

SOCIAL WELFARE BUDGET CHANGES

All weekly rates of benefits, pensions and allowances will be increased from the end of June 1983.

CHANGES IN PAY-RELATED BENEFIT (PRB)

FROM 4th APRIL 1983:

- The ceiling for payment of PRB will be £11,000 (£220) a week) for all claims
- The 'floor' which is disregarded when calculating PRB will be £36 for new claims
- The waiting period for PRB will be 18 days (3 weeks) for new claims
- The rates of PRB for all claims will be:

25% for 141 days 20% for 234 days excluding Sundays. The combination of disability benefit and PRB may not

exceed 80% of reckonable weekly earnings, for all For all new claims in 1983, reckonable weekly earnings

will be earnings in the 1981/1982 tax year, up to the ceiling of £11,000, divided by 50.

NOTE: Flat-rate disability benefit will not be reduced by the application of this limit.

CHILDRENS ALLOWANCE

Apprentices aged between 16 and 18 years will no longer be entitled to children's allowance after 1st July 1983.

NEW ARRANGEMENTS FOR WORKERS ON SHORT-TIME

FROM 4th APRIL 1983, workers on systematic short-time

(a) will not receive pay-related benefit,

- (b) their Unemployment Benefit will be restricted so that the total of days worked and days of benefit in any week will not exceed 5 and
- (c) they will be paid one fifth of the weekly rate of Unemployment Benefit for each day of unemployment.

For example, a worker on a 3 day week will receive 2/5 of the weekly Unemployment Benefit rate. A worker on a 2 day week will receive 3/5 of the weekly Unemployment Benefit rate.

SMALLHOLDERS UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE

In future the means of all smallholders applying for unemployment assistance must be factually assessed

Smallholders at present receiving unemployment assistance based on the notional assessment of their means will continue to receive their present entitlements until a factual assessment of their means is carried out. However they will not receive the general increase in rates which comes into effect from the end of June.

Arrangements are being made to have all notionally assessed cases factually assessed in due course.


