Decision On Major Mixed-Use Zoning Deferred

HOTEL, COMMERICAL AND RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT PLANNED FOR BURGERY

By Kevin Kirrane

Dungaryan area councillors are set to meet later this months to discuss controversial plans for a mixed use zoning that could ultimately see significant development at the Burgery in Dungarvan.

It follows the deferral of a decision on whether to material contravene the County Development Plan to allow site development works to cater for serviced sites for residential and commerical development, including for a hotel, bar, restaurant, car showroom, leisure and other commerical uses.

The 2.1 hectare site which adjoins the Golden Meadows nursing home close to the Dungarvan town boundary is planned to be developed by Terry McCarthy.

Four Dungarvan Area Councillors met with the developer's architects, Fewer Harrington Lawlor on Wednesday last for a presentation of the plans.

The material contravention was proposed at the June meeting of Waterford County Council by Fine Gael councillor Tom Higgins and Fianna Fail councillor Tom Cronin, and looked like being approved until the intravention of councillors, Billy Kyne and Teresa Wright of the Labour Party.

Councillor, Billy Kyne pointed out that he had grave reservations regarding the "total lack of consultation" with elected members of the Dungarvan electoral area. And said that while the process may have been procedurally correct it did not in any way allow a realistic input for him as an elected member.

He said the notice for the material contravention appeared in the Irish Examiner on 2nd May but he didn't receive notice from the planning (continued on page 8)

More Enforcement Officers Needed - Kym-

More compliance officers should be employed by Waterford County Council to crack down on developers who do not properly finish off estates, according to Labour councillor, Billy Kyne who was speaking at the June meeting of the local authority.

A number of developments have not been finished off, with Cllr. Kyne giving the example of Crumpan in Dungarvan where are number of problems have been highlighted by residents.

The developer sold the site off to another developer in Dublin and the problems have gone unresolved.

"We need to regig how we do business, and be more efficent, and provide enforcement in cases where developers have not played by the rules," Cllr. Kyne said.

He also questioned the executive whether new guidelines in place which allow the local authority to refuse a developer permission where he hasn't properly finished off the first estate

are being implemented by Waterford County Council.

Director of Services, Denis McCarthy said he wasn't aware of any local authority which has implemented the guidelines.

However, he agreed that it is "essential" that problems are tackled. A new policy on taking in charge estates is being drawn up and it is to come before the SPC.

FOLLOW THE MONEY

Two years after Caredoc was set up in a blaze of publicity, the organization is very clearly resonant about providing answers to important questions.

Lismore Town Council, through Labour councillor, Jan Rotte, lodged a Freedom of Information request asking what the original proposal for Caredoc in the county was, and whether under this, they planned to set up a Clinic in Lismore.

It's a key question. Lismore was flagged in press releases from Caredoc to the local media as the location for a clinic.

Given that €800,000 was granted to Caredoc to implement this proposal by the South Eastern Health Board (SEHB) its crucial to know the exact details of the proposal.

If a clinic in Lismore was part of the original proposal sanctioned by the SEHB where did the money go when it wasn't delivered, was it spent, or was it returned to the SEHB, and why and when was the original proposal overturned.

The money argument renders Caredoc's claims that Lismore doesn't have the population, and wouldn't have the numbers to justify a clinic, wholly immaterial.

If Caredoc was indeed funded by public monies to put a clinic in Lismore, retrospectively claiming that the numbers don't add up is a futile argument.

Caredoc's refusal to release relevant information to Lismore Town Council, and later to Deputy Brian O'Shea, who also made representations on Cllr. Rottes behalf, speaks volumes.

Lismore would be an ideal centre - not just for the town itself - but for the entire West Waterford area, cutting out unneccessarily long journey's on behalf of the sick and elderly - often twenty or more miles - for urgent medical attention in

It could include the towns of Cappoquin and Tallow and the surrounding smaller urban areas as well as a significant rural

This would stack up to a substantial population, and end the unncessary isolation people in these areas feel from the medical centres in the county.

