





# VALUE-ADDED TAX

#### BUDGET CHANGES

On and from 1 March 1984 the following reliefs will be introduced

(1) Short-term hiring of cars and other passenger vehicles, bicycles, hoats, caravans, mobile homes and trailer tents

The rate of VAT will be reduced to 18 per cent. "Short-term hiring" means a hiring to the same person for a period, or a total of several periods, not exceeding 5 weeks in any period of 12 months. The relief will not apply to the short-term hiring of vans, lorries, etc. of goods other than those specified.

The rate of VAT on the promotion of or admission to live theatrical or musical performances, including circuses, will be reduced to 5 per cent. The relief will not apply to film shows, dances, cabaret-type entertainment, entertainment in places where food or drink is available for consumption at the performance, or amusements. An explanatory leafiet is being prepared.

(4) Tourist Exports

A scheme will be introduced which will enable certain goods purchased by fourists for export to be relieved from VAT. An explanatory leaflet will be issued in due course.

Clothing (excluding footwear)

Outstand (excluding footwear)

On and from 1 May 1934 certain clothing which is not, at present, liable to VAT and textile handkerchiefs will become hable to VAT at 8 per cent. Children's clothing in sizes appropriate to children under in years of age will remain free of VAT.

Fur clothing will remain liable at 25 per cent. The chiring of clothing will remain liable at 23 per cent thruchting. The hiring of footwear will continue to be liable at 23 per cent.




