## Council Employee Arrested Under Corruption Act

A Waterford County Council employee has been arrested by Gardai in Dungarvan over alleged planning irregularities.

A spokesperson for Dungarvan Gardai said the employee was arrested yesterday (Tuesday) morning as part of the ongoing investigation into alleged irregularities and other matters in Waterford County Council.

The employee was arrested under the Corruption Act and was detained under Section 4 of the Criminal Justice Act.

He was expected to be charged or released from custody yesterday evening.

## Waterford County Council Urged Not To Raise Charges

Fine Gael Deputy, John Deasy, has urged the twenty-three elected representatives on Waterford County Council not to finalise this year's estimates until the Government makes it clear whether or not funding will be forthcoming for the remediation of Dungarvan and Tramore Landfills.

### HUGE OPPOSITION TO BIN CHARGE INCREASES - SURVEY FINDS

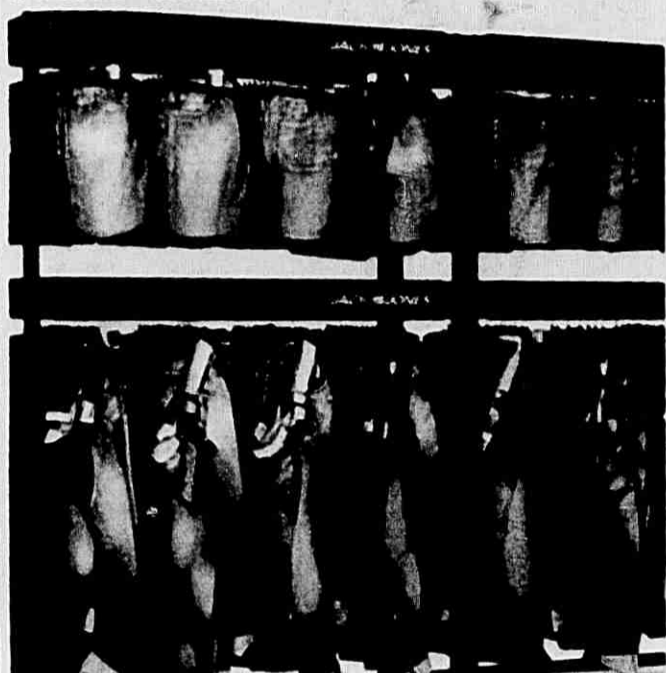

## High Street To Retain Its Name

Dungarvan Town Council voted in favour of retaining 'High Street' as the name of the street linking Grattan Square to the new Dungarvan Shopping Centre.

Shane Houlihan, the developer of an 8 million euro shopping complex at O'Connell Street, submitted a request to retain the name at the November meeting of Dungarvan Town Council.

Mr. Houlihan said that during the building process, he was in direct competition with the new Dungarvan Shopping Centre and he used the name High Street as a marketing tool to attract tenants.

After almost three or four months of discussion on the issue, Fine Gael councillor, Damien Geoghegan said enough time was wasted discussing the name of the street. "It's no wonder that people don't take this council seriously when so much time is spent discussing what to call a street. It's a sad indictment of this council, that more time was spent discussing this than was spent discussing the closure of Dungarvan Crystal."

"We all supported the development of the shopping centre. The least we should do is support people who are trying to bring more employment to this town."

His sentiments were agreed with by Mayor, Fiachra O Ceilleachair who said it was "regrettable" some much time had been taken over by the issue. Fianna Fail Cllr. Nuala Ryan and Fine Gael Cllr. Fred Forsey both said the name of the street wasn't an issue with the public. "People are

coming up to me, asking why is the council giving this developer such a hard time." Cllr. Forsey said. "No one I've talked to has a problem with the name." Independent councillor, Michael O'Riordan also reiterated his support for the retention of the name.

The sole councillor to oppose the name High Street was Sinn Fein councillor, Brendan

Mansfield, who said arguments that UK businesses would refuse to open in Dungarvan without a catchy street name, didn't stand up to scrutiny.

## Local Woman Killed In Road Accident

A newly qualified teacher in her twenties tragically died in a road accident on Wednesday morning last. # Comhairle na nÓg

On Tuesday 22nd November, in the Council Chambers, in Dungarvan, 48 young people from all over County Waterford came together to take part in Comhairle na nÓg 2005. The purpose of the day was to provide a forum for young people to voice opinions on issues which affect them, but also to elect delegates to Dáil na nÓg, which takes place in Croke Park in Dublin next Spring. The first goal of the National Children's Strategy is: "Children will have a voice in matters which affect them and their views will be given due weight in accordance with their age and maturity". This was Waterford's way of making this goal a reality.

