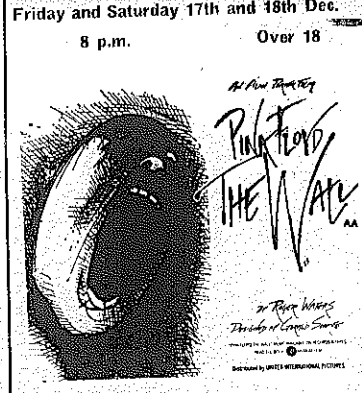

SUGAR COMPANY REACHES NEW PRICES AGREEMENT WITH FARMERS

With the country's best ever sugar beet harvest entering its final stages, agreement on prices and conditions for next year's crop has been reached between I.F.A. and the Sugar Company.

The company is offering farmers the opportunity to grow 10,000 acres of beet next year. This is about 4,000 acres more than was actually grown this year and which is giving the country processed crop worth more than £120,000,000 — £100,000,000 plus in sugar. £20,000,000 in animal feeds derived from the pulp and molasses in the beet and compounded by the Sugar Company.

Under the agreement, for next season, growers will be paid £23 per tonne for beet with 16% sugar together with any percentage basic price increase arising from the 1983 Spring Farm Price Review in Brussels and/or any Green Currency Adjustment. There are many additional elements to this agreement — which has been reached months earlier than hitherto — one is the decision by the Sugar Company to hold its sugar beet company fertiliser for next season's crop at this year's price. As well, the company has undertaken to provide credit to all growers requiring it at the best possible rate of interest which C.S.E. can secure.

TWO-PRONGED PRE-CHRISTMAS ATTACK ON DRUNK DRIVERS

The menace of drinking drivers is to be the subject of an unprecedented two-pronged attack throughout the country in the run up to Christmas and the New Year.

Details of the joint campaign organised by the Garda and the National Road Safety Association were released in Dublin recently.

Garda Superintendents throughout the country have been directed to step up enforcement of road traffic law with particular emphasis on drinking offences — excessive speed and dangerous driving.

The NRSA is mounting an intensive drive aimed especially at reducing the death and injury rate during the period from 1.12 to 31.12. Drunk is known to be a major factor in the majority of these accidents and the high level of enforcement and celebrations which occurs at this time of year is a particularly hazardous business.

Special guidelines have been drawn up for Garda Organisers, Functions Managers and Club Secretaries. Thanks to the willing support of the Confederation of Irish Industry, the IHPU, the Irish Hotels Federation, the Golfing Union of Ireland, Licensed Vendors and local authorities throughout the country, it is hoped that copy of these guidelines will be circulated to every premises in Ireland where functions will be held during Christmas and the New Year.

AGREEMENT REACHED ON NEXT SEASON'S SUGAR BEET CROP

Agreement has been reached between Comhluht Siúcra Éireann and the beet and vegetable section of the I.F.A. on prices and conditions for the 1983/84 sugar beet crop. These are as follows:

ACREAGE
C.S.E. will accept 90,000 acres of sugar beet next season.

PRICE
C.S.E. will pay growers £33 per tonne at 16% sugar content together with any percentage basic price increase arising from the 1983 Spring Farm Price Review in Brussels and/or Green Currency Adjustment that will be applicable.

The percentage increase in the sugar content scale will be based on the final basic beet price agreed. The final Irish beet price to be agreed after the details of the spring review in Brussels are made known.

ALLOWANCES
Early Delivery: The current early delivery allowances will be increased pro-rata by the amount by which the basic sugar price increases following the 1983 spring farm price review.

Late Delivery: The current late delivery allowances will remain unchanged.

FERTILISER PRICE HELD
C.S.E. will hold the price of sugar beet compound fertiliser for next year at same level as in 1982.

OTHER INPUTS
Chemicals: Probably an increase of 7/8% but not expected to be above 10%.

Seed: £31 per 100,000 Seed pack.
£16 per 50,000 Seed pack.

CREDIT
Credit will be made available to growers as in the past at the best possible rates of interest which Comhluht Siúcra Éireann can obtain.

LEVIES
Any levies imposed by the E.E.C. and applicable to Irish growers will be deducted from the agreed Irish basic price.

