THE EARTHQUAKE
 The earth tremor which shook the East Coast of Ireland and the West Coast of Britain a few minutes before 8 o'clock last Thursday morning was, according to seismologists, quite a substantial earthquake even in world terms. Its epicentre was firmly under the Irish sea, but it had been on land, it could well have proved catastrophic. The highest rating recorded on seismographs was 5.7 on the Richter scale. The earthquake in Agadir, Morocco some years ago in which 14,000 died was registered 5.9 on the Richter scale.

Last Thursday morning's tremor was felt throughout several parts of County Waterford but fortunately no damage was caused. Its effects were particularly noticeable in the Fermoy area where many residents told of feeling a strong vibration which lasted for several seconds. Houses were also reported to shake in the Ferrybank area of Waterford city.

According to a Garda spokesman no reports of any noticeable tremors were reported in the Dungarvan area but in Cappoquin at least one resident felt the disturbance. He was in his tailor's shop shortly before 8 a.m. and felt a vibration "as if a heavy lorry had passed on the street outside," only when he heard the subsequent news reports on the radio that he realised what it was.

Another Waterford man from Leammbrien who was in Dublin at the time has recounted that he was in his bedroom in the Ormond Hotel when doors and windows started rattling and noise in the room overhead made him think that the occasion was being funny. It was only later also when he heard the news that he understood. In the nearby Four Courts in Dublin all the clocks in the courtrooms and other areas of the building stopped at 7.57 a.m. The lights went out at the same time.

A resident in Youghal has also reported that he felt the tremor as he lay in bed. He said that he had at once recognised what was happening as he had lived for some time in California where earthquakes occur quite frequently.

And so what we thought could never happen where we are concerned has occurred. The experts say that a repeat performance is a rather remote chance. Let us hope so.

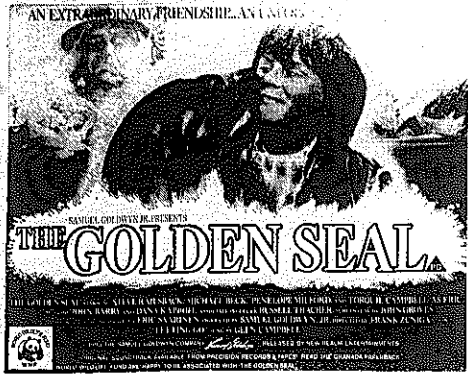

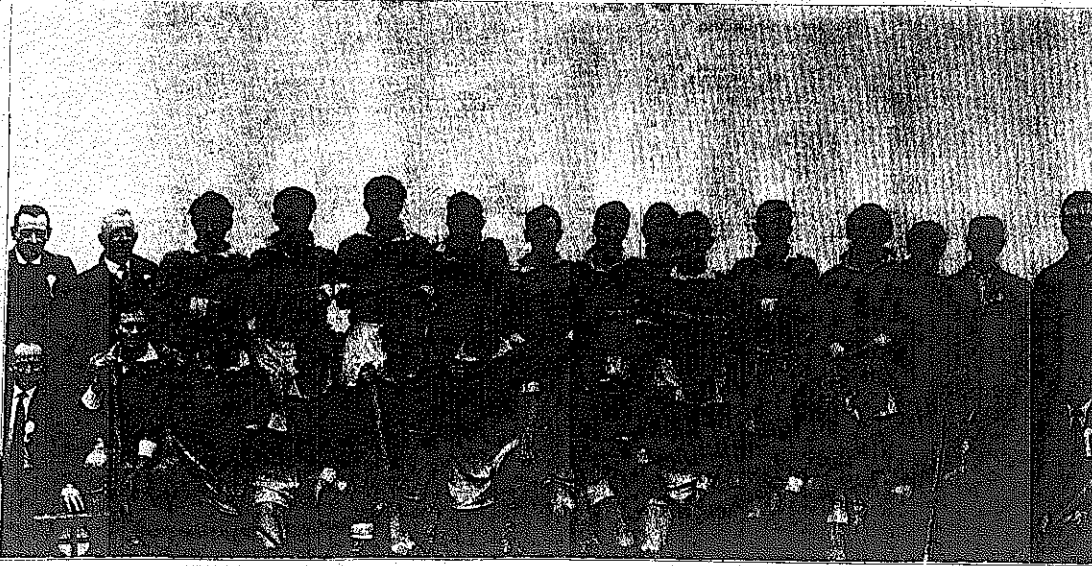

Medical Examination For Food Workers

By MICHAEL DILLON

Because free trade between member states is the fundamental principle of the European Community, it is essential that no member State should have to object to goods coming from another on the grounds of the safety of its own citizens.

