



The Minister also urges beneficiaries in their own interest to cash their cheques only where they are known or can be identified.

The Minister appreciates the assistance provided by those who have traditionally cashed cheques for social welfare beneficiaries. He hopes that they will continue to fulfil this role for those who are known to them or who can produce satisfactory

The Minister is satisfied that the exercise of proper control procedures would eliminate abuses that have developed. The ease with which cheques can be cashed has led to attacks on postmen to rob delivery and to other forms of theft.

It is in the public interest to eilminate cheque abuses. With this in mind the Department of Social Welfare in future will not relmburse those who cash social welfare cheques for unauthorised persons.
