Residents of John Treacy's home village of Villierstown are in an angry mood over a newspaper article which they insist has made the village out to be a haven for drug addicts.

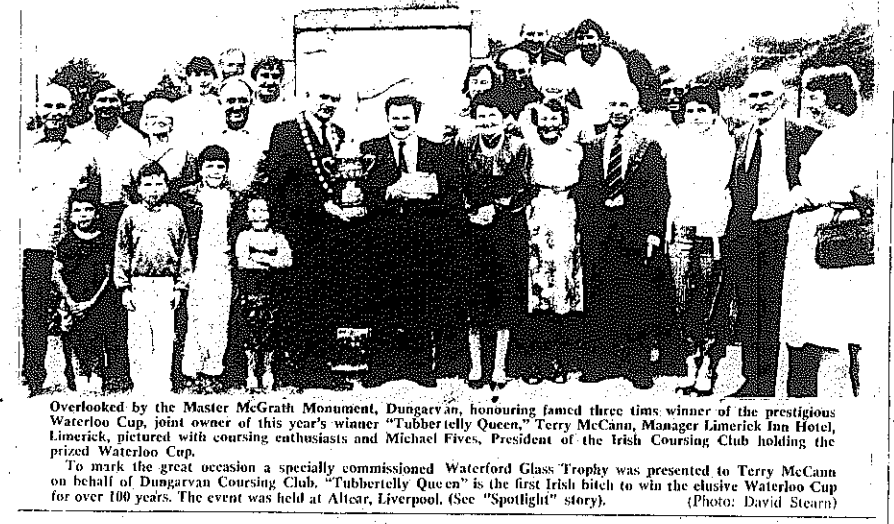
There is an unmistakable sense of anger and outrage at the article which appeared in the August 21st edition of the "Waterford Post", a weekly tabloid circulating in Waterford city under the heading "High Jinks Galore in The Sleeping Village."

The article was based on an interview with Villierstown's own publisher Mr. Michael Carleton who was quoted as saying that not alone are Villierstown's youngsters into the drug-taking

but that some of the parents were at it too. Mr. Carleton, owner of the "Cruise Lin" pub in the centre of the village, was also quoted as saying that marijuana was being grown in gardens and fields right around the village and that the "hash" craze has now reached such proportions in Villierstown that he had been forced to put his pub up for sale.

However, at a press conference in the local village hall on Tuesday, convened by the "John Treacy Welcoming Committee," the publisher rebutted most of the quotes attributed to him in the newspaper article. Acknowledging that he had been quizzed about drugs in the newspaper involved, Mr. Carleton said he had stated that there had been a "hippy commune" on the outskirts of the village "several years ago," and that some of those living there had been prosecuted for drug offences.

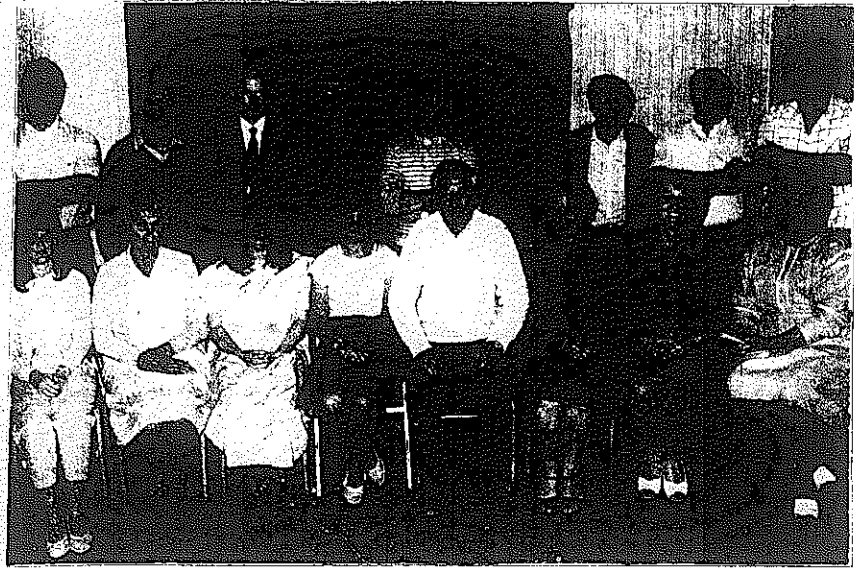

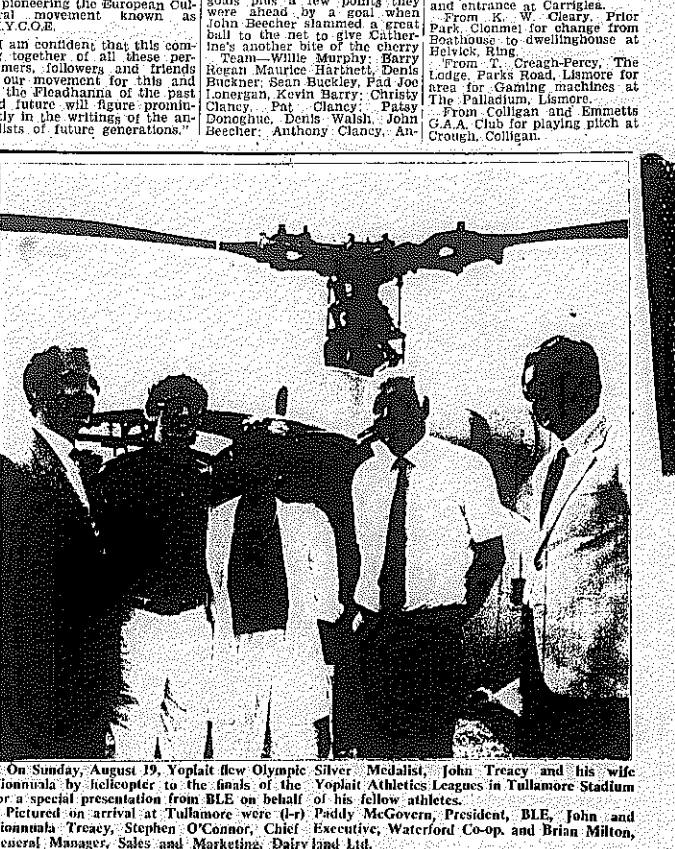