The day was organised by the County Development Board, with the support of the County

Waterford Child Care Committee, Waterford Sports Partnership, The Rural Transport Initiative and County Waterford Community Forum. The young people ranged in age from 12 to 17, and were representative of the nine secondary schools in the County, Waterford Regional Youth Services, The Traveller Initiative and Foroige.

During the day the group participated in a range of facilitated workshops. They debated issues under the headings of "Migration & Interculturalism" and "Facilities for Young People". The quality of debate and input was absolutely outstanding.

These young people were extremely eloquent in outlining the key problems as they saw them for migrant workers living in Ireland. They cited language

and educational barriers, as well as employment opportunities, and discrimination as issues which need to be addressed. It was identified that there were not enough Awareness Programmes to counteract racial and ethnic prejudices in County Waterford.

The discussion on "Facilities for Young People" reached unprecedented heights and it was very clear from the outset that this topic was very close to the hearts of this group. The lack of community facilities, lack of places to hang out and lack of sports facilities all competed with each other for priority. Difficulties in accessing a whole range of youth services and community and sports opportunities, none more so than in rural areas, were outlined. It was highlighted that the bore-

dom that stems from the lack of facilities for young people could spark underage drinking, drug abuse and crime. The group felt that the Members of Waterford County Council had a role to play in elevating this issue on policy agendas.

Having deliberated at length on the selected topics, the election of the candidates for Dáil na nÓg 2006 took place. The eight candidates that made it through to the final election were allowed a short, but intensive, period for canvassing. Following the count, the successful candidates elected to represent Waterford at Dáil na nÓg 2006 were, Donncha Conway, CBS Tramore, Orna Middleton, Stella Maris, Tramore, Maeve Dennehy and Róisín Fahey, both from Árd Scoil na

# No "Plan B" For County Landfill

Garrynagree is Waterford Co. Council's plan A, B, C and D as regards the location of a new county and city-wide landfill. Director of Services, Denis McCarthy said the council has no other location planned if a Judicial Review into An Bord Pleanála's decision to grant planning permission upholds the objections of the Lickey Valley Concern Group.

The council faces serious delays even should the Judicial

Review go its way. A waste license has yet to be secured, and more objection are expected to follow if the Environmental Protection Agency were to grant a license.

The delays and legal objections that the Garrynagree site is currently mired in is just one of a number of areas which has plunged the council into a waste crises that in turn threatens to send household waste charges soaring next year.

An annual fixed charge of up

to 140 euro - on top of waste charges - has already been suggested as on the horizon.

The cash-strapped council is facing a multi-million euro bill for the cost of rehabilitating Dungarvan and Tramore landfills, possibly further bills for other smaller landfills in the county, the cost of shipping waste to Carlow, the loss of income from the closure of its landfills as well as hefty fines from the Environmental Protection Agency.

However, relief for the council's financial burden may be found on at least one of these fronts - that of contaminated landfill sites.

Fine Gael councillor, Paudie Coffey uncovered information on European funding available to local authorities for the cost of rehabilitating these sites. He said he has passed on this information to Environmental officer, Paul Daly. An application has to be made before the end of 2005.

## Nature's Best Defence

With all this talk about the predicted influenza pandemic and the possible threat of 'bird flu', many people are particularly concerned about how to protect themselves against infection this winter.

Of course there are many variations of flu virus which do the rounds every winter, but every few years a virus undergoes a major change, producing an entirely new strain. Having no previous exposure to the new strain, people have no resistance to it and the result is an epidemic. In this age of frequent air travel, a virus can be spread rapidly to other countries producing an international pandemic.

This year, there is a lot of publicity about a particularly virulent strain of flu from Asia. Although the virus currently only affects birds, it is possible that it will change to a form which can infect humans. If this occurs, flu vaccinations are unlikely to provide any significant protection against the new virus, and people will have no natural immunity to it.

I have written about how to increase general immunity to winter bugs in previous articles, but nature's best defence against winter viruses in particular is provided by the elder tree. Elderberries, which are rich in vitamins A and C and bioflavonoids, are a wonderful tonic for the immune system and they have a specific antiviral action which helps to prevent colds, flu and other viral illnesses.

At this time of year there are usually some berries remaining on the elder trees which are commonly found growing on roadsides and in hedgerows all over the country. However, as a

herbalist friend of mine pointed out, this year the trees were bare very early. "Every last berry has been eaten by the birds: they know something is coming", and it seems they also know how to protect themselves.

