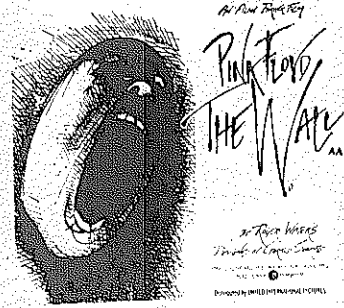

DECREES TOTALLING £1,314 FOR SMASHED WINDOW AND DAMAGED HORSE-BOX

"I would not mind getting my hands on these people," Judge Diarmuid P. Sheridan told a Dungarvan business man at the local sittings of the Circuit Court when he awarded a decree totalling £1,314 to Peter Quailly, O'Connell Street, who successfully brought two maliceous injury claims against Waterford County Council. The first claim related to an incident during the night of January 3rd, 1979, when a dog was thrown through the applicant's shop window and the second claim related to the destruction of his horse-box which was taken from outside his premises and was found several miles away at the bottom of a cliff. Giving evidence in support of his claims in respect of the 79 incident, Mr. Quailly told the court that the beer barrel was sent crashing through his window which was completely shattered. A number of other windows in premises in the town were also smashed around that time, he said. Judge Sheridan said that the damage was clearly malicious and he awarded the applicant a decree for £564 agreed damages and costs. Mr. Quailly also told the court that on the night of July 16th he parked his horse-box outside his O'Connell Street premises and next morning found that it was gone. It was subsequently found at Ballyvoile where it had been pushed over the cliff and very badly damaged. Judge Sheridan said it was "instructive to understand the people who perpetrated such an act." "I certainly wouldn't mind getting my hands on those people," he said. The Judge awarded Mr. Quailly a decree for £750, agreed costs, and expenses. Mr. Patrick McCarthy, B.L. instructed by Gordon and Co., Solicitors, was for the applicant in both cases, with Mr. M. M. Hilly, Solicitor, representing Waterford County Council.
