



TSB MORTGAGE RATES

Mr. Edward A. Collins, T.D., Minister of State at the Department of Industry and Energy, has received the following letter dated, November 29 from Mr. Alan Dukes, T.D., Minister fo.

Dear Eddie,

I have your representations regarding the mortgage rates charged by the Waterford and I have your representations, regarding the mortgage rates of charged by the Waterford and Cork Trustee Savings Banks.

The position with regard to mortgage rates in the Trustee Savings Bunks is that there is a general relationship between the deposit rate paid by them to their depositors and the interest rates charged on their mortgages and other loans. Under legislation I determine the deposit interest rates payable by the Trustee Savings Banks. I do not have any authority in setting the mortgage rate beyond ensuring that it is at least the going rate charged by the Building Societies. Each individual bank may use its own discretion in determining the mortgage rate it charges.

I have reduced the deposit interest rates on accounts in the Trustee Savings Banks with effect from the 1st and 21st November respectively. Following this reduction in deposit rates both the Cork and Waterford Trustee Savings Banks have already reduced their mortgage rates. I understand that the Waterford Bank will further reduce its rates early in December.

I trust that the above information will be of assistance to you.