Elderberries were traditionally used to make a delicious wine that was taken during the winter months to ward off colds and other winter bugs. For people not skilled in the art of wine-making, elderberry syrup

is an excellent alternative that is very easy to make. Simply boil fresh elderberries in water with a stick of cinnamon for about 5 minutes, then squash the berries to extract the juice and strain to remove the skins. Add honey or brown sugar to the strained juice and heat until it thickens. Take one or two dessertspoonfuls of the syrup in a cup of hot water three times a day during the winter months as a tonic to help prevent viral infections.

Elderberry juice and tablets are also available from some pharmacies and health food stores. They are very safe and well tolerated, and are ideal for both adults and children who are concerned about winter viruses.

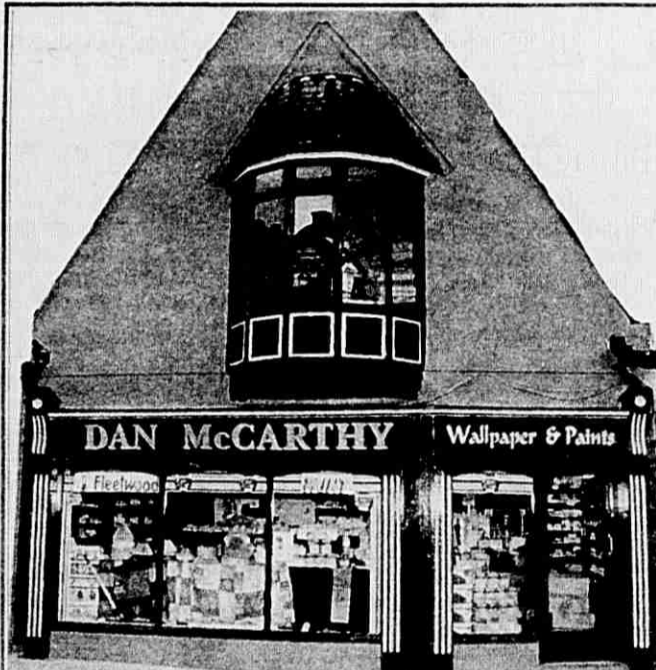

## Legal Opinion Needed On Disclosure Of Development Contributions

**By Kevin Korrane**  
A member of Waterford Co. Council called for legal advice to be sought into the executives refusal to disclose how much developers paid in development contribution to the Council. Fine Gael county councillor, Damien Geoghegan repeated his call of a month ago, for the county council officials to reveal how much was being paid by developers.

His call came after the auditors report into the county council's financial report discovered an error in calculations led to an undercharge 50,000 euro in development contributions. He said members of the public, in the past few weeks, had made allegations about certain developers. "This council needs to show it is open and transparent in all its dealings," he added. Labour councillor, Billy Kyne said it was "mindboggling" that the elected members are being

told that they couldn't ask what kind of development contribution a developer planning to build 100 houses would pay. However, County Secretary, Martin Walsh said the information is sensitive and covered by the Freedom of Information Act. If allowed to be brought into the public domain it could be used to the advantage of other developers. He said every agreement is independently assessed and "aboard board."

