PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

TIME TO SCRAP THIS ACT
 The Malicious Injuries Act under which the owners of property maliciously damaged are compensated out of public funds (usually provided from local rates) was first introduced almost a century and a half ago, in 1836. Since that time it has been both modified and extended by means of various statutes, the most recent being the Malicious Damage Act 1981.

At the time of its inception the code was intended to act as a deterrent to social unrest. In an era in which the means of law enforcement were scant, the Malicious Damage Code provided an incentive for each community to keep its house in order. If property was maliciously damaged it was the people of the locality in which the property was situated who were loved in order to pay compensation to the owner. This was reckoned in those days to be not unreasonable as in the vast majority of cases the damage would have been perpetrated by a person within the locality.

Nowadays the code has no value as a deterrent, partly because the enormous increase in mobility makes it less certain that the wrongdoer is invariably from the locality in which the damage is done, and partly because the abolition of rates makes it practically impossible to levy compensation on any particular district or community.

Indeed many, and this includes all of our local authorities, County City and Urban, believe that the entire code has outlived its usefulness and should be abolished. They argue that malicious damage is a risk against which property owners should insure just as they do against other types of risk. The saving on public funds would be substantial.

NO INTEREST ALLOWED
 A further factor which affects and diminishes the amount of compensation which an applicant receives, is delay. On average a period of years elapses from the time the damage is caused to payment of compensation. As there is no provision for the awarding of interest on a claim, inflation invariably takes its cut from the amount awarded.

Consequently, in every case, regardless of the question of consequential losses, an applicant suffers a net loss. For the applicant, therefore, no less than for the taxpayer, there is cause for dissatisfaction with the Malicious Damage Code. It is an Act which in this year of 1983 has outlived its usefulness and it is time to scrap it.

NO APOLOGY
 We make no apology for devoting practically the entire column this week to this subject as it is a most important one. There is hardly a court session held at present, and this applies particularly to Circuit Courts, that there is not a long list of applications under the Malicious Injury Act to be disposed of and this occupies a fair part of the time of the Courts—a very expensive process—also paid for by the taxpayer!

KRUGER AND THE ANGLICAN BISHOP
 The fact that the following is a "rude" good. Kerry yarn does not necessarily indicate that I have been anywhere near Kerry lately although it was festival time down there last week.

The story concerns the famous Kruger Kavanagh who, along with his famous pub down in Dunquin in the heart of the Dingle Gaeltacht, was known almost world wide and an Anglican clergyman, later elevated a bishop.

It tells how the clergyman, keen to learn Irish, went to the Dingle Gaeltacht. Fond of a daily gin agus tonic he quickly found the Kruger and his pub, but explained to him that he'd prefer to remain as discreet as possible about his

claim. It is not possible in the space allocated to the column to list all the items for which compensation will not be paid under the Malicious Injury Act. However, any applicant may rest assured that he will be duly informed by his solicitor whether or not his claim comes within the ambit of the code.

SIGNIFICANT POINT
 Assuming that an applicant has a valid claim, the court will award compensation. This compensation will only be allowed in respect of direct or actual damage. Compensation will not be awarded in respect of consequential losses. Thus, if a car is maliciously damaged, the owner will be entitled to recover the cost of repairs, but he will not be entitled to recover the cost of hiring a replacement while the repairs are being done.

The distinction between direct and consequential loss can be of great significance. In many cases, the consequential loss can be far more substantial than the cost of repairing the actual damage. For example, one machine maliciously damaged, could disrupt the production of an entire plant or factory, but the factory owner can only recover the cost of repairing or replacing the particular machine involved.

It will receive nothing in respect of loss of earnings or profits which might well be enormous. Whereas this might be considered unfair to the injured party, it could also be argued that it would be even more unfair that the innocent taxpayer should have to shoulder such a potentially large burden.

PRESENT PROCEDURES
 For the moment, however, the code remains. For the layman, the single most important thing to know about the Malicious Damage Code is that claims must be made promptly. Within fourteen days of the incident which gives rise to the claim, the applicant must serve a preliminary notice of his intention to claim compensation on both the local authority for the area in which the damage was done, and the officer in charge of the local Garda station.

This notice should contain information on both the nature and amount of the damage, and these should be assessed immediately. Once this notice has been served, an application can be made to either the District Court or the Circuit Court for compensation. Claims of £2,500 or more are brought in the District Court. All other claims are brought in the Circuit Court.

Not all property is covered by the Malicious Damage Code. There is in fact a number of exclusions. For example, no compensation will be paid in respect of malicious damage to plants, roots, fruits, or any garden, orchard, nursery, or vegetable house or conservatory. Market gardeners should note!

Claims for articles stolen are in general not allowed, but may be made if the property is stolen in the course of a fire. There is no particular limit to the list of items which are excluded, but this is not surprising in a code which has developed piece

CLLR. B. KYNE ON ABBEYSIDE 'BREATHING SPACE'

The following statement has been made by Labour Councillor Billy Kyne. The recent housing developments in Abbeyside have been welcomed by those looking for homes but the building of estates at McInerney's, Sea Park, and at Walsh's land where work is now again start-

ing where planning permission has already been granted for twenty houses, two already built opposite Park Lane Green, has used up a great deal of open spaces. These new families will create a greater need for a green space for the recently developed village.

Over 300 houses have been built in this part of Abbeyside in the last twelve years or so and I believe that Dungarvan Urban Council should acquire the only available land at the 'Hermitage' and develop it as a park. The buying of this site would initially maintain the only oasis of green area available and by good planning this would serve the community well.

