#### NEW VETERINARY INSPECTION FEES ON SHEEP CRITICISED

The recent amounteement by the new Minister for Agriculture to increase the veterinary inspection fees on sheep destined for the export market by a further 26 per cent 4, 33p/head, was strongly criticised by Mr. John Deegan Chalman of the IFA National Sheep and Wool Committee in a statement.

Mr. Deegan also pointed out that as such levy increases were in no way related to producers incomes, the Department's move is regarded as a further extension of an indirect system of taxation on sheep farmers, and a distincentive to the development of Irish lamb exports.

It was regrettable, said Mr. Deegan, that Mr. Deasy should decide to further penalise our sheep producers in this way because they had been struggling for an existence, particularly in the hill areas for many years.



#### DETECTING MASTITIS

An early indication of mastitis is the finding of increased
numbers of white blood cells in
the milk at the routine screening tests. White blood cells
which are the body's natural
defence mechanism against infection and toxins are rushed
to the infected area in an attempt to protect the udder
against bacteria and inflamation.

Levels of infection that may not show up in the strip cup can be detected through chemi-cal tests on the milk. The chemical congeals the white cells, the gels being visible to the naked eye.

These low levels of infection are known as subclinical mas-litis. A more accurate evalua-tion of the state of disease is done by an actual cell count.