CONTRACTS
Contracts are now being prepared and C.S.E. will be in touch with growers with a view to signing contracts at an early date. Intending new growers should contact their nearest sugar factory as soon as possible.

BEST CROP ON RECORD

In a comment on the agreement, Mr. John P. Gray, Chief Executive of the company's sugar division, said that the early agreement would enable farmers sufficient time to plan and harvest the crop but, more importantly would allow them to tend to the very vital work of soil preparation and fertiliser for next season's crop at this year's price. As well, the company has undertaken to provide credit to all growers requiring it at the best possible rate of interest which C.S.E. can secure.

Mr. Gray said that this season's harvest — now around three-quarters secured — would bring in around 550,000 tonnes of the company's 7,000 growers together with substantial additional benefits to Irish farmers from the by-products of the crop. This he said has been the best crop on record with yields at present running at around 15 tonnes to the acre and sugar content at 16% or better. It is particularly heartening, he said, that farmers and the company have been able to fill not just the nation's A Quota for sugar but will also fill the B Quota as well. This means that land with over £100,000,000 of sugar from 85,000 acres — and that without any import factor involved.

NATIONAL MEMORIAL FOR LATE ICMSA LEADER

As a national memorial to the farmer leader James O'Keefe, it has been decided to establish the James O'Keefe Memorial Institute in his native Newmarket, Co. Cork. It was announced today Wednesday (December 8th).

A representative working party under the chairmanship of Mr. Donald Murphy, General Secretary of the Irish Creamery Milk Suppliers' Association, is embarking on a fund-raising campaign to raise £250,000 towards acquiring, restoring and refurbishing Newmarket House and its surrounding 30 acres, which will be operated by ACOT as an Educational and Training Centre principally for young farmers.

In addition, plans are being formulated for the use of the Institute as a place for general adult education for all sectors of the community.

The Institute will have an independent Board of Governors.

TOWN CLERK REPORTS ON DUNGARVAN SCHEMES

In the course of a report on the current Capital schemes being carried out in the town by the Dungarvan Urban Council, Mr. E. White, Town Clerk, informed members of the Council at their November monthly meeting of the progress being made in the following:

MARINE OUTFALL
Sanction from the Department of the Environment has now been received for the project. The contractor for the electrical works is, at present, with the Department of the Environment awaiting sanction.

Low facilities for the project in the sum of £355,000, which will attract a 50% subsidy, have been approved by the Department of the Environment. Work is scheduled to commence in early 1983.

SPORTS CENTRE AT QUANNS

The project is scheduled to start within the next few days. The contractors are Messrs. Petherick Construction Ltd. and the contract sum is £435,705.99. The duration of the contract is expected to be approximately one year.

When in operation, the Dungarvan Urban District Council will be responsible for the maintenance of the project. Several other community related projects are envisaged in the same area, and some are at a very advanced stage of planning.

(a) The Youth Club General Purpose Hall.
(b) The Handball Club — erection of the volleyball court.
(c) The Vocational Education Committee — provision of new school complex.

WATER AUGMENTATION SCHEME AT SPRINGMOUNT

The contractor for the Civil Works on this scheme, Mr. P. O'Brien, Ballydoobey, Co. Wick, has now entered on site. The contract is in the sum of £23,512.

The electrical contract is by the sum of £11,192 and the contractor is Electrical and Pump Services Ltd., Malrow, Co. Cork. The Clarination Contract is in the sum of £1,552 and the contractor is Flow Control Limited, Ballyragget, Co. Kilkenny.

This contract is expected to be completed within three months and it is envisaged that it will augment the town's supply by approximately 400,000 to 500,000 gallons per day.

HOUSING SCHEME PHASE 1 ABBEYSIDE

Work on this scheme is now nearing completion. Architects reports and discussions with the building indicate that the scheme will be handed over before the end of December, 1982.

The Co. Manager, Mr. Dan Hurley, told the Council that he had arranged to have 1,500 trees planted in the open spaces around the town and in Abbeyside to act as shelter belts. The area in Abbeyside would be fully developed and landscaped over the next few weeks.
