Cllr. Billy Kyne Is New UDC Chairman

Cllr. Billy Kyne (Labour) followed in the footsteps of his late father, Mr. Tom Kyne, last Monday night when he was elected chairman of Dungarvan Urban Council for the first time.

Cllr. Kyne, who was proposed and seconded by his Party colleagues, Cllrs. Jimmy Byrne and Tommy Wade respectively, defeated former UDC Chairman, Cllr. Declan Goode (FF) by a 6-3 vote.

In proposing Cllr. Kyne for the chair, Cllr. Byrne said his late father had served on the Council for a long number of years and had served the country as a Dail Deputy for quarter of a century.

Following his election, Cllr. Kyne paid tribute to the outgoing chairman, Cllr. R. A. Walsh (FF) who he said, had given of himself unparagonably during his year of office.

Cllr. Kyne said he was not intimidated by the great honours which had been bestowed upon him, and he was conscious of the family tradition he was maintaining.

For the evening Mass, His Lordship, Most Rev. Dr. Michael Russell, presided and the chief celebrant was Canon Farrell, assisted by his brother, Very Rev. Jim Canon Farrell, P.P., Leeds and Rev. Fr. Meenan, C.C., Clashmore, nephew.

Thirty-one other priests, including Very Rev. Dean Cassidy, P.P., V.F., Dungarvan, who will also celebrate his Golden Jubilee this week and Very Rev. Canon Murphy, P.P., Ballymore, cousin, were present on the altar during the ceremony.

Sacred music was provided and hymns sung by Abbeyside Parish choir under its conductor, Finbar Keohian and the Abbeyside Folk choir, conductor, Donal Power. An honour guard for the procession of priests into the church at commencement of the ceremony was provided by the Abbeyside Troop of Scouts decorated for the occasion by the members of the altar society.

The remarkable contribution to the church by the Farrell family was the theme of His Lordship, Dr. Russell's address during a Mass and in which he preached a very special tribute to Canon Michael. He said, having been called by God to serve, he had most certainly proved himself a very worthy and faithful servant during his fifty years ministry. He was, he said, a man of many qualities, a man of great understanding and a tremendous worker — evidence of which could be seen in all the parishes in which he had laboured.

Dr. Russell expressed his personal appreciation of the way in which the entire parish had responded in such a meaningful way to this great occasion and he complimented Newsletter group for having produced a delightful special edition as a souvenir of the Golden Jubilee.

Later in the evening, six hundred parishioners attended an "American Tea-Party" style function which had been organised by the club and societies within the parish at Clonca Hotel, which had been specially decorated by parishioners during the previous week.

Following the meal further tributes were paid by Very Rev. Mons. Shine, deputising for Dr. Russell, and Paddy Veale, Clonca Hotel, who spoke on behalf of the parishioners.

A beautiful embroidered stain glass lion of Our Lady of Knock and a cheque for an undisclosed amount, as a gesture of appreciation by the people of the parish, was then presented to Canon Farrell. Having replied and thanked his parishioners, he was given an ovation.

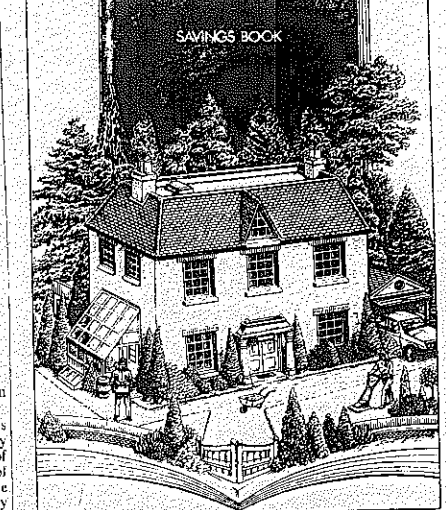

He was then appointed Curate in Modeligo before going to St. John's College, Waterford, as a teaching professor.

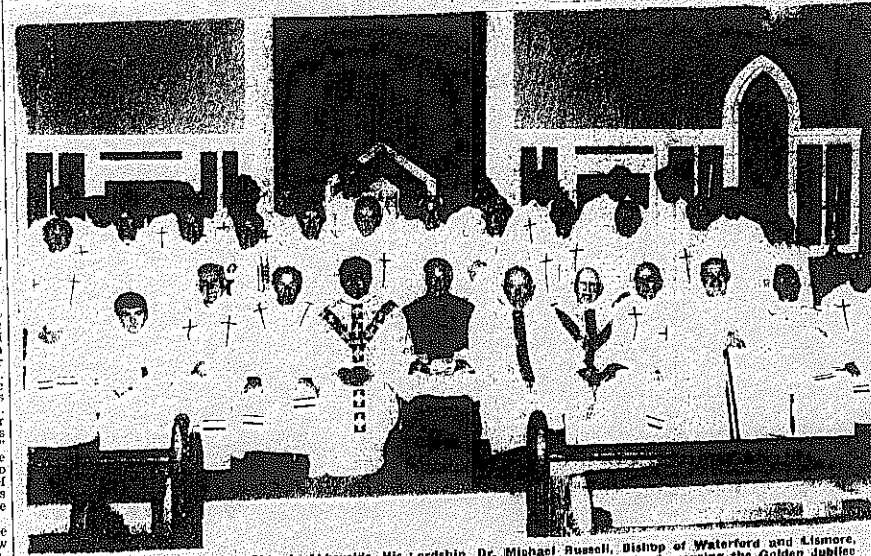