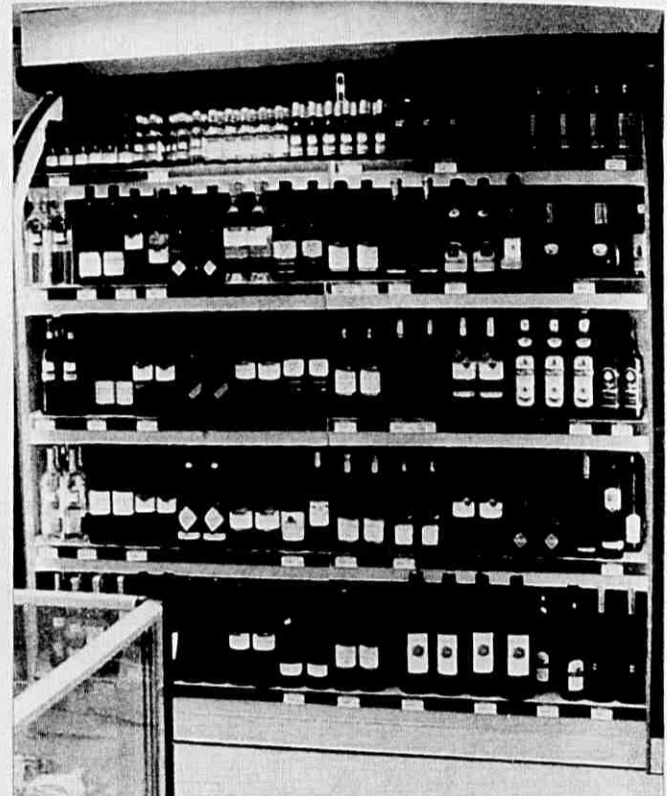

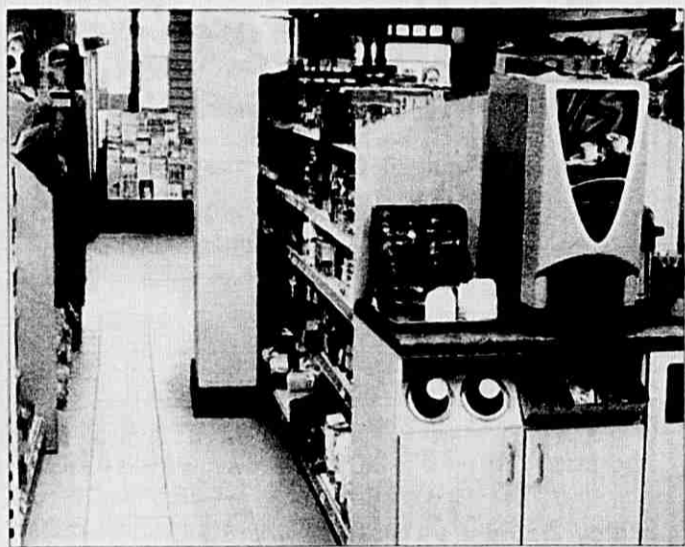

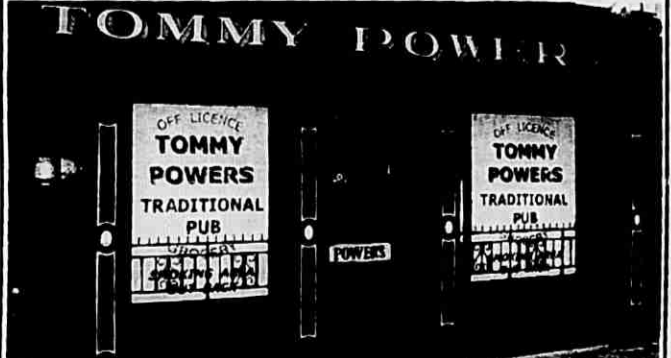

#### Students are Scapegoats for GAA Inadaquacies

UCD students came under a lot of pressure last week over their involvement in the Dublin club championship. Unfairly so I think. This is not a situation of the colleges making. They are playing by the rules and the system which allows third level institutions compete in club championships. It is an anomaly which the GAA has, like other situations, failed to address. This train has been rumbling down the track for some time. To have missed it is akin to walking up O'Connell Street and saying you never noticed the big spiky thing desecrating the middle of it. I won't even go into the argument about third level institutions in club championships. There is no argument. They don't belong. They are a different species and belong in a different competition. UCD have won three Dublin county titles in the last five years. Only somebody like Babs Keating with a vested interest could say it is good for Dublin hurling.

The GAA is as always reactive and more and more we are seeing players, like the 7 club captains in Dublin, having to take action because of the inadequacies, lack of vision and at times utter stupidity of GAA authorities. Just take a read of what Dublin chairman John Bailey, as quoted in the Irish Times, had to contribute to the debate.

"It is interesting to note that none of the captains have been supported by their clubs. I personally don't have an opinion either way on the matter. It's my job to implement the rules".

There's more;

Bailey goes on "in balancing out the argument" (one of the club arguments was that UCD players were not Dubs) to say that one of the seven signatures. Faughs captain Trevor McGrath, "was born in Wicklow not Dublin".

Where would you start with a statement like that. I would not know the names of many county Chairmen but Mr. Bailey is one who has come to public attention before. When he says the clubs are not backing the captains what does he mean? Does he mean the club delegates, which is a possibility. (There are those who say some club delegates are just wannabe lifers - not me I hasten to add). You can be sure the captains have the full backing of their players and grass roots members in their clubs. The next part of the statement is even more astonishing when he says he has no opinion on the matter. In ainm de man you are the county Chairman and this has been brewing for some time. You are supposed to lead and show vision. You have a duty to Dublin club hurling and real Dublin club hurlers. As for the last part where he says his job is to implement rules. I repeat. You are a county Chairman Mr. Bailey not a garda.

At times it would appear that everything is contriving against the humble club. Already squeezed and sidelined by the ever increasing priority given to intercounty games clubs have as well to compete, on a far from level playing field, against the colleges.

With the defeat of UCD on Sunday the controversy will die down again but it hasn't gone away you know. The issue will raise its head in the future unless the GAA sort it out.