If indeed, as is widely suspected, Caredoc received public funding for a Clinic in Lismore, there can be no valid reason for the company's refusal to go ahead with what was sanctioned by the SEHB.

It's not a matter of the Caredoc chiefs vetoing this - if it is the case, they simply shouldn't have the choice, and the commitment they gave to a public body on trust must be carried out for the good of the people of West Waterford.

DEELISH WATER SUPPLY PART OF **WIDER PROBLEM**

Residents of Deelish and surrounding areas were put on notice to boil their drinking water in recent days. Traces of ecoli and choliform were discovered in the water supply, leading to health fears. Tests are also currently being analysed for Crytosperidium, the contaminant which closed off the Portlaw supply over Christmas and, in an even more high profile case, has seen water in Galway being subject to a boil notice for several months now.

The Deelish problem though is part of a wider issue to do with the county's water and sewage infrastructure.

Many smaller treatment plants each individually serving hundreds of people in their localities urgently need to be replaced, but due to delays, red tape and lack of forward thinking nothing has been done, leading to just these types

The treatment plant which malfunctioned and pumped raw sewage onto White Strand in Abbeyside for six months is a case in point.

As long as two years ago Independent councillor, Michael O'Riordan raised a clamour calling for its replacement as it was coming to the end of its life. Yet nothing was done, leading to a health and safety problem at the popular strand during the summer tourism season.

While massive amounts of money, totalling hundreds of millions of euro, have been promised, and in many cases delivered to update, improve and replace outdated treatment plants, the issue continues to be a front line problem, with smaller schemes especially at risk.

It's a right of each citizen of the European Union - set in stone by legislation by the EU - to have quality drinking water. Those without proper quality drinking supply can justifiably take the Local Authority to task before the European Courts for failing to adhere to these rights, as was seen in a recent case brought by residents in Limerick.

Therefore, replacing treatment plants on the verge of breakdown and coming to the end of their lives should be seen only as prudent, and as upholding these rights.

Until that is done we will continue to see health and safety fears and an increasing number of boil notices in our crumbling network of treatment plants.

DESERT PLANTS

The hot and dry conditions found in deserts are far from ideal for plants, which need water to grow. Yet several types of plants have adapted themselves to these hostile environments.

Cacti Are Adapted To Hold Water

Cacti have long roots that lie close to the surface, which enables them to take in any available water quickly. The stem of a cactus is designed to hold water and the spines, which are actually the leaves, are designed to lose as little water as possible through evaporation. The spines also help to protect the plant from animals that may try to eat it. If a piece of a cactus plant gets knocked off, it can take root in the sand and grow into a new plant.

The Saguaro Cactus Lives For Over 200 Years
The saguaro cactus of the Arizona and Mexican
deserts takes 10 years to grow to a height of 2.5cm
(1in). Often it will not flower until it is 50, or even 75
years old. By the end of its life, which is about 200
years, it will have reached 15m (50ft) which makes it

the largest member of the cactus family. Many Desert Plants Only Bloom After It Has Rained

Many desert plants remain dormant (inactive) until the rains come, when they burst into life creating a lush and beautiful landscape. The plants grow quickly, flower, create new seeds and die in a very short time. Resurrection plants are brown and shriv-

elled when it is dry, to conserve water, but when it rains the leaves expands and turn green again. Living stones, desert plants of southern Africa, look just like stones until they lower after it has rained.

Desert Plants Have Ways To Conserve Water

Because there is very little
rain in desert regions,
many desert plants tore
water in some way, in their
stems, their leaves, or
their roots to last them
through periods of
drought. Some of these
plants also have a thick,
waxy skin that lessens the
amount of water lost
through evaporation. All
these desert plants, that
include cacti, are known as
succulents.

Some Desert Plants Get Water From Air

The caper plant which lives in the Sahara Desert can survive without taking up any water from its roots. It gets its water from vapour in the air. Another desert plant that gets most of its water from the atmosphere is the welwitschia, which grows in the coastal deserts of south west Africa.

