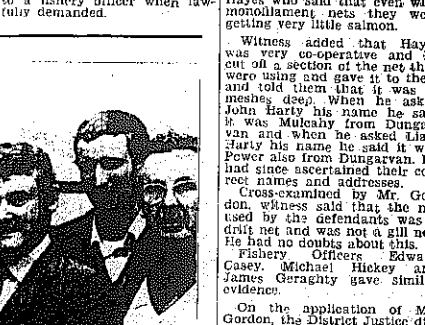

MOTORIST WAS GROSSLY IRRESPONSIBLE SAYS JUSTICE

Michael Roche, Ballymore, Cobh, was fined £100 by District Justice W. F. O'Connell at Dungarvan Court on Sunday last for driving a car at Ballynagall, Ring, on Sunday last.

Sergeant D. Lucey stated in evidence that as a result of a complaint made to him about the manner in which a car was being driven at Ballynagall, Ring, on Sunday last, he went to the scene of the offence. He saw the car parked outside a licensed premises. He went in and asked questions of those inside including the defendant as to who had the car. The defendant denied he had driven it.

Sergeant Lucey added that he saw the car outside a public house at Palla and inside he saw the defendant. He asked again questioned. The defendant again denied but later admitted that the car was his.

Sergeant Lucey added that the defendant had no insurance and the tax-disc on the car was that in respect of a tractor.

Mr. P. Gordon, Solicitor, who appeared said that the defendant who was a farm labourer worked near Cobh and on the day in question was down visiting his father.

The defendant in evidence said that he was a native of Old Parish and that he only had the car a fortnight at the time. He had bought it for £400 but had since sold it for £200. He was unable to afford to insure the car for which he had got an estimate for £100.

District Justice O'Connell said that it appeared to him that the defendant had made no effort to insure the car and had been driving around taking the chance that he wouldn't be caught. He had been grossly irresponsible in doing this during the first week of August, which was one of the busiest times of the year on the roads.

FIRST OFFENCE

Mr. Gordon entered a plea for leniency stating that it was a first offence. He asked especially that he be not disqualified as his job driving agricultural machinery would depend on this.

When the District Justice replied: "Oh, I will disqualify him as he knows the risk he was taking driving around without cover." Mr. Gordon again repeated his plea and asked that in the event of disqualification that the driving of agricultural machinery be excluded from it.

District Justice O'Connell then imposed a fine of £100 on the insurance charge and directed that the defendant be disqualified for three months. However, he further directed that since B of his driving licence be excluded from the disqualification and this would allow him to drive agricultural machinery only. He imposed a fine of £20 for having no tax and £5 for displaying a false tax disc and an additional fine of £10 for refusing to give the required information to the Garda in the occasion.

Fined For "Utterly Reckless Driving"

A young motorist, whose car careened across the main O'xk Waterford road leaving a 75 foot brake mark behind it, struck a ditch and travelled along it for a distance of 45 feet before eventually ending on its roof, was guilty of what District Justice W. F. O'Connell described at Dungarvan Court as "utterly reckless driving."

Thomas Kieley, Glendalligan, Lennymythen, was convicted of dangerous driving at Dungarvan, Dungarvan, on August 27 last.

Garda J. Steator told the court that as a result of receiving a report he went to the scene of an accident around 3.30 p.m. on that date. The defendant was later removed by ambulance to hospital, but he admitted being the driver.

Garda Steator said the car had two bald tyres. Subsequently Kieley made a statement in which he said he felt the back of his car sliding on a bend and when he braked it careened across the road and hit the ditch.

Replying to Mr. J. P. Gordon, for the defendant, witness agreed there had been a number of accidents at this particular bend.

Kieley told the court that when he felt a vibration in the car he thought he had got a puncture and when he braked the car went into a skid. He was travelling at 40-50 miles an hour, but as a result of the skid his car was a complete write-off.

District Justice O'Connell, convicting the defendant of dangerous driving, said it was clear he had been driving at an excessive speed. "His driving was utterly reckless," he said.

Imposing a fine of £25 with an endorsement for dangerous driving, the District Justice said he was having regard to the fact that Kieley's car was "written off." A further fine of £10 was imposed for having two bald tyres, and recognisances were fixed in the event of an appeal.

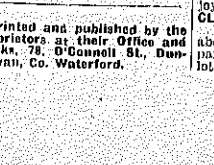

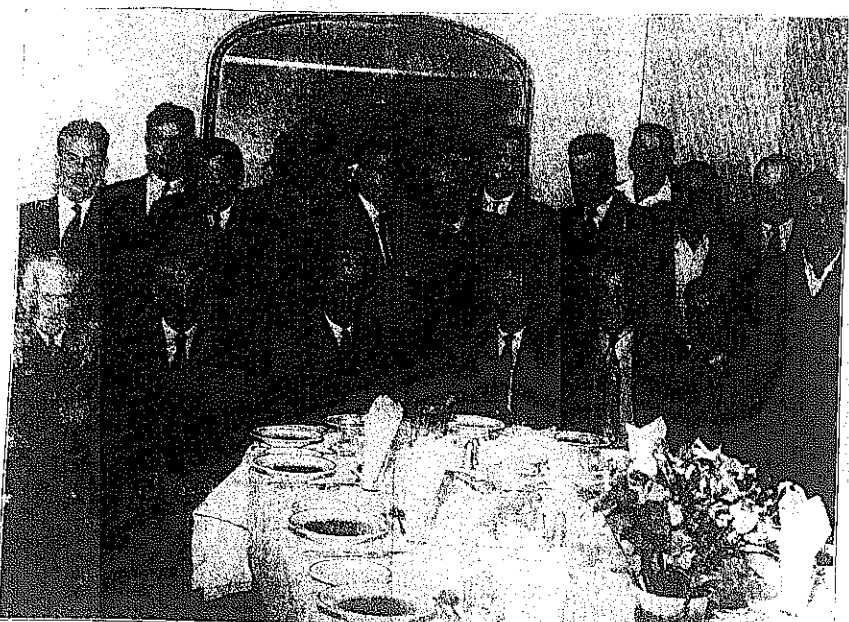
