# reen Flag Raised Aloft Above Mary's School

**SCHOOL REACHES ERNATIONAL STANDARD**

RTE's current affairs editor, Ian Noctor, hoisted the international symbol of environmental achievement, the Green Flag, above St. Mary's National school in a ceremony on Friday last.

After songs composed by second and fifth class girls echoed across the spotlessly tidy grounds on a gloriously sunny April morning, Mr. Noctor was one of a number of speakers to emphasis the rigorous tests undergone and the scale of the achievement in retaining the green flag for the second time.

**ACHIEVEMENT** 

"This achievement can't be underestimated," he told the gathered throng which included school children, teachers, parents and assorted invited guests. "Extremely hard and thorough work went into this and the teachers, principal and students must be applauded for all their efforts.

An Taisce awarded the green flag in February in recognition of their work in the care of the environment. It followed a thorough assessment in January by David O'Leary of An

Taisce and Anne Murphy, Environment Officer with Waterford County Council which deemed the school had successfully completed the seven step Green Schools Programme and had earned the prestigious international award.







# Flood Relief **Schemes To** Go On Public Display

Two flood relief schemes proposed for areas in Dungarvan are to go to Part 8, the public display and submission phase, in the

The first will channel flood water from near Kilrush on the Dungarvan to Cappoquin main road, down the course of the N25 road to an outfall near the Park Hotel roundabout. A pipe will also run from Shandon connecting up to the pipe at Fairlane roundabout near Dungarvan Fire Station.

The second contract will see the development of a water detention pond on marshy ground near Tournore. The pond will hold flood water until the tide goes out then release it into the sea.

It's hoped the new schemes will bring an end to the serious flooding experienced in both areas of the town, Dungarvan Town Council's April meeting heard.

Town Engineer, Tom Rodgers, in answer to a question from Labour councillor, Billy Kyne, said the council is in negotiations to purchase the land in Tournore.

"There is an offer on the table," he added.

### **SECRECY OVER NEW** YORK JUNKET A JOKE

As readers of this column will remember, Viewpoint said 'fair enough' when the council opted not to publicly name the councillors who were to attend the St. Patrick's Day festivities in

The reason for shrouding the visit under a veil of secrecy seemed justifiable enough. Councillors away for the duration of the trip abroad were afraid of break-ins and damage to their property.

But as readers will also note, Viewpoint went on to say that on their return, if the councillors had nothing to hide, and if indeed the trip was value for taxpayers money, they should stand up and be willing to say they were in attendence.

Sadly the opposite happened. For some bizarre reason that Viewpoint frankly cannot fathom when Sinn Fein councillor Brendan Mansfield asked who went on the trip, Fianna Fail councillor Pat Daly proposed that he be informed in writing.

This effectively stopped the release of the names - councillor Daly's included - until a day later.

Considering that Cllr. Daly knew full well that Cllr. Mansfield intended releasing the names once he received them anyway, this stalling tactic could only be described as petty obstruction for obstructions sake.

That the five or six other councillors who made up the delegation and who were in the chamber at the time didn't put their hands up and say they were part of the trip doesn't reflect all that brightly on them either.

After all, we're told in length every year how useful this trip is

The delegation meets with agencies such as Tourism Ireland, Enterprise Ireland and the IDA which, you never know, may just bear fruit one of these days and is certainly handy in updating these organisations and keeping the communications channels

While Cllr. Daly is to be richly commended for paying for the trip out of his own expenses allowance - the only one of the delegation to opt to do so - it's impossible to understand his thinking.

The delegation itself was overly large, and hindered too by the fact that the County Manager, Ray O'Dwyer didn't attend -County Engineer, John O'Flynn attended in his place. No one, it seems, can adequately explain why eight councillors must attend, resulting in a bill of 16,623.46 euro.

Excluding the costs for Mr. O'Flynn and with Cllr. Daly's costs coming out of his own expenses allowance, this broke down as 540 euro each for flights, 1,184 euro for rooms and 650 euro for each of the seven councillors in expenses.

