PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

KEEN COMPETITION FOR CO-OPTIONS
It is expected that both the Fianna Fail and Fine Gael Parties within the constituency will be faced in the immediate future with problems of co-options: Fianna Fail with the problem of filling the vacancy on the County Council created by the recent lamented death of Mr. Charlie Curran and Fine Gael with the dual problem of filling vacancies on both the County Council and Dungarvan Urban Council by the imminent resignation of Minister for Agriculture, Austin Deasy from these Councils.

Other names in the grapevine would seem to indicate, as far as the Fine Gael co-optation on the County Council is concerned, that the Minister's seat here will go to Clashmore man Garry O'Halloran, now part-time owner of a licensed premises in Clashmore and the party's runner-up in the Dungarvan electoral area in the last County Council elections. Named also as a possible contender is veteran Fine Gael party member of Dungarvan Urban Council Richie Walsh, but views expressed would seem to favour the young Clashmore University man.

THE FIANNA FAIL NOMINEE
The position in regard to the co-optation to the Fianna Fail seat on the County Council due to the death of Clr. Curran would appear to be not so straightforward and already tensions within the party are once more beginning to rise.

THE OTHER MINISTER
There have been no indications, so far, as to what the intentions of Mr. Eddie Collins, Minister of State at the Department of Industry and Energy are in regard to his position on the County Council. He has made no statement so far as to whether he will resign his seat on the Council or, as he did in similar circumstances in the last Coalition Government, hold on to it.

Moves To Close Dungarvan Maternity Unit

Moved by the South Eastern Health Board to close the Maternity Unit attached to the District Hospital in Dungarvan are based on reports of visiting committees to the hospital who have been recommending that the maternity services there should be reviewed.

The figures of admission and births in recent years were given as follows: 1976—150 admissions, 124 births; 1979—124 admissions, 93 births; 1980—122 admissions, 87 births; 1981—95 admissions, 73 births.

SUPERMARKET CHAIN TO OPEN IN ABBEYSIDE?
The adjourned monthly meeting of Waterford County Council will reconvene on Monday next and one of the principal items on the agenda for the meeting is the disposal of land at Abbeyside for which the County Manager Mr. Dan Hurley will be seeking the Council's approval.

Now the County Manager has successfully concluded negotiations with the big London & Newcastle Supermarket chain for the sale of a site in the area and it is reported that the L&N has agreed to pay £101,000 for the 2.7 acres involved and which are located to the rear of the Texaco filling station at Sexton Street, Abbeyside.

SENATE ELECTION

The Editor, Dungarvan Leader.

Dear Sir,

I would appreciate if you would draw the attention of graduate readers in your area and indeed the general public to the fact that the National University of Ireland has issued to graduates for election of Senators, three from the National University of Ireland and three from Trinity College, Dublin.

While the Trinity College register is fairly accurate, those graduates in your area may be interested to know why many of them will have no vote and how some who have a vote will never get to use it.

In the National University of Ireland constituency, where graduates of University College, Dublin, University College, Cork, Maynooth, some training colleges and University College, Galway—a college that has never returned one of its staff on this panel—have a vote, there are 15,000 graduates. However, only 51,000 are registered and of those only 27,000 will vote. The reasons for this are many, but the main one is from the insistence of the National University of Ireland that the onus of registration is on the graduate, not on the college.

Some graduates may not have returned the forms they received around the same time they graduated. Some may have registered in the wrong constituency that were ones of temporary accommodation and may never have re-registered from their new permanent address. Some will go to the homes of parents and may not be forwarded to their graduate sons and daughters. This entire situation is a little less than scandalous.

I would appeal to those who may be in a position to do so to forward to graduates their voting papers as soon as possible so that they may be returned before January 30.

Thank you for giving me the space to make this appeal. Needless to say I would appreciate the support of the graduates of your region.

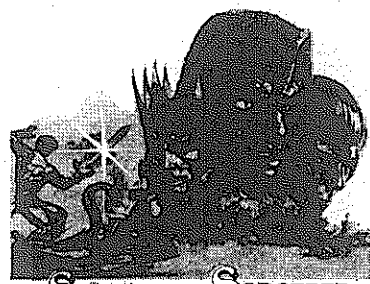

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

Q.—My husband died last year and I have decided to go back to work. Could you tell me how much social insurance I will have to pay? A.—If you are between the ages of 16 and 66 years you must pay social insurance in some form while you are employed. You don't have a choice about the matter and the rate you'll pay will be determined by the kind of work you do and how long you work.

Most full-time employers in the private sector pay the full rates. Class A covers you for the full range of benefits and you will pay 7.5 per cent of your income (up to a ceiling of £8,000 at present) and 1 per cent on anything over that. If you take a job for less than 18 hours p.w. and it's not your main source of income you would be insured against Occupational Injury only and pay 2 per cent of your income up to £8,000 and 1 per cent of anything over that.

As you are a widow it may be that you are getting a widow's pension from Social Welfare. If this is the case you are exempt altogether from paying your portion of the social welfare contribution. This applies to all women still covered receiving long-term women's payments from Social Welfare. You are however, still covered.
