



The Youth Employment Agency makes sure that your contribution to the Youth Employment Levy is used, through employment and training programmes, in a practical way to help young people facing the world of work

Since the introduction of the Youth Employment Agency in 1982, the number of young people annually involved in these schemes has more than doubled. And in 1984 alone, over 64,000 young people will benefit from Youth Employment Levy funded programmes.

The recently published 1983 Annual Report of the Youth Employment Agency estimates that total expenditure last year on Youth Manpower and Training Programmes in receipt of Levy support was £19 million. The Youth Employment Levy provided £75 million of this autoney and £44 million came from the European Social Fund. The main areas of expenditure were:

Training, Work Experience, Programmes in the Education System, Special Training Workshops and Employment Programmes.

The programmes funded by the Youth Employment Levy are run mainly by AnCO, the National Manpower Service, the Vocational Education Committees, CERT, ACOT and the Youth Employment Agency itself.

COMMUNITY ENTERPRISE

In July 1983, the Youth Employment Agency aumended the Community Enterprise Programme as a means of encouraging communities to become involved in the job creation process. The assistance made available includes wage subsidies and management grants. grants for the employment of Enterprise Workers, advice and planning grants. By year-end a total of forty-two community groups had received assistance with their job creation efforts under the Community Enterprise Programme and a further twenty-eight have been helped to-date in 1984.

The Youth Employment Levy also funds a variety of other job creation and employment programmes. For example, young people entering self-employment can get easier access to finance and grants under Youth Self-Employment Programme and Enterprise Allowance Scheme.
