As we head into the Christmas festivities this week we must once again make an appeal to motorists to keep the Christmas and New Year period as free of accidents as possible.

A senior Garda Officer told us that the Garda Traffic Corps will be additionally active in all areas over the Christmas period and motorists who ignore the drinking and driving warning could well find themselves under arrest and later before the courts.

It is a serious matter and the consequences for any motorist caught and convicted can be very severe. The risk is not worth it so remember that at most, if you are driving that will do - or better still, none at all.

PARKING ON THE FOOTPATHS

Councillor Jimmy Byrne was pulling no punches at the December monthly meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council when he referred to the manner in which lorries and trucks mounted footpaths in various parts of the town and remained parked on them in various places, particularly in Bridge Street and Mary Street.

He said that a great deal of damage was being done to the footpaths by these heavy vehicles and pedestrians were being put at risk by having to move on to the roadways to pass them.

Mr. Byrne then stated that the town traffic warden would be better employed prosecuting the drivers of those lorries than watching people up in O'Connell Street.

It was agreed by the Council in refer to both of the complaints to the Garda.

Hefty Fines In Further Helvick Fishery Cases

At another special sitting of the Dungarvan District Court on Monday last further cases of illegal salmon fishing and impeding fishery officers against Helvick fishermen were dealt with by District Justice W. F. O'Connell.

The Southern Region Fisheries Board prosecuted in each of the cases and the defendants were all represented by Mr. J. P. Gordon, Solicitor. The Board was represented by Mr. Fergus Power, Solic.

Michael Hayes, Helvick and Liam Ronayne, Helvick were charged on five counts that on August 20 last they impeded Fishery Officer Edward Casey in the execution of his duty, unlawfully fish for salmon during the close season, unlawfully use a monofilament net which exceeded 30 meshes and have in their possession a drift net for the unlawful capture of salmon.

Witness denied that the net in the water was his. He also denied that he was fishing for salmon and said he heard no call from the fishery officers.

District Justice O'Connell said he could not attach any credit to the evidence given by the last witness. He was satisfied the fishery officers were there and that they saw the men on the 'Inis Ealga' handling the net.

Mr. Power said that the Board said that Hayes had previously been convicted for obstructing fishery officers and Ronayne also had a conviction.

Mr. Gordon said that the defendants could ill-afford to pay the fines and he asked the Justice not to impose the monetary penalties on them.

District Justice O'Connell said that he could not ignore the previous convictions. They were all taken into account in imposing the penalties on the defendants.

Mr. Hayes was fined £300 and disqualification for three years on the impeding charge with a further £300 fine for unlawfully fishing for salmon during the close season.

Mr. Ronayne was fined £100 and £100 costs against him. He allowed £75 costs against each and allowed three months to pay. He also filed recognition in the event of an appeal.

However, he warned Hayes that if he appeared before him again on similar charges he would not be imposing monetary penalties.

ASSAULT CHARGES DISMISSED - Patrick Kelly Paul an Phuca, Ring and Patrick Mulcahy, 12, Chudlers Estate, Dungarvan were charged with assaulting Fishery Officer E. Casey and impeding Fishery Officer N. Power on October 8.

Fishery Officer Casey in evidence said that on the day in question he was on duty in a patrol boat with other fishery officers off Ballyrooney. There was another patrol boat and the naval Corvette Aisling also operating in the area where four trawlers, all appeared to be engaged in illegal salmon fishing.

Michael Hayes in evidence said he was the skipper of the Inis Ealga and on August 20 he was steaming in the direction of Dunabratin to go to work. They came across a net in the water and took in a little but let it out again. He then saw the fishery boat at the end of the net. His trawler went over the net and then fouled the groyne and fishery officer Casey stood up in his boat, put his hands on his hips and had a good laugh. They had about 20 yards of it hauled

when the 'Inis Ealga' came back, and made straight for us. They had to cut the net down on the way. He was satisfied the net was used for salmon fishing.

Fishery Officer Michael Hickey gave corroborative evidence that he made two attempts to board the trawler but each time Mulcahy brought the bar down on the gunwhale of the trawler. Kelly then came out of the wheelhouse and told him officers and you have got enough of my nets and he touched me on the nose with his finger.

Mr. Gordon for the defendants then made submissions which the District Justice accepted in relation to the assault charges. Those suggested that as Fishery Officer Casey failed to produce his own warrant on the occasion he was not an authorised officer on that day.

District Justice O'Connell agreed that on that technical point and as the charges referred to were very serious he would dismiss the charges of assault on the grounds that Fishery Officer Casey was not an authorised officer on the day in question.

Patrick Kelly then gave evidence and said that when the patrol boat came up Casey asked them 'what are you doing boat.' He said he told the bailiffs that he was lobster fishing and Casey then shouted 'pull the other fishing net.'

He denied using any bad language to the bailiffs that day or ever. He said he told Casey he couldn't come aboard without search warrant and especially if he had acted civilly.

District Justice O'Connell said he would convict both defendants on the charge of impeding Fishery Officer Power on the occasion.

Mr. Power then stated that there were previous convictions for impeding against Kelly and he had already been disqualified from fishing for three years and fined Mulcahy £500. He also allowed £37.50 costs and £30 witnesses expenses against each of the defendants.

On the dismissed assault charge he allowed each of the defendants £50 costs against the Board.

Dungarvan Circuit Court Richard Tobin, Ballinacorney, Ring, Bartholomew Whelan, Helvick and Maurice Condon, Helvick, appeared on similar convictions imposed on them by District Justice W. F. O'Connell at a special sitting of the District Court in Dungarvan on October 15.

Each was fined £300 and disqualified from fishing for 3 years for impeding Fishery Officers of the Board on July 26 last at the District Court.

Mr. John Gordon, B.L. (instructed by J. F. Williams & Co.) was for Tobin and he also appeared for Mulcahy, Kelly and Condon. Mr. P. McCarty, B.L. (instructed by Mr. Gordon) was for Condon.

Mr. S. Langan-O'Keefe, B.L. (instructed by Mr. F. Power) was for the Southern Region Fisheries Board.

Having heard the evidence as given in the District Court (already fully reported in a previous issue), Judge D. P. Sheridan said that he had no doubt whatever that in each case the desire to inspect the defendant's trawlers had been adequately conveyed to the skipper by the Fishery Officers. This was extremely serious matter and he had pointed this out on previous occasions.

Mr. John Doyle, Fishery Inspector, told Judge Sheridan that for the last 2 years they were not able to cope with the problems in the area. They had been abused and intimidated and the Helvick fishermen had refused to co-operate with the Fishery Officers in any way. He added that not all the fishermen were behaved in this fashion but there had little or no option as there were 3 or 4 hundred trawlers.

Judge Sheridan said there was no doubt in his mind that there was a case of great concern for him if a man loses his livelihood in the present issue the District Court had no control over the disqualification which would have to stand in each case. He then reduced each of the £300 fines to £25 but said that the costs and expenses against each of the defendants in the District Court would also have to stay.