## Magnificent Whales

There are about 80 species of whale, among which are the largest creatures to have inhabited earth. They appear to be very intelligent, social creatures who communicate with each other with a complicated system of sounds. Although whales live in the sea they are mammals, not fish. This means that they are warm blooded and give birth to live young who feed on their mother's milk. The young are born tail first so that they do not drown.



### Different Kinds of Whales

Right whales were named by whalers because they were the 'right' whales to catch for their oil. There are three types of right whale: the Greenland right whale, the black right whales and the pygmy right whales. All right whales are rare because they have been over hunted. The largest of the toothed whales are the sperm whales. They can grow up to 17m. (56 ft) in length. There are also two sperm whales, the pygmy sperm whale and dwarf sperm whale, that are among the smallest of the toothed whales.

One very unusual looking whale is the narwhal. The male narwhal has an enlarged tooth that grows straight out to form a spiral tusk about 3m. (10 ft) long.

The black and white killer whale is the most dangerous of all the whales. As well as fish, they will eat seals, penguins and even dolphins and porpoises to which they are closely related. The killer whale is the largest member of the dolphin family.

### Biggest creature in the world

The blue whale is the largest creature in the world, in fact it is the largest ever to have lived. It is larger even than the biggest of the dinosaurs. Although it feeds on tiny, shrimp-like krill, the stomach of a blue whale can hold about two tonnes of food. Sometimes it is called the sulphur-bottom whale because of the yellowish algae that may appear on its belly.

### The Groups of Whales

There are two groups of whales - the whalebone, or baleen, whales and the toothed whales. There are more toothed whales, which are usually smaller than baleen whales. Baleen whales live on plankton, which is made up of tiny sea creatures and plants. The whale strains plankton out of the water by sieving it through the comb-like plates of stiff material called baleen, that hang from the whales top jaw. Toothed whales use their teeth to catch and kill all types of fish. Baleen whales include blue, right, humpback, grey, sei and fin whales. Killer whales, sperm whales, porpoises and dolphins are all toothed whales.

### DID YOU KNOW?

The Bahamonde's beaked whale, whose bones were washed ashore on 1986, has never actually been seen alive!

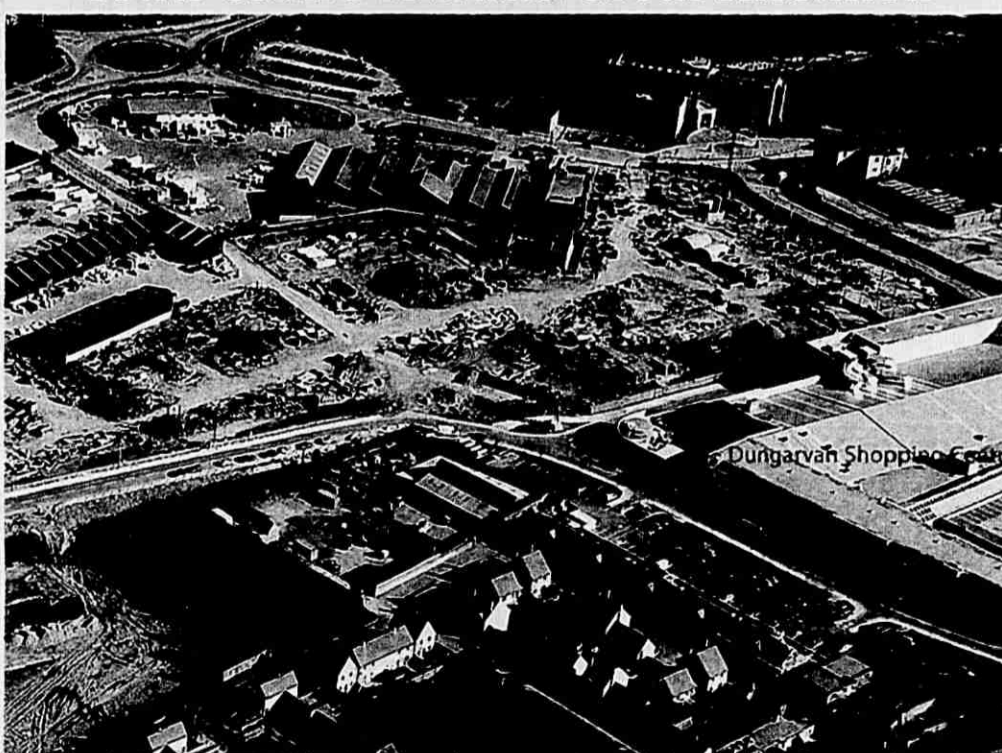

## Heritage Weekly

### LIGHTHOUSES

County Waterford has three lighthouses, Dunmore East, Ballynacourty and Mine Head. Hook Head, dating from 1170s, which is the oldest working lighthouse in Northern Europe, protects Waterford Harbour. It was reputed that the monks of St Dubhan established a fire beacon here in the 5th century. To the west of the county, the present Youghal lighthouse stands on a site, where nuns tended beacons to guide shipping in Norman times. Today it is the Commissioners of Irish Lights who are responsible for the provision and maintenance of lighthouse and other aids to marine navigation.

