REVISION OF DRUG COST

REFUNDS

Mr. Barry Desmond, T.D., Minister for Health, has made Regulations under the Health Act, 1970, amending the Health Services Regulations, 1972. The new regulations provide for the amendment of the base figure which applies to the scheme for the refund of part of the cost of prescribed drugs and medicines. They came into effect on 1st January, 1984.

The base figure was fast amended on 1st March, 1983. At that time it was specified that where the total cost of prescribed drugs in respect of a calendar month was more than £73 the excess over £23 would be refunded. Under the new Regulations, the base figure has been increased to £28. The amount to be refunded on expenditure in respect of the month of 31st January, 1984, and subsequent months will be the amount in excess of £28. This scheme is available to all persons not covered by medical cards.


