Added Tax due in respect of goods imported in the previous calendar month. Importers wishing to participate in this scheme must make prior application to the Local Collector of Customs and Excise. To facilitate importers, the Revenue Commissioners are prepared:

(i) to accept deferred payment arrangements with all financial institutions in the State subject to compliance with the necessary conditions and,

(ii) to accept debit arrangements made with one Collector of Customs and Excise only to cover all import points.

VALUE FOR VAT PURPOSES

(a) Subject to the exception in the next sub-paragraph the value of imported goods for the purposes of charging VAT may be taken as their value for customs purposes. (c.f. State frontier) increased by the amount of any C.C.T. duty, excise duty or other charges paid.

(b) Livestock (live cattle, sheep and pigs) — the value of imported livestock for the purposes of the VAT charge shall be 10% of their value as ascertained in

Where invoice prices are expressed in foreign currency the rate of exchange to be used is the selling rate in this country for the currency in question at the date of presentation of the customs entry.

ADDITIONAL (VAT) COPY OF CUSTOMS ENTRY

VAT registered persons must present to Customs an additional (VAT) copy of each entry on which VAT is being paid or deferred.

PARCEL POST

Where taxable pools in parcels or Green Label letter post which do not exceed £200 in value are imported by a registered person for the purposes of his business they will be exempted from the requirement to pay VAT at importation. Consignors should be instructed to quote the consigner's registration number on the declaration or Green Label wrapper, in all other circumstances taxable goods imported by parcel post will be subject to payment of VAT at importation.

Taxable persons will be entitled to deduct in their VAT Returns the VAT paid or charged at importation in relation to goods used for the purpose of their taxable activities. Customs will provide proof of the amount paid (or deferred) to the trader on this agent, by means of the issue in all such cases of a copy of the customs import entry for the goods.

VAT NUMBERS Importers' should, ensure that their VAT. No, is quoted correctly on all import entries so that all ideductions can be allowed promptly.

Where the entry is being completed by an agent acting on behalf of the importer, the importer's VAT No. and not that of the agent should be quoted Where a subsidiary company or a branch of a company is separately registered for VAT, it must quote its own VAT. No on import entries.

Where an importer is not registered for VAT the words "Not Regd." should be entered in the VAT No. Box on the entry form.
