SEMI-FINAL DEFEAT IN I.H.C.

COUNTY BOARD MEETING: More than a third of the entire County Board meeting was devoted to a wide ranging discussion on football and more than a dozen members spoke about the cause of the decline.

A monthly report was submitted by Mike O'Donnell and Seamus Fitzgerald, county selectors who detailed the activities of the football team up to their disappointing display against Clare in the championship.

When it was pointed out that the county selectors had been spent in training and travelling and at a time when the county is unable to afford the cost of the matter of spending further money until the attitude of clubs and players is determined should cease. Many delegates were critical of the type of training being done and Nicolas Mac Craik said that too much emphasis was being placed on the physical side of the preparation and not enough on coaching.

More important than all this is the fact that their star centre-forward player, Cathine Mac Craik, will be missing, having sustained an ankle injury that will keep him out for some time. It is also a factor that most of the pressure will be on An Rinn, who are more concerned with football than with hurling.

The opposite is the case with Tallow, whose main interest is in hurling and whose almost total concentration at the moment, is their preparation to play county champions Ballyduff in the quarter-final on the last Sunday of the month. Tallow when they are still involved in hurling regard a football victory something of a bonus, but when they concentrate on hurling, they don't take football seriously. Here then they find themselves more or less in a "nothing to lose" situation and in that sort of state of mind, Tallow can be very dangerous.

As I see the outcome, An Rinn, if they can match Tallow's speed and stay with them for the majority of the game, should emerge winners by reason of their greater football skills.

OTHER GAMES: Slilubh GAA and neighbours, the Nire club in Dungarvan, are playing on Sunday evening, but by far the more interesting game is the same day championship will take place at Cappoquin, where Seana Phobal take on Shamrocks in what should be a splendid game. Seana Phobal are a much improved side with some new and younger blood, but I would not consider it their advantage that the game is being played at Cappoquin. Tallow and Lismore juniors will also meet on Friday, 12th inst. and if we are holding their third side, must be expected to bow out here. But you never know where Tallow are concerned.

WATERFORD v. CORK: In having the line-out in this under 21 football game at the Frabur field on Friday, August 5, with the panel having undergone a particularly long and thorough preparation, they will expect to be in a position to put on a good display, even against a side as good as Cork.

In the second intermediate game, Abbeyside as expected came through rather easily having secured a five-point lead at the end of a game that produced some splendid hurling in the early stages.

Abbeyside with six scoring forwards and a defence that was adequate against the many interurbane Ardmore attacks, were in front for almost the full hour and with twenty minutes remaining had double scores in the bag. It was only when they were safely into the semi-final at Ardmore, in keeping with true club tradition, kept trying all the way over when their cause was a lost one. Abbeyside are now through to the semi-final but they will need to show considerable improvement if they expect to beat St. Mary's.

The Nire v. Affane intermediate football clash was a close affair and the losers must blame their poor shooting for their defeat. In the first half they were leading by a goal and a point, but amazingly they failed to score in the second half and their half-time score of 1-3, became their final tally.

Geraldines and Modeligo served up a very exciting contest in their junior football tie at Cappoquin and when they were level at four points each well into the second half, it looked as if a surprise might be on the cards. However, the greater experience of Geraldines and a few seemingly unnecessary fouls by Modeligo, became a deciding factor.