In 1824, Dunmore East was built to designs prepared by the Scottish engineer Alexander Nimmo. Over 30 piers/harbours were built around the coast of Ireland under his direction. The lighthouse here is of Wicklow Granite and has the distinctive form of a Doric column. Both Ballynacourty and Mine Head were built by the Commissioners of Irish Lights according to the designs of George Halpin, Inspector of Lighthouses and Inspector of Works. During his 44 years with the Commissioners he oversaw the construction and establishment of 53 new lighthouses and the modernisation or rebuilding of 15 others, in addition to the establishment of numerous minor aids to navigation—buoys, beacons, and perches. Ballynacourty is a white limestone tower with an elevation of 16m and was established on 1st of July 1858. Mine Head is a four stage light house which was established on 1st of June 1851. It is constructed of red sandstone, which is painted white with a black band. It is located on high sheer cliffs and at 87m has the highest elevation of any lighthouse in Ireland.

Dunmore East was demanned in 1922 and Baily Lighthouse, in Howth was the last watched lighthouse in Ireland to be, converted to automatic operation on 24th March 1997. There have been several books printed on Irish Lighthouses in recent years. Bright Lights, White Water by Bill Long provides an interesting background to the story of Irish Lighthouse and the generations of families who tended them, and the Commissioners of Irish Lights website [www.cil.ie](http://www.cil.ie) is also an excellent resource.

All the girls in this race were running out of their age but none the less the girls gave their all and improved on their performances of last year. Shona Curran moved up five places to finish 22nd and score on the Waterford team which finished second and so collected a silver medal. We will have at least one more nights filming at the league which probably will be tonight Wednesday (weather permitting) so wear your best gear and don't forget the old powder and paint as the cameraman will be concentrating on the runners this week and will be out the course courtesy of Johnny Clarks motorbike taking film of the participants.

The whole project is being co-ordinated by club member Rosarie Kealy and as per usual a very professional job is evident.

ALL PARTICIPANTS OF THE WINTER LEAGUE PLEASE NOTE

In addition to our routine safety rules regarding the Winter League, the organisers have included another very impor-

tant new rule with regard to wearing headphones during the run. No headphones will be permitted for either the 2.7 or the 6-mile league run. There will be no exceptions to this rule.

YOUR STARTING TIME EACH WEEK

Many runners in the league have been asking the some questions about the clock and handicap system so I will attempt to explain what happens.

The person with the slowest time each week is the first per-

son to run the following week when the clock starts at zero. The fastest person each week is the last person to run the following week. His or her starting time is calculated by subtracting his or her finishing time from the slowest persons finishing time, likewise, everybody's starting time is calculated by subtracting their finishing time from the slowest person's finishing time. The starting times are rounded to thirty second intervals. Easy that bit, now for the hard bit.

THE LEAGUE SYSTEM

The league is run on a points system, if you are the first to finish any night you accumulate one point. If you are the 100th runner to finish you accumulate 100-points - lowest total of points is best. Each week your points are added on to your previous

total of points. At the end of the league the runner with the lowest number of points is the winner. After Christmas both leagues are divided into several divisions to maintain everyone's interest in the league. If you can't grab all that, then you need to purchase our winter league handbook from Tony for 5 euro and start studying it. Waddle on friends.

