## PENSMAN TAKES YOU BEHIND THE SPOTLIGHT

**REPORT ON CRIME 1981**

In the course of his report to the Minister for Justice on the year ended December 31, 1981, Mr. P. McLoughlin, Commissioner Garda Síochána, stated that the number of indictable offences recorded for the year totalled 8,433 showing an increase over the previous year of 7,872. Previous year's offences were recorded in 1980 and 1981, the year reported for this increase and of the overall total number of 12,344.

Commissioner McLoughlin pointed out that the noticeable increase in the number of offences recorded in 1981 was in the area of armed robbery, with 3,305 committed during the year compared with 174 in 1980 and 225 in 1979.

Referring to road traffic accidents during the year resulting in the deaths of 572 people, he stated that the number of accidents and persons killed compared with the previous year.

The introduction to the report which contains a big number of statistical tables dealing with all aspects of crime during the period which it covers is concluded by Commissioner McLoughlin as follows: "While there are many serious weaknesses in our legal system requiring change, the existence of laws and their enforcement alone will not ensure an acceptable standard of public behaviour. Apart from the many agencies from whom a high degree of co-ordination and determination is required, the most powerful controlling influence in society can be pressure of public opinion and the general expectation of a community regarding the behaviour of its members. It is necessary that all the agencies and influences be brought to a greater degree of co-operation in creative projects aimed at developing mutual trust and understanding between all the diverse elements in our society."

The report proper contains, such information as, there were 21 murders in 1981 compared with 23 in 1980; there were 13 cases of attempted murder. There were 11 cases of manslaughter, none of which arose out of traffic accidents. The total value of property stolen in 1981 was £29,937,678, of which only £4,974,351, representing 16.6% was recovered. During the year the following quantities of arms, ammunition, explosives, illegally held, were seized—211 firearms, including rifles, shotguns, machine guns, pistols, revolvers, etc.; 17,349 rounds of assorted ammunition; 4,421 shotgun cartridges; 237,327 rounds of rifle cartridges; 2,511 lbs. of explosive mixture; 3 rockets; 49 bombs; 5 hand grenades; 14 lbm. devices; 865 yards of fuse wire.

During the year 1,069 persons were reported missing. At the end of the year 26 persons were still not traced. A total number of 12,933 persons were breath tested of which 5,912 proved positive. The total number of parking violations was 633,994 while the number in respect of the non-display of licence discs totalled 81,722.

## PGT BLAME CIE

Our recent complaints about the repeated delays in postal deliveries in Dungarvan from West Waterford has drawn a comment from a spokesman for the Postal Service in which he claims that CIE and not PGT are to blame for these delays.

The position is that the postbags from Cappoquin, Lismore and Tallow all have to first go on to Mallow and are returned from there by rail via Limerick Junction to Waterford city and then back to Dungarvan. According to the PGT Spokesman the delay occurs at Mallow when CIE misroutes some of the post bags from the West Waterford towns.

It seems a terribly roundabout fashion to get letters down from places like Tallow which is less than 20 miles from Dungarvan to send them almost on a CIE circuit of Counties Tipperary and Waterford.

## Problem of repairs to county Roads Continues

Until and unless we can come to an agreement with the Minister (for the Environment) to transfer money from the Main Roads allocation for repairs to County Roads no progress will be made and in this regard I feel we are not facing up to our responsibilities as far as the County Roads are concerned said Cllr. C. O'Riain at the monthly meeting of Waterford County Council held in Dungarvan.

Before the meeting was the County Engineer's Progress Report on Roads in the county for the month of August.

This stated that routine maintenance and surface dressing was carried out on various roads throughout the county during the month. In regard to National Primary Road Improvement Works it stated that Dunbarrow By-pass the continuation of the road to the Spring was in progress. In regard to National Secondary Road Improvement works the report stated that work at widening the road at the 'Kilcree Road' was recommenced during September.

Cllr. C. Curran said that most county roads were in a deplorable state at present.

Cllr. O'Riain then said that he had a good winter last year if they should get a bad winter this year then the County roads would end up in a shocking condition.

Mr. J. Shine, Chief Assistant County Engineer endorsed what had been said by all the County Councillors. They were, he said, using up a capital resource and in due course they would have to find a substantial amount of money to repair what they could not now maintain.

Cllr. J. A. Walsh said that he had heard the suggestion put forward that the Government should put in a gallon on the price of petrol and allocate what this realised to the repair of county roads. In view of the usual big increases of up to 10p per gallon he thought an extra 1p would not make much difference. "But," he added, "it should realise sufficient money to repair and maintain county roads throughout the country in a proper condition."

The County Engineer's Progress Report was noted.
