Proposed Land Tax Criticised As Inequitable

Mixed views on the proposed Land Tax were expressed by members of the County Waterford Committee of Agriculture at a meeting held in Dungarvan last Monday. The matter arose from the reading of a letter from two Labour Party Senators.

The letter, signed by Senator Helena McAliff-Bain and Senator Tom Murphy, stated that they had consistently been supporters of a system to replace the old P.L.V. system as a means of raising the value of the Land Tax as outlined in the National Plan.

"This particular tax system," the letter stated, "is to be replaced by the levy of a farming community's simple system by which they may contribute to the Exchequer—albeit at a local level. It will produce an acceptable yield in the context of broadening the base towards the community."

The letter added: "The government has an inbuilt mechanism to increase or decrease the yields according to trends in agricultural incomes but more importantly it promotes production and productivity ultimately promotes employment."

At a later point at the meeting Senator Quilty said that according to the soil survey carried out by the Agricultural Institute, Waterford was supposed to have 92 per cent of arable land and 8 per cent marginal. This would give them the highest percentage of arable land of any county in Ireland and the Land Tax would be assessed on adjusted acres he thought the Institute should be asked how they arrived at these figures.

This was agreed and the matter will be discussed further at the next meeting.

NOT EQUITABLE

Mr. Pierce Casey, I.F.A. representative on the Committee, rejected the points made in the letter and said that the proposed Land Tax was not equitable whatever else it was. He would like to see the 'farmers' tax' as it is called, reduced to 100 per cent of the 1980 level or even 80 per cent. He said that when the problem would arise, he said.

The Chairman, Senator M. Quilty and Cllr. James A. Walsh however, favoured the plan. The latter pointing out that already farmers paid tax of one kind or other.

Cllr. C. O'Riain, referring to the letter, remarked "I wouldn't expect anything else from the Labour Party and Cllr. W. McDonnell expressed the view that the Land Tax would ease out the situation by increasing with the point made by Mr. Casey on possible increases in the tax and said that all they could do

ALLEGATIONS ON BUTTER FAT RETURNS BY I.F.A. MAN

Mr. Pierce Casey, I.F.A. representative on the County Waterford Committee of Agriculture at a meeting of the Committee in Dungarvan last Monday drew attention to anomalies which he claimed existed in the butterfat returns received by a new milk supplier to Waterford Co-op who commenced his supply in May last.

Having given certain details, Mr. Casey requested the Committee to make representations to the Co-op to make good any loss that may have resulted to this supplier and to establish a testing system that would be fair to all.

Mr. Tom Murphy, I.C.O.S. representative on the Committee completely refused the allegations made by Mr. Casey and stated that the testing system operated by the Co-op was fair and he did not accept any of the figures submitted by Mr. Casey.

The Chairman, Senator Quilty said that as the I.F.A. had already taken up this matter he thought it was one which the Committee should not now become involved in.

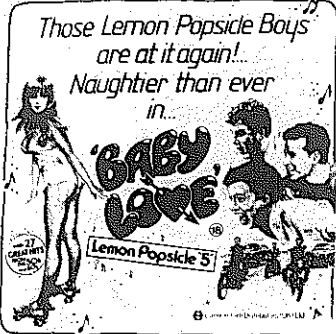
