Planning Permission Granted For L&N Super Development At Abbeyside

Despite the fact that there were 77 objectors and a great deal of controversy surrounding the issue, Dungarvan Urban Council has granted planning permission to Mr. J. M. Mulligan, MRAI, Catherine Street, Waterford in his application on behalf of Adam F. Torrie Ltd. for the erection of a Shopping Centre with Supermarket and seven shop units and car parking at Abbeyside.

The first of these lays down that the developers pay the sum of £35,000 to Dungarvan Urban Council as a contribution towards expenditure incurred by the Council in the provision of public services in the area and the second condition is that the developers pay the sum of £32,900 to Waterford County Council for improvements to roads in the area together with other facilities.

sergeant, was in the West Cork flying column and was an assistant of Tom Barry's. But after a science degree in UCC and several years spent working as a builder's labourer and later as a teacher in Kent — he left the state to ignore the Civil War. Fine Gael appealed to his liberal social ideas.

But, economically, he is very far to the right. Already this week he, together with industry Minister John Bruton, called for cuts in public expenditure in the economic plan. He believes the state should be devolved from its over-participation in business and commercial life. He believes greater incentives should be given.



Coming to a Department as important as Agriculture and a subject which she knew so well, he had to read a lot, and they did not fail him. His officials say he is one of the hardest working ministers they have had. He spends long hours every day in the office, but will never learn office discipline. They say he takes a brief well but hates reading lengthy documents. He wants the bones of everything on two typewritten pages. His concentration spans details at it with brio.

As a surprise choice for a Ministry as senior as Agriculture, he was one of the most eloquent of politicians. But his rural commonsense and his political judgment were by a small margin his strength. He involved Garret FitzGerald directly in the negotiations and they have been his strength in his private office at that time.

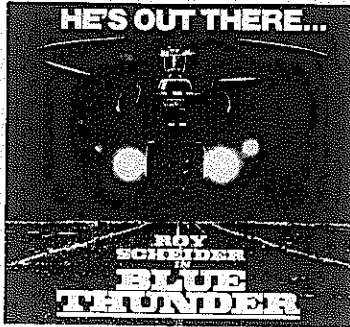