My hope would be a park with trees, maintained footpaths, a jogging-walking track. Also walk ways could be developed to connect Park Lane with the National School. The collection area for the school could be developed by removing what is beyond of the school but the line of trees should be retained.

If this land is acquired by the Urban Council many local people could use it and one project I would like to see done there, time and money permitting is to lay out of old St. Luke Lane, giving details of houses, etc.

When a Councillor or a Council member or deputy acquire anybody's property the rights and wishes of the owner must of course be considered. It is a matter of hope that agreement could be reached with the owner but the march of time and the de-

velopment that has and is occurring means that this green space must now be defended and gradually developed to protect from overdevelopment and to be used to the benefit of the majority especially of old and young.

As a Councillor, I am aware of the shortage of money but the town plan must be altered to allow for the retention of this green area and I will be putting a notice of motion to the meeting on Sept. 12th.

"That the area of Abbeyside known as the 'Hermitage' be designated an amenity area in the Town Development Plan and that the Urban Council enter into discussions with the owner to achieve this."

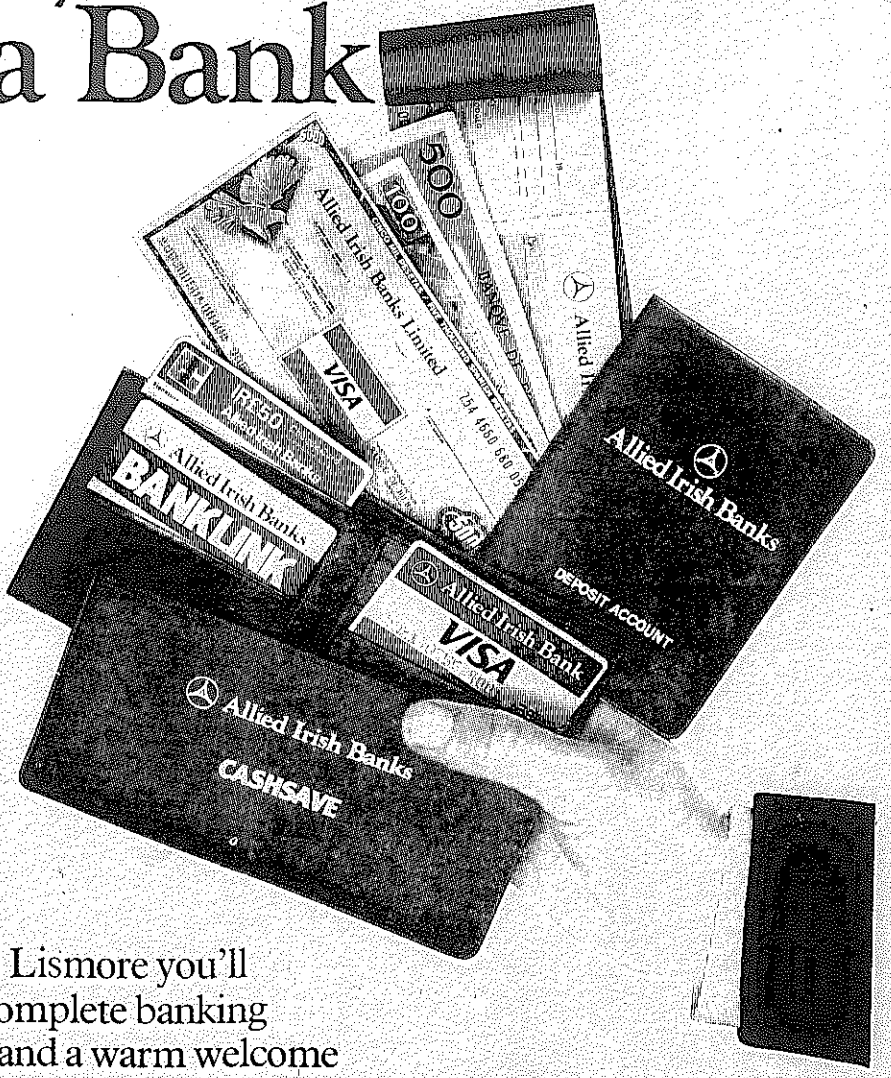

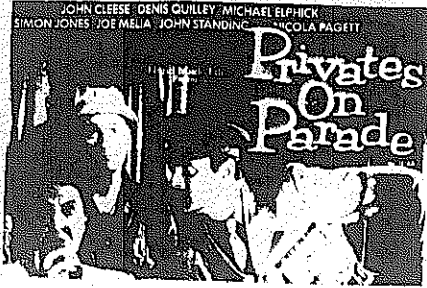

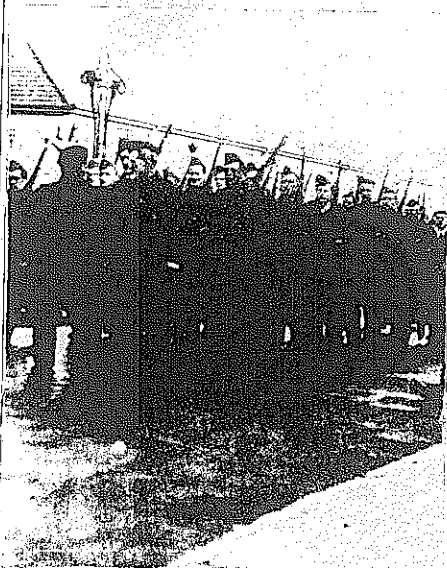