A smaller delegation would radically reduce the cost. If at most three people attended including the County Manager and the County Mayor this would mean a spend of around just 6,000 euro, which in Viewpoint's book would be far more acceptable and justifiable. Just don't hold your breath and expect sense to prevail. After April's council meeting, it seems that accountability and a sense of fair play have gone out the window.

#### DISGRACEFUL BEHAVIOUR MUST BE CONDEMNED

The behaviour of litter louts who exploited the good work of volunteers coming up to the Easter Bank Holiday Clean-Up of the Comeragh mountains was nothing short of disgusting and

Getting volunteers out for an event of any kind is always difficult, and that so many should give up their time over the weekend to collect over 50 tonnes of rubbish in what is a backbreaking chore is to be lauded.

It at least shows that community spirit is alive and well in Waterford.

But that their efforts should be exploited by litter louts who discarded bags of household rubbish in the picturesque mountains days before the clean-up shows a darker mean spirited

The Comeraghs are one of the county's most precious natural assets. Unfortunately their remoteness with small twisting roads winding their way up the forested mountainside, the very things that make them so attractive to hill walkers and tourists is used by fly-tippers to dump huge quantities of waste in what should be a valued area.

There is no excuse for this type of behaviour, and anyone who attempts to justify it by saying the price for rubbish collection is too high is plain wrong - there are many other law-abiding and democratic ways of protesting the size of bin charges. This behaviour is scarring our countryside, and must be stamped out once and for all, whether through the use of modern spy cameras, the hiring of more inspectors, or as Cllr. Paudie Coffey has suggested setting up community alert type zones to keep areas free from litter louts.



The Irish Wheelchair Centre are planning to lease an area of council owned land near the Youth Centre at Childers Estate, Dungarvan to develop a resource and outreach centre for the West Waterford area, the April meeting of Dungarvan Town Council heard. The Wheelchair Association currently provide services one day a week from Dungarvan Youth Centre.

"We have been in negotiations with the local HSE staff, Margaret Brown Disability co-ordinator and Nicholas Maher Capital Project Officer, to secure funding for this project," Michael Doyle, regional director of the association said.

The project has been prioritised for funding this year.

The site will be developed in two phases. Phase I will be to purchase and install a prefabricated structure based on the site. The current services could then be transferred into the new premises when it is erected.

Phase 2 will be to build a purpose built facility. While Phase I is in progress the association will be able to develop the project brief, apply for planning permission and secure funding. It is anticipated that phase 2 could commence in 2008-2009. They hope that phase 1 will be completed by mid to late 2007.

#### APES

There are four types of ape: Gorilla, Chimpanzee, Gibbon and Orang-utan. The gorilla is about the same height as a man but has longer arms and is much heavier and stronger. When disturbed, they put on a ferocious-looking display of chest beating and charge forward. This behaviour is all bluff, and intended to frighten the intruder. Gibbons live in the forests of South-east Asia. They spend much of their time in the trees, using their long arms to swing from branch to branch. The shy orang-utan, whose name means 'man of the woods', lives in the rain forests of Borneo and Sumatra. This second largest member of the ape family is reddish-brown in colour and lives mainly on fruit.

Chimpanzees Live in Family Groups

Most of the ape family are found in the forests and jungles of Africa. South America and Asia. Chimpanzees live in family groups in the rainforests of central and west Africa. They live on fruit, leaves and roots. They also enjoy ants, when they find an ants' nest

ants' nest. **Apes Use Sticks As Tools** Apes are very intelligent. They can work out simple problems, and they can use their hands and feet quite skilfully. A chimpanzee will use a stick to get to out-of-reach fruit or insects, spider monkeys use sticks as weapons, throwing them at any potential threat, and the orang-utan will often use a large leaf as an umbrella.

