The sheek of the closure of the Clover Meats factory last week has since been reverberating through the city and sountly and marks one of the blackest weeks ever for Water-tord. The closure means a loss of more than 800 jobs—500 of them in Water-ford while for-

A receiver was appointed for the firm on Friday last after a week of increasingly bitter negotiations and recriminations between farmers, the company and its bankers. The Agricultural Credit Corporation and the Bank of Ireland agreed to put up 13 million in additional finance to save the company in the previous week but pulled back last week when an independent accountral reported that the grue position was considerably gworse than the company had indicated. He estimated that at least £3.8 million was needed immediately and a great dead more within months.

It is of interest to note that the Clover factory known originally as Irish Co-operative Meat, was set up 58 years ago and at its peak employed about 700 worker's in Waterford.

The idea behind the setting up of the plant came from Sir John Keane. Cappoquin who was at that time a prominent member of the Irish Co-operative Movement. It was in November 1919 at a meeting of farmers in the south and east November 1919 at a meeting of farmers in the south and east and parts of Cork and Limerick it was decided to form a farmers' co-operative and meat plant in Waterford. The bacon factory opened in 1926 and a beef plant was added 10 years later when canning was also started. The name was changed to Clover Meats also in 1936, reflecting the tremendous success of that trade name on its products.

In the mid-1940s Clover acquired the Wexford Copopetative Meat Plant and in /1951 it took over the bacon curing factory of Shaw and Company Ltd.

In the late 1960s and intigente entry of the early 1970s several other acquisitions were added including those of Clonmel Fonds. Donnelly's of Dublin and Lunhams of Linerick. The Company was then at its peak, employing in excess of 2,000 workers.

Now like so many other old established firms it has fallen a victim to the never-ending recession in which we now find ourselves and us we have said, it marks one of the blackest weeks ever in the economic history of Waterford.






