TENSION GROWS OVER NEW SPECIAL CHARGES

During the past week there has been a hardening of attitudes on both sides in regard to the new special charges imposed by Waterford County Council...

People in many West Waterford areas have pledged solidarity in a campaign to reject totally the payment of these charges but equally adamant that the charges would be collected...

While it is now apparent that large numbers are raising strong objections to the introduction of these charges and have initiated a campaign for non-payment it will have to be accepted that unless the law as it stands at present is changed, the charges must be paid.

Another Drinks Price Hike - Drink prices will increase as from tomorrow (Thursday) by 2p on the pint, 4p on a glass of spirits and 4p per bottle of stout, ale or lager.

New Electronics Venture Provides New Hope For Cappoquin And West Waterford

A joint manufacturing operation involving Irish and American interests was officially opened on Monday last, November 7 at Cappoquin Industrial Estate, by the Minister of State at the Department of Industry and Energy, Mr. Eddie Collins, T.D.

Calmark-Killeen Limited will manufacture precision metal fabricated products and components for the electronics industry, with a particular emphasis on custom-designed and standard printed circuit card cages.

Calmark Inc. is based in San Gabriel, California, in the heart of the Silicon Valley. The company employs 120 people and is involved in the design and manufacture of electronic packaging products for the computer, peripheral computer, aerospace, telecommunications and instrumentation industries.

Killeen Investments Limited, a wholly owned Irish company which has been principally involved in the assembly and distribution of Toyota vehicles in Ireland in recent years, has invested extensively in new industrial developments in Ireland.

MINISTER'S SPEECH - In the course of his speech to the invited guests within the confines of the spacious factory, Mr. Collins said that Calmark-Killeen would make a worthwhile contribution to Ireland's balance of payments situation through its exports and import substitution activities. It would also make a valuable contribution to the employment situation in Cappoquin and its surrounding area.