Apes are Very Noisy

Most apes and monkeys are noisy but the howler monkey, the largest South American monkey, beats them all. They start howling as soon as they wake up, the noise being a signal to others that this territory is taken. Both males and females howl but the male has a much louder and deeper sound which can be heard

3-5km (2-3 miles) away.
A series of bones in the throat form an echo chamber (giving the animal the appearance of having a double chin, which magnifies the sound. Another noisy monkey is the proboscis monkey of Borneo which makes loud trumpeting noises through its long, drooping nose.

A gorilla weighs 3,000 times more than its fellow primate the pen-tailed tree shrew.

Chimpanzees, gorillas and orang-utans have been taught to use sign language.

Chimpanzees in the wild chew medicinal plants when they are feeling poorly.

The ancient Greek philosopher Galen of Pergamum wrote: The ape is likest to man in viscera, muscles, arteries, veins, nerves and in the form of bones.

The first ape to be dissected, a chimpanzee in 1699, is still in the British Museum.

People were outraged when Charles Darwin suggested in 1859 that humans were descended from apes.





In particular, it will strengthen and keep in a healthy elastic condition those muscles which will be used during childbirth.



Therefore housework however abundant, is not in itself a satisfactory form of exercise since it brings into play only some muscles, while others, notably those of the pelvic floor which are the ones most involved in the process of childbirth are usually neglected altogether. In many cases housework is just the type of activity which causes exhaustion and fatigue, which in turn leads to irritability and a feeling of being unable to cope. In particular with the needs of a new baby, which can lead to de-

Yoga can be very benficial in providing gentle relief by lifting the spirits and promoting relaxation. It develops a womans central core, giving her a real sense of strength and empowerment so necessary during labour and birth.

# LISMORE CLINIC TO HOLD FIRST **OPEN DAY**



### **CCTV May** Help Stop Illegal **Dumpers** By Kevin Kirrane

The installation of CCTV cameras in the centre of Dungarvan may be used to help crack down on incidences of illegal dumping in the town.

Dungarvan Town Council were given the go-ahead for CCTV by the Department of Justice late last year to help in the fight against anti-social behaviour late at night. But at the April meeting of the town council, Town Clerk, Joe O'Flaherty hinted they may have a broader use.

Asked about hiring inspectors to prevent the dumping of rubbish in the town by Mayor, Teresa Wright, Mr. O'Flaherty said illegal dumping was being looked at on an ongoing basis.

"CCTV when it comes, will hopefully help us,' he said.

**Heritage Notes** 

You wouldn't have had to be too sharp to notice that the first ten or so of our Heritage Trail plaques have gone into place within the past week or two. For variety, some of these have been placed in the footpath and some on walls. A huge thanks to Paddy and the lads in the Council for their excellent work to date on the trail. All of the plaques mark important local people or places. Many thanks also to the many people who have commented favourably on the plaques - Aidan has certainly done a fabulous job on them, no question. It was wonderful to see the boys and girls of the Foroige club enjoying a treasure hunt around town last Friday, with a number of the clues being linked to the new plaques.

Eventually, there will be approximately twenty such stone plaques in place around the locality, stretching from Tourin in the west to the Earl's Stone in the east. With work also under way on the ten larger lectern displays, for the most important local sites, we are still very optimistic of having the bulk of the signage in place by early summer. In addition to the plaques and lecterns, there are already a number of prominent people or places which are already highlighted by different means locally. #### **CAPPOQUIN CONCERNED** RESIDENTS

The submission on behalf of the local residents has been sent in to Waterford County Council, by the Concerned Residents Committee. The submission contains the issues and concerns collected on the doorsteps and at the public meetings which were held in December and in March. We have supported our submission with coloured photographs of the parking difficulties, and of the sewerage outflow area. We have reiterated again that the type, number and density of the buildings which are proposed are not acceptable to the residents as currently laid out on the plan. Concerns about the possibility of a large development in the convent grounds are also a reality.