DID YOU KNOW?

The world's largest cactus is the Saguaro of Mexico and California. It can grow to 16m (52ft), weigh 10,000kg (10 tons), and store 3,000 litres (660 gal) of water.

Some Native Americans of Mexico follow a religion based on the visions caused by taking a drug made from the mescal cactus.

The American pygmy cedar lives entirely on water vapour absorbed from the air.

Certain cacti can store enough water to live for a year without rain.

The guayule plant that grows in the deserts of Mexico leaks acid from its roots to prevent other plants growing near it!

Because desert plants all wait for rain to germinate, deserts can become a blaze of colour for a few days after the rainfall.



That time of the month

For many women, the few days before a period is due are the worst days of the month. For some this time means little more than being slightly more irritable than usual, but for others it can signal a whole array of devastating emotional and

physical changes. Pre-menstrual syndrome, or PMS is caused by the hormone changes which occur during the second half of the menstrual cycle, after ovulation and before start of the next menstrual period. For many women, symptoms only last for three or four days, but for others the ordeal can drag on for two weeks or more. Given that the period itself may last a week, this leaves only one week or less during which the woman feels any sense

The emotional symptoms of PMS have received the most attention, and for this reason the condition is sometimes referred to as pre-menstrual tension or PMT. Many women feel emotionally vulnerable at this time and may find themselves in tears over events which would not normally cause such distress. However, what most sufferers seem to find particularly distressing is the tendency to become extremely irritable, angry or even violent. These outbursts are usually disproportionately severe in terms of the events which trigger them, and sufferers often worry about the intense hatred they can feel towards their partner at this time of the month. They may also be concerned about angry outbursts which can be directed towards their

The physical symptoms of pre-menstrual syndrome are less well known but may be equally distressing. The most common is fluid retention which may lead to abdominal bloating, swollen hands and feet, and breast pain or tenderness. In some cases abdominal cramps or lower back pain can occur before the period starts, and cravings for carbohydrates (especially chocolate) are also common. In the most severe cases symptoms can include fatigue constipation, muscle or joint pain, recurrent vaginal thrush,


acne, swollen glands and migraines. Pre-menstrual syndrome is usually caused by a relative deficiency of the hormone progesterone in relation to the other hormones which govern the menstrual cycle. There is often an additional sensitivity to the hormone prolactin which is produced at this time of the month. The condition can be triggered by an imbalance of microbial flora which leads to an overgrowth of organisms such as Candida albicans. Stress is also an important exacerbating factor. The most useful herb for treating pre-menstrual syndrome is chaste tree (Vitex agnus castus). This herb works on the pituitary gland to normalise hormone production and generally leads to increased levels of progesterone and decreased levels of prolactin. When taken over the course of a few months it is extremely effective in reducing premenstrual symptoms. Of course this depends on the quality of the product and the dose taken. Some over the counter preparations recommend taking the herb two or three times daily, however it is more effective to take the entire daily dose first thing in the morning (preferably between 6 and 7 a.m.) when the pituitary gland is most active.

In addition there are a number of supplements available which can support herbal treatment and help to reduce symptoms. Vitamin B complex supports the nervous system and preparations containing high levels of vitamin B6 are particularly useful for pre-menstrual syndrome. Essential fatty acids are also helpful for this condition, particularly brands such as EyeQ which combine Evening primrose and

It is important to try to avoid refined carbohydrates (such as cakes, biscuits sweets and white bread) since these encourage the growth of harmful organisms such as Candida albicans. Other common culprits include milk and fermented products such as alcohol and vinegar. Herbs such as garlic, cinnamon and thyme help to keep harmful microbes under control, and friendly organisms can be replenished by taking an acidophillus supplement or eating plenty of live natural yoghurt.
For stubborn symptoms, a combination of herbs may be used

to provide relief. For example, herbal diuretics such as dandelion leaf can help to reduce fluid retention and bloating. Numerous herbs are also available which can treat cramps, fatigue, constipation, recurrent vaginal thrush, and migraines. For symptoms which are numerous or severe it may be beneficial to consult a qualified practitioner of herbal medicine who can prescribe an individually tailored