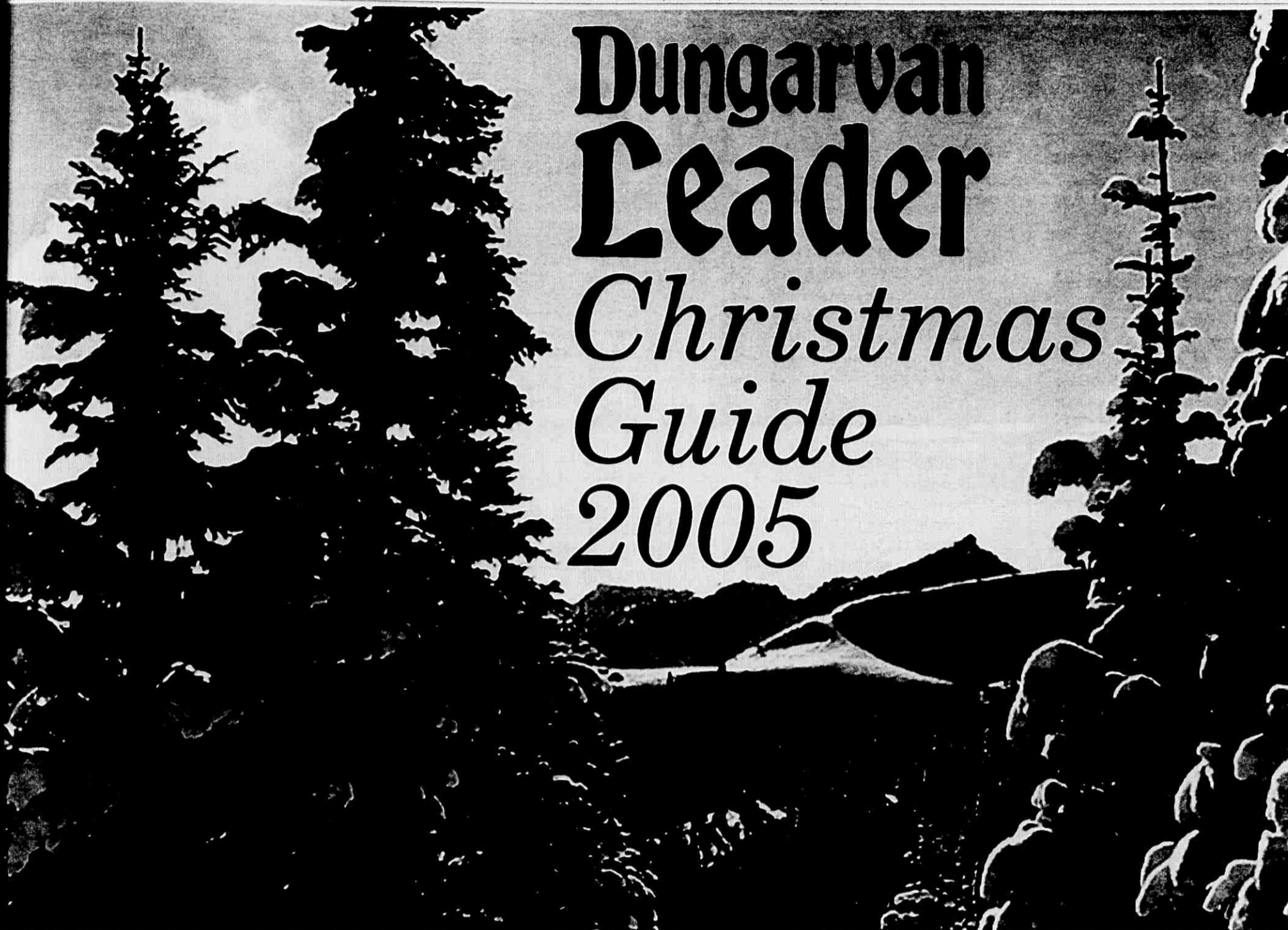

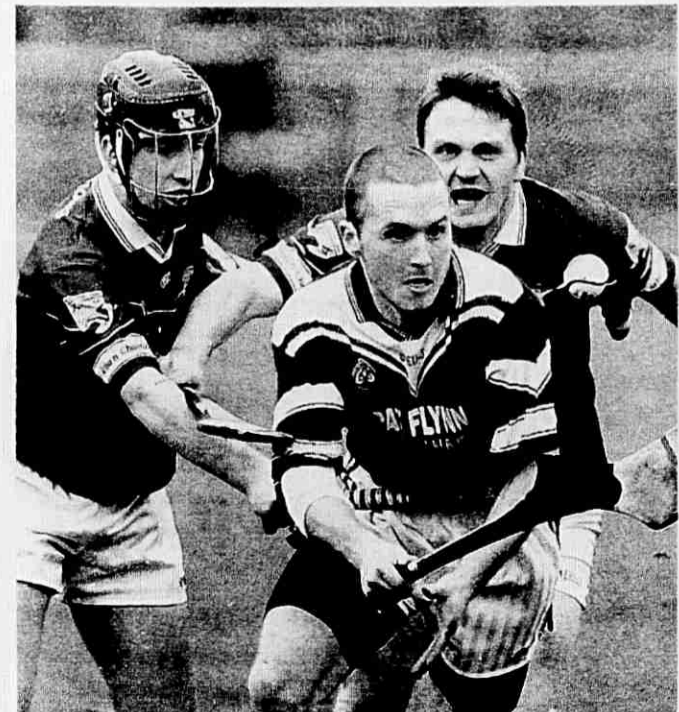

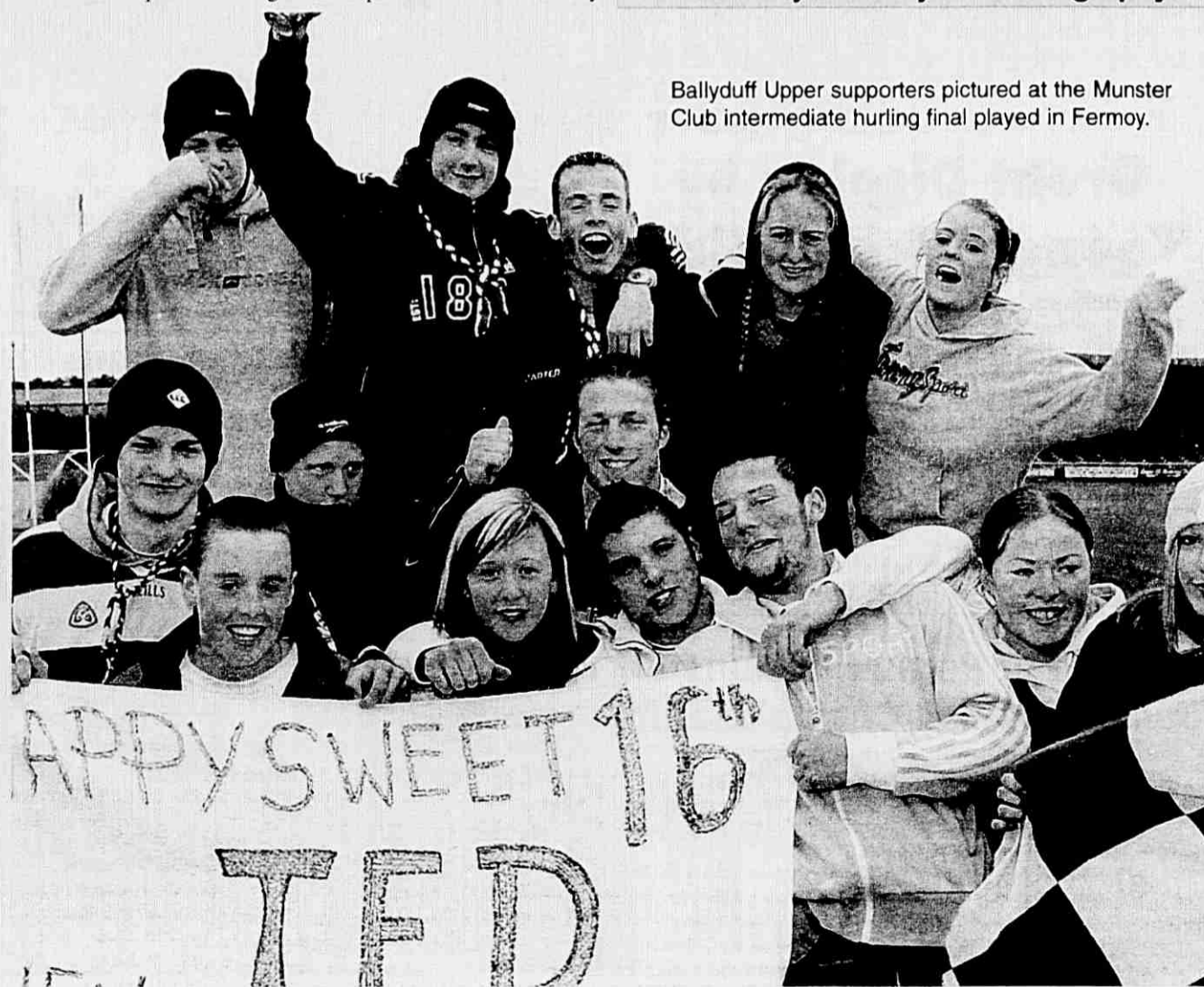


Ballyduff Upper's Stephen Molumphy on a solo run chased by Ballinahassig's James Aherne

The pressure was now beginning to show and when Kevin Moran kicked a scorable free well wide it looked all over for De La Salle. But now it was their turn to show courage and putting An Rinn under pressure had a good point from play scored by Jason Ryan to level the game again in the 24th minute. Following this the intensity of the pace became hectic, each side striving for the vital score that might break the deadlock. It happened in the 25th minute of the half when that man again Mike O Toibin kicked his best score of the match to break the deadlock. De La Salle continues to press forward but solid Gaeltach defence in which all six players played a role, kept them at bay and scoreless in the clos-