We have laid out collective issues, observations and questions, which include the current state of the access roads to the estate, the added noise and movement which the proposed number of dwellings will add to the area. Concerns about the refuse and refuse collection, inadequate public lighting in the area traffic movement are also included.

Many of the residents have expressed the issue of the lack of available accommodation for the existing and increasing elderly residents of the town and want this dealt with.

The question has also been asked about the priority of Cappoquin natives for any proposed houses. Part 2 of the submission, set out that which would be acceptable as a reasonable compromise for the development of the site, from ideas and the agreement of the local residents at the doors and from the public meetings as mentioned.

We are aware of other interests in the site, and we trust that at the end of the day, the local residents will be satisfied with the outcome. We would like to thank the residents of Shanbally Tce., Danesfield, Barrack Street, Abbey Glen and Melleray road for writing letters about the issues which directly concern them in addition to the collective submission. More than 60 letters can be accounted for.

The next duty for the committee is to forward an abridged version of the submission to all the Councillors, and to contact each of them to lobby their support for our local Councillors who have pledged support for the local people's requests.

This is a crucial time for seeking the support of the Councillors, with the General Election looming, every resident should take the opportunity to lobby any Councillor or TD who arrives on your doorstep looking for your vote. This can be an election 'hot potato' if you want it to be so.



# West Waterford A.C.'s Conor Murray Performs Well in London Marathon

West Waterford's Conor Murray was the clubs sole representative at fast Sunday's London Marthon, keeping the clubs long tradition intact of having athlete's taking part in this premier Marathon event. On one of the hottest London Marathon days in the history of the race it was a case of survival to the line for many with even the mighty falling by the way side when one such Heile Gebrselassie pulled up at the 30 k mark. Conor prepared well for this his first London attempt and said after, like many he also was glad to reach the finish line with athletes falling by the way side every step of the final 3 or 4 miles.

This year's winner was Martin Lel (Ken) who regained the Flora London Marathon title showing that the 26.2-mile distance can be as much about speed as it is endurance. Lel won in 2:07:41, three seconds ahead of Abderrahim Goumri (Mar) with last year's champion, Felix Limo (Ken), third in 2:07:44

David Bedford, the Race Director of the Flora London Marathon. had assembled the best men's field in history and the event did not disappoint. It was close from the beginning until the last stages when four men were left challenging in Birdcage Walk, bringing the marathon down to the sort of sprint you might expect on a track

In the hot conditions, there was never going to be the chance of an attempt at the world record of 2:04:55 held by Paul Tergat (Ken).

Tergat, double world champion Jaouad Gharib (Mar) and Stefano Baldini (Ita), the Olympic champion, were among the elite athletes which not only made this race such a fantastic prospect but left it so tough to call as to whom might win. Three men pacemakers were assigned to reach the halfway point in 62:45 and Paul Kimugul (Ken), Wilfred Taragon (Ken) and Patrick Makau (Ken) led a field of 14 for the opening miles, taking them through in 4:56, 4:59, 4:39 as the men headed towards the 5km mark with Limo being the first of the group, there was just 0.02 between Baldini, in 10th position and him at this stage, but it was not to prove an afternoon to remember for the Italian because he was out of contention within another 5km. Over the next couple of miles the lead pack was reduced to six: Lel, Limo, Gharib, Goumri, Tergat and Ramaala. It quickly was reduced to five when Tergat dropped away and then as the runners left Big Ben behind them, it was down to four when Ramaala slipped out of contention. Who would triumph? It was still not possible to tell, but as the quartet turned into the final 200m, Lel kicked on and though Goumri went with him, he was never going to catch the winner Lel.