CINEMA

Ocean's Thirteen*****

Getting excited about Ocean's Thirteen is a task that really depends on what you have seen of the series. If you have seen neither of its predecessors then you will surely be very eager to watch a slick heist movie directed by one of Hollywood's real talents, Steven Soderbergh, and featuring an eye-wateringly starry cast. If you saw the first George Clooney effort you will be perhaps slavering at the thought of a follow up to one of the smartest, most enjoyable movies in recent years. However, if it was your misfortune to see Ocean's Twelve you will probably dread the prospect of sitting through another such borefest. So the fact that, in cinema at least, Thirteen is closer to Eleven than Twelve will come as a relief to fans worldwide.

The gang's motivation this time round is revenge, as they attempt to repay Al Pacino's brazen hotel owner Willie Bank for ripping off Reuben Tishkof (Elliot Gould). While Reuben languishes in ill health and depression after Bank's betrayal, Danny (Clooney) puts together the old team, including Rusty (Brad Pitt) and Linus (Matt Damon) to bankrupt and humiliate Bank on the opening night of his new casino. The plot driven script follows the pitfalls and successes the Oceans have along the way to the big opening night and then delivers the heist.

Although neither as slick nor as fresh as Eleven, Thirteen wins big in the humour stakes. The big payoff isn't as impressive as before perhaps but then as the theme of the theft is revenge rather than gain or necessity, the tension never builds. Instead the joy comes from the comic flow of the gang, especially the easy humour between Clooney, Pitt and Damon and a real breakout for Casey Affleck, who shows up as the funniest thing in the entire movie. As ever, there are enough twists and turns to keep everyone guessing and the soundtrack by David Holmes is as Las Vegas music should be. The story opens up the world of the Oceans enough to suggest that there may be more films in the works, though hopefully not along the exact same lines as the franchise has taken to its end now. Although not a match for Eleven, the horror of Twelve has been erased and Ocean's Thirteen is an enjoyable addition to the franchise.

Still Showing

Paradise Lost (*****) isn't original; neither is it funny (as many great horrors are) or shiver-yourself-to-sleep-afterwards scary. The tale of gringo backpackers lost in Brazil and preyed upon by organ stealing locals does have a sheer sense of excitement going for it though. It is also gorgeous to watch, both because of the Brazilian scenery and the gorgeous cast. It packs in the gore, which may be more stomach turning than frightening but has a doubtless effect. Without doing anything special it still manages to be a guilty pleasure and is worth a look.

Wedding Daze (******) meanwhile is a perky little film that

makes the best of a threadbare concept with a cheaper version of the kind of gently outlandish humour that made Little Miss Sunshine such a hit last year. Jason Biggs stars as Anderson, whose life has been in a slump since his fiancée died. After chiding from a friend he proposes to total stranger Katie (Isla Fisher) in a café. Katie, freaked out by her own love life and with a family history of spontaneity, accepts his offer. Equally stunned by this outcome, the pair embark on a rollercoaster journey to married life upon which they discover some interesting feelings.

Soft fruits can be really hardy

SUCCULENT and juicy, with a delicate skin and gentle double curve, peaches, nectarines and apricots have all these things in common ñ so where do they differ?

The one main physical difference is that apricots are a lot smaller than peaches and nectarines.

Also, there are noticeable differences in skin texture. Nectarines are smooth and shiny, peaches are furry and apricots fall somewhere in the

Apricots have been grown in Britain for the last years, although not widely until the last century.

There are three main points to consider in the culture of apricots: the flowers appear in early spring ñ and are therefore very susceptible to frost damage; many fruits may fall if the trees are dry at the roots; and fruit set may be patchy unless the flowers are hand-pollinated because there are few pollinating insects about when the flowers open in

Soils that apricots relish have a neutral pH a little on the alkaline side. Good drainage is essential.

