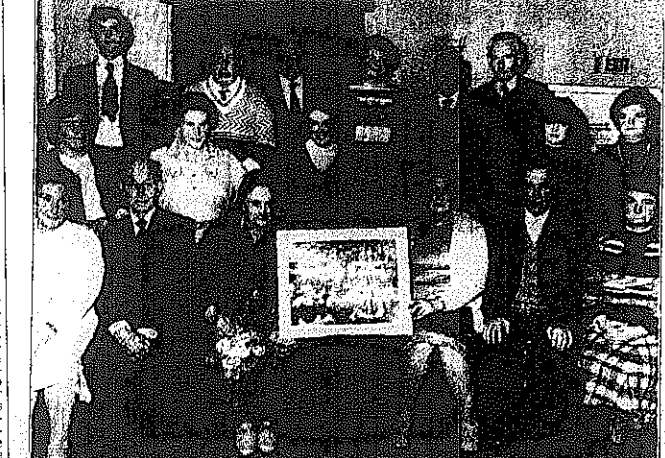

UNDERGROUND TUNNEL

A common feature of the majority of ring forts is the presence of a souterrain or underground passage. These are basically two types of souterrain; the first involving digging a tunnel out of the surrounding area, this type of tunnel could only be attempted where the subsoil was strong enough to support the tunnel and need no extra supports. The second type, and most numerous one, was where a large channel was dug in the field surface and the stone walls were put up on either side and roofed with large stone slabs. The passage was usually backed with soil on the sides and top so that the souterrain could be seen above ground.