These places responsibility for the coordination of health regulations with regard to food on the shoulders of the Commission. There are therefore numerous Community regulations covering animal health in all member States, as well as regulations about the minimum standards of the premises in which food is handled and processed, and perhaps most important of all are the Directives concerning the practice of hygiene in the factory and the health of people who work with fresh meat, poultry meat and meat products.

There are three main Directives covering this subject. The first was passed in 1964 and was concerned with the health problems affecting intra-Community trade in fresh meat, and the second was adopted in 1971 and concerns health problems affecting trade in poultry meat, while the third which was adopted in 1977 is concerned with health problems affecting trade in meat products.

should be subject to the supervision of the health authorities responsible for monitoring and combating contagious disease, and these authorities should ensure that a person who may transmit a contagious disease to meat cannot work on or handle meat or poultry.

AN UNDERTAKING Before commencing employment, it is proposed that persons engaged at work on or handling fresh meat, poultry meat or meat products, must give an undertaking that they will inform the health authorities immediately of any change in their state of health which might indicate the presence of a contagious disease, and in particular where gastro-intestinal or respiratory symptoms or signs arise, and in the case of skin infection.

Drug Addiction Spreading Rapidly In Ireland Says Senator Bulbulia

Senator Katharine Bulbulia (P.G.) and a member of Waterford County Council, speaking on the Misuse of Drugs Bill, 1984 (Second Stage) in the Senate on Tuesday, July 10 said: "It is almost axiomatic to say at this stage that drug addiction in Ireland has taken a serious and urgent form for the worse, so much so that one of the first actions of the Government was to establish a Ministerial Task Force to examine the entire drugs situation and make recommendations. The Bill follows these recommendations. It has become fashionable to decri the Government for setting up task forces, issuing reports and talking it upon themselves to examine a situation. I do under-stand certain criticism when the Government is criticised as quickly as people feel it should. In this instance there is no criticism at all because, almost as soon as the assumed office they set up to examine the drugs situation, we are, not too long afterwards, putting into legislative effect some of their recommendations to the Government and the Minister responsible.

I would say that it was in the sixties that people's attention was first drawn to the problem of drug addiction. It was borne in on the wave of the whole hippy era. It was brought to light by a pharmacist, Christy O'Connor and was acted upon by the late Eisinger Children, the then Minister for Health. It seemed then to be a problem merely of containing drug addiction to the fringe element of hard-core hippies. Indeed the word "hippy" brings a feeling of nostalgia for those of us who were around to remember that whole era. It seems now that sure that experimenters from the young and the let set of addiction too easily.

Now the scene has changed radically. Cannabis has become a household word and it is being grown in Ireland. I see that one of the provisions in this Bill is to extend that definition to include the particular plant which can be grown here. This is realistic and positive and is to be welcomed. London has become a major drug distribution centre. Of course the lines of communication have been shortened which bring its focus home to us here even more.

It is very important that we do not merely condemn and come in with draconian legislation but that we seek to understand. I would like to press my praise and thanks to Inspector Mullins and the Garda Síochána who have dealt with this problem with enormous insight, compassion and understanding. When they are called upon to intervene they are able to sort out the subtleties of situations and deal with them with sensitivity and who needs more direct intervention. They seem to do this with tremendous skill and sensitivity and we all owe them a great debt of gratitude.

We must recognise that young people always display a natural curiosity which is a good thing, but if it is not curbed it can lead to experimentation in the area of drugs. Many of the young people who are naturally curious and the safeguards are there to protect them from this danger. For others the problems may be more deeply rooted in his or her psychological or psychiatrically disturbed or they may have severe personal problems in adolescence which may tip them over towards drug experimentation. Such people are always susceptible to his or her peer group. Reference has been made here to cannabis and it has been accepted by many people as being a natural part of modern pop culture. I am normally liberal in social matters but my feeling about cannabis is not of any liberal sentiment.

JOBS FALL AS MORE SEEK WORK IN EC COUNTRIES

The total number of jobs in the more developed countries fell by about 1.1 million last year, bringing overall job losses over the past three years to 11.7 million.

In 1983 118.9 million tried to find 107.6 million jobs. Unemployment, which was 6.5 million in 1981, rose to 11.1 million in 1983 and is now over 12.5 million, according to Eurostat, the EC statistical office.

Other industrialised countries have fared much better in the jobs stakes, say the statisticians. In the United States the number of people seeking work increased by 1.4 million and the number of jobs increased by 1.1 million over the same period.

Most of the jobs lost in Europe over the past three years have been concentrated in two countries. The United Kingdom lost 1.6 million and the Federal Republic of Germany 1.1 million. Last year West Germany accounted for about half of the 22,000 jobs lost in the Community as a whole.

There are not just fewer jobs in Europe—they're also different jobs. Since 1970 the services sector has grown by 23%. Similar changes were recorded in the USA and Japan, where the number of service jobs increased by 44% and 34% respectively.