The nectarine is, in fact, the smooth-skinned form of the melt-in-the-mouth peach.

Technically it is a mutation, or bud sport, which arose more than 2,000 years ago. As a bush tree, the nectarine has not proved

popular in Europe, as it is said to be somewhat less hardy. Far from being tender subjects, peaches are hardy

enough to succeed in the open almost anywhere except the really cold regions, such as northern

They need no special soil requirements, but the soil must be of normal garden fertility and adequately drained.



Nectarines should be grown and cultured in the same way as peaches.

Recommended varieties of peaches include Duke of York, Peregrine and Rochester.

THIS WEEK IN THE GARDEN

Prune flower shrubs

Any shrubs that flowered during May or early June can be pruned, but this is not to say that pruning is always necessary. Much depends on the purpose for which the shrub is being grown and the amount of space that you can spare for it.

Take pink cuttings

Now is the time to propagate pinks by cuttings. Select healthy looking, non-flowering shoots 10 to 13cm long and pull them out at a joint.

This is known as taking a epipingí. Insert these pipings firmly, 5cm deep and about 10cm apart each way, in sandy soil, preferably in a frame, but failing this in a shady border outdoors and keep well watered. They should be well rooted and ready for planting out by the end of September.

Sow French Beans

Make a sowing of French beans in a sheltered place outdoors. Sow the seeds singly abut 15 cm apart in drills 5 cm deep. An economical method is to have two drills about 23 to 30 cm apart, then an alleyway about 75 cm wide, then another couple of rows and so on.

Stop cutting asparagus

It is most unwise to cut asparagus after the third week in June. Allow the plants to make foliage now so that new crowns may be formed for next year. Give the bed a small dressing of

any good compound fertiliser. Spray apples against Codling Moth

If in previous years grubs have been found feeding inside apples during July and August it is probable that the codling moth is responsible, and steps should be taken now to prevent further damage. Spray all apple trees at once with derris carbaryl, fenitrothion or malathion making sure that the fruitlets are covered. It would be a good idea to spray again in about 3 weeksí time to catch any later-hatching grubs. This pest is easily confused with apple sawfly.

Who is entitled to claim a Bereavement Grant in the event of a

ANSWER

The Bereavement Grant is a payment to assist with funeral or other expenses following a death. The grant of €850 is usually paid to the person responsible for these expenses

Eligibility usually depends on the number of PRSI (Pay-Related Social Insurance) contributions that have been made over a certain period of time. You may also be eligible based on entitlement to certain social welfare payments.

The PRSI requirement can be met by the PRSI payments of either the deceased person or their spouse or partner. In the case of the death of a child under 18 years of age (or under 22 if in full-time education), the PRSI contributions of their parent or guardian are taken into account.

The grant is also payable on the death of:

A contributory pensioner, their spouse or partner, or someone for whom they received a qualified child allowance or qualified adult

An orphan for whom a Guardian's Payment (Contributory) was being paid, or their guardian

The widow or widower of a deceased insured person

From May 2007, the grant is payable on the death of a person aged between 16 and 22 who was receiving Disability Allowance To apply for the Bereavement Grant, contact your local Social Welfare Office or telephone Lo-call 1890 500 000.

Other grants available following a death include the Widowed Parent Grant, for widows or widowers with dependent children, and the Special Funeral Grant which may be claimed under the Occupational Injuries Benefit Scheme where a death results from a work-related accident or disease.

FOREIGN LOTTERIES

We have all received promotional material, regarding foreign lotteries and we are very tempted by the prizes on offer. However, before you proceed to hand over your credit card details and personal information perhaps you should take the following warning from the European Consumer Centre in Dublin into consideration.

The European Consumer Centre in Dublin has seen a huge increase in the past year of Irish consumers complaining about foreign lotteries.

With most of these lotteries you are told in the promotional material that you have won a major prize. To claim the prize however, you must submit personal details and very often credit card information. But if you read the small print it indicates that you have only entered into a prize draw and money will be debited from the credit card to pay for administration fees and lottery tickets.