In the Ladies race Chunxiu Zhou became the first Chinese athlete to win the Flora London Marathon with a run of meticulous timing when, 16 months before the Olympic Games in Beijing, she demonstrated that the sport has a new superstar. Wearing a white peaked-cap to protect herself from temperatures which rose to 24 at midday, Zhou was the one athlete who never looked troubled during a fascinating and gripping race. Zhou, 28, won in 2:20:38, having taken control after 22 miles. As the runners made their towards The Mall, Zhou broke away from Gete Wami (Eth) and from then on there was only one outcome. Wami was second in 2:21:45 with Constantina Tomescu-Dita (Rom) overcoming a setback at halfway to finish third in 2:23:55. Another super London Marathon event which will be remembered by many for the heat on the day as much

as the race itself.


# Seamus Shines Georgia Sun

Seamus, who used a 29 on the back nine Tuesday to build his lead, said he had one eye on O'Neal, but also kept his sights on his teammates Davies and Shaw. "Obviously, I was watching the guy in second place, but it was a good competition within our team as well," said Seamus, who collected his first collegiate win. "I'm very happy to have had a couple good days on the course. As a team, all five of us are coming together at the right time." This victory is another major milestone on Seamus's career path and he has certainly found his feet on the other side of the Atlantic in no uncertain terms. #### MIGHTY MAN FOR PUNCHESTOWN

Trainer Henry Daly confirmed that Mighty Man - rated the best hurdler to have run this season by the Racing Post - is set to line up in the EUR200, 000 Dunboyne Castle Hotel & Spa Champion Stayers Hurdle at Punchestown this coming Thursday. The seven-year-old won the John Smith's Liverpool Hurdle at Aintree recently by an effortless 13 lengths and Daly is looking forward to Punchestown. "I'm very happy with him after Aintree and he'll go to Punchestown. He doesn't want soft ground but that looks unlikely anyway," said Daly. "The official handicapper has put him up 7lb to 172, which doesn't really make any difference as he won't run in a handicap, but you've got to be delighted to have a horse that good. "It will be interesting to see what happens if Hardy Eustace and Al Eile run. They're all good horses and that's what racing's about - running good horses against each other."

#### SUBLIMITY FOR CHAMPION HURDLE

The Grade 1 ACCBank Champion Hurdle on Friday promises to be one of the races of the 2007 Irish National Hunt Festival and trainer John Carr confirmed that he hopes to run Smurfit Kappa Champion Hurdle winner Sublimity in the EUR200, 000 contest. "I couldn't be happier with him after Cheltenham. He's the champion and I believe he can come out on top again. I might bring him back a bit earlier next season and it will be a light campaign again," said Carr. "Hopefully he can give me my fourth winner at the Punchestown Festival. I had one in 1990 and then Roadmaker won the three-mile handicap hurdle last year and Stutter won the two-mile handicap hurdle the year before." Punchestown's course continues to be watered and Carr added that the seven-year-old would not want the ground to be too fast. "He's an intended runner providing the ground is right for him. We've kept him cantering and doing a bit of work. "I believe they're doing a very good job watering but we'll need a drop of rain as well for him to take his chance as it would have to be on the soft side of good." The original race, due to be run as the seventh race on Grand National day, Saturday, April 14, was abandoned because Graphic Approach, who ran in the big race, was still being treated on the course. Graphic Approach, who was subsequently taken to the Philip Leverhulme Equine full recovery.

Charles Barnett, Aintree Racecourse's managing director, commented: "The welfare of the horse is always our number one priority and the abandonment of the last race on April 14 was the right decision. "We apologised at the time to the owners and trainers who had horses in the abandoned event and have been working hard since to stage a replacement at Aintree's next fixture on May 18. "This has now been agreed and we want to give connections of horses as much notice as possible of the replacement race which I am sure will be well supported."

The John Smith's Champion Standard Open National Hunt Flat Race (8.55pm) is additional to the scheduled programme on May 18, meaning there will now be seven races during the evening, with the first off at the earlier time of 5.35pm.

The conditions of the race are similar to the original, although it will not carry Grade Two status and the penalty structure has changed, with a winner of a National Hunt Flat race or an Irish NH Flat race carrying 4lb extra or two or more such races 7lb extra.