The warning from the European Consumer Centre in Dublin is to be wary of these lotteries and consumers should note

Legitimate lottery operators do not ask for administration

Never provide personal identity information to an unknown

"The IMB (Irish Medical medicine. Adding it to our drinking water for medicinal purposes, as a medicinal product, is completely illegal on these grounds. All medicines in use in Ireland must be approved by the IMB which is the only competent statutory regulatory body for licensing medical products in Ireland and yet it has never tested this highly unstable and toxic pollutant, on which Irish people are being mass medicated daily.'

Sinnott was "appalled" that in Ireland Europe, and hydroflurosilicic acid has not been nor is being tested and is being used by the HSE in Ireland. "Successive governments have mass medicated us by adding synthetic fluorides to Irish drinking water We can see the harm that is being done as a result of exposure to this substance during our youngest and bone disorders."

"As vice president of the European Parliament's Petitions Committee, I am hosting a number of petitions from groups addressing this issue of hydroflurosilicic acid. I hope that hydroflurosilicic acid's days are numbered and that our new government will take the issue of force medicating the population seriously. They need to ensure the IMB tests hydroflurosilicic acid and in doing so will realise how dangerous and unsafe it is and ban the use of this toxic waste substance."

Minehead Lighthouse

County Waterford Beekeepers Notes

Summer, swarming and the "June gap" have all arrived close on one another. After a few, now forgotten, weeks of cool, blustery weather around the end of May we are now heading towards mid-summer. As far as the 'June gap" is concerned we may have to rewrite that. A week ago in the locality here (Lismore area) the first blackberry bushes were in flower. Granted the areas concerned are sheltered and sunny - bur flowering blackberry in late May / early June is not sticking to the script and so we may have no gap in our honey flow at this time. The same cannot be said about swarming. Swarms are reported all over the place. From a bee's point of view this is a very healthy sign as bees will only swarm when there are times of plenty...as a rule! Certainly the successful beekeeper is the one who deals effectively with swarm protection and keeps stocks and honey intact.

I must confess to not being one of these. While I had four hives on oil-seed rape in April two had swarmed and one had become queenless on their return to their original apiary. Nevertheless three of them yielded a super of honey ...so you win some you lose some. Altogether I found that moving bees to the rape to be a positive experience, though in future I will examine hives while they are stationed out. As it turned out the honeyflow only started two to three weeks after flowering begun and as it turned out only after rainfall (April was pratically without rain) so our flora does require moisture to release nectar.

he Association has been very successful in its nive opening pr gramme this season. Our thanks to Tony Murray for hosting the last meting in Carrigroe, which despite inclement weather and dropping tempeatures turned out to be a very fruitful meeting. Most of us are very impressed with the manner with which Tony works his bees without gloves. We are also impressed with the bees manners. Tony is demanding on his standards of bee behaviour and two stings from the same hive is marked as down the scale on his report sheets. (Most of us would be delighted with hives that only recorded two stings per opening) Queens were found and marked (and clipped expertly by our favourite barber, P. J. Curran) and those present practised the holding of Queens poised for clipping by using drones instead a good and safe way to gain confidence in this procudere.

Our next meeting is on Sunday 10 June at the same P. J.Currans when the emphesis will be on queen breeding. It's no use me urging members to attend because it will have happened by the time you read this! But you will be able to read all about it on this space next month. Keep your reports of swarming and anything else coming.

Finally, we wish our President Noel Lonergan a speedy recovery after he was taken to Waterford Regional Hospital some days ago. Hopefully by the time you read this Noel you will be at your workshop in Cappoquin and about that pair of trousers! Enjoy the good weather and your bees in the coming weeks.





Strike Hoose Before Coughing Starts

Pneumonia is the scourge of suckled calves in October/November. But an animal with lungs damaged by hoose in July/August is much more likely to get pneumonia. And, of course, the performance of an animal with a damaged lung from hoose will be below par. Hence very good reasons to bury hoose when it is likely to appear. The first signs of coughing in spring born calves can appear as we move through June into July. It is too late dosing when coughing has started. Damage has already been caused. Both suckled and bucket reared calves are eating a significant amount of grass by now. As they graze they pick up infection. So the first dose should be in late June. The next around mid August. Levamisole is cheap and is an excellent hoose treatment. It will also hit stomach worms. But the important point is to strike before coughing starts. Otherwise damage is already done. An earlier dose can make all the difference. Can we Cut Nitrogen Costs?

Up to recently far too much nitrogen was being applied on grassland particularly at low to medium stocking rates. But the rapid rise in the cost of nitrogen means that it is now being applied much more prudently. With excess nitrogen you grow more grass than can be grazed. The result - very poor quality grass or a lot of time spent topping fields or making baled silage you may not need.

Very little nitrogen will be spread on most drystock farms for the rest of the year. On dairy farms the following are the Moorepark recommendations for the rest of the year.

Slurry Waste

Lots of slurry being spread after silage this past week. Unfortunately it is the worst time of year to apply. Nitrogen in the slurry spread at this time is a complete loss. Every 3,000 gallons spread between February and April would have given at least 30 units of Nitrogen. This time of year it just goes off in the air.

June Breeding - A Vital Month.

20% of spring calving dairy cows are now calving in April or later. Disastrous from a profit point of view.

Cows calved 42 days and not been seen in heat since are a dilemma. Either you have missed them or they are not cycling at all. Do you wait for another 21 days and hope you pick them up then or do you do something about the situation? Fair enough if you pick her up at day 63 post calving. Ideally she will be in her 2nd heat at this stage and she will have a 60% chance of going in calf.

Back to the cow calved 42 days and not seen in heat. I would get such cows checked out. Every dairy farm will have a small percentage of cows that won't cycle for one reason or other. Twins, difficult births, any cows that needs assistance at calving, all fall into that bracket which says that these cows may not cycle naturally.

Ensure that every cow and heifer you want in calf is bred before the end of June. Cows bred in mid-June will calve at the end of March next year. February and March are generally the optimum months to calve spring calving dairy cows for the key reasons:

Profit – cows calving in January produce more milk but leave less profit (because of higher production costs) than their February/March calving herd mates.

Survival - monitor farm data shows that cows calving after the end of March are twice as likely to be empty at the end of the breeding season.

Take the following steps.

- 1. Continue to tail paint during the month of June (missed heats now result in culling). As there is less cows bulling now, it is much more difficult than a month ago to detect cows on heat.
- 2. Check records, identify cows not yet bred.
- 3. Examine those calved more than 5 weeks and not yet bred. Continue to use dairy Al until you have used a minimum

of 6 straws per heifer required (extra for expansion). Replace Liners at the end of June.

Replacing liners after 2,000 milkings per liner is a gilt edged investment. You increase milk yield by 5% and besides worn liners are now likely to give you a cell count problem. Eddie O'Callaghan, Teagasc Moorepark says that the expected life of a set of liners is about 2,000 milkings. With a mean calving date of March 1st, 2,000 milking per liner will have been obtained around the end of June on many farms. Moorepark Open Day.

IFA IN BRIEF

IFA Wants Outright Ban On **Competition And Other Premium Rate Numbers That** Do Not Provide Necessary Services To The Public

Following the recent overcharging incident with premium rate numbers, IFA Telecom has called for an outright ban on all competition and other premium rate numbers that do not provide necessary and value services to the general public.

IFA Telecom Director Pat Smith said that most of the premium rate numbers have totally exorbitant call costs and almost always provided little else but huge profit for the operators.

For example, he questioned why media companies should charge premium prices to the public entering competitions or voting for their favourite act on a TV show.

Surely these public service providers should charge people no more than a local call rate?

Mr Smith said "the Regulator and Government should ensure that the general public is not exposed to premium services that do little but take large chunks of money from vulnerable people. Many parents have suffered huge financial loss as a result of family members calling these worthless services.'

IFA Telecom also called on the media to show leadership on this issue by banning all advertising associated with worthless services being promoted at premium call rates.

IFA REMIND **FARMERS OF FARM WASTE MANAGEMENT DEADLINE**

IFA Deputy President Derek Deane has reminded farmers who have applied for the Farm Waste Management scheme that the deadline for submission of drawings and planning permission if required is June 29th next.

Mr Deane said that farmers who had applied under the fast tracking at the end of 2006 might not have submitted the required drawings to the Department of Agriculture or for Local Authority planning permission. An extension was given up to the end of June due to the huge backlog that had developed

The IFA Deputy President said that already 21,000 farmers have been approved to proceed with grant aid, while a further 25,000 farmers have applied but have yet to be approved for a grant aid. Many of these farmers may not yet have submitted the necessary drawings. They now have until the end of June to do this.

Cartier Awards

Finsceal Beo sets the early pace in the race for honours in the 2007 Cartier Racing Awards, European horse racing's most prestigious accolades, which will be presented during a glittering ceremony in London, England, on November 14, 2007. The Cartier Racing Awards, now in their 17th year, celebrate the champions of the Turf, plus one outstanding individual. The coveted eight horse awards, horse racing's equivalent of the Oscars, are determined by points earned in Pattern races combined with the opinions of a panel of racing journalists plus votes from readers of the Racing Post and The Daily Telegraph, a system which accurately rewards supreme achievement. The Jim Bolger-trained Finsceal Beo took the 2006 Cartier Award for Two-Year-Old Filly and has already staked a strong claim for this year's Cartier Three-Year-Old Filly Award, as well as the coveted Cartier Horse Of The Year Award, after completing the elusive English/Irish 1,000 Guineas double, only the second filly to do so following Attraction in 2004.Finsceal Beo currently has 88 points, the highest total so far. The Mr Greeley filly captured the Stan James-sponsored Newmarket Classic in devastating style in early May before an audacious bid for a Classic treble just came unstuck on the softer than ideal Longchamp turf, as she was caught close home by Darjina in the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1,000 Guineas). Finsceal Beo's subsequent Boylesports Irish 1,000 Guineas success gives her a lead of 40 points over Vodafone Oaks heroine Light Shift (48 points) in the three-year-old filly category.

The Niarchos Family-owned Light Shift gave Henry Cecil, winner of the Daily Telegraph Award Of Merit at the 2005 Cartier Racing Awards. a hugely popular eighth Vodafone Oaks success on June 1, while providing jockey Ted Durcan with a well-deserved first British Classic triumph. Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner Darjina, unbeaten in three outings, has 40 points, while her unbeaten compatriot Coquerelle, winner of the Group One Prix Saint-Alary, is on 32 points and Vodafone Oaks runner-up Peeping Fawn has 30.

Authorized threw his hat in the ring for the Cartier Three-Year-Old Colt Award with a devastating five-length victory in the Vodafone Derby on June 2, that ended jockey Frankie Dettori's 15-year hoodoo in the Epsom Classic. The Peter Chapple-Hyam-trained colt has 64 points. He is second at the moment in the three-year-old colt division behind dual 2,000 Guineas hero Cockney Rebel who has accrued 72 points but will have plenty of opportunities to close the gap.

Geoff Huffer's charge took the Stan James 2,000 Guineas at Newmarket in fine style under Olivier Peslier before adding the Boylesports Irish 2,000 Guineas at the Curragh by a length from Creachadoir (36 points), who had also finished runner-up in the French equivalent behind Astronomer Royal (32 points).

Dettori took his second Derby in two days on June 3, when he

executed a brilliant front-running display aboard the Jean-Marie Beguigne-trained Lawman (57 points) in the French version, the Prix du Jockey Club Mitsubishi Motors at Chantilly.

The older horse division looks particularly competitive this year with Breeders' Cup Turf winner Red Rocks, 2006 Vodafone Derby hero Sir Percy, the brilliant two-time Cartier Award winner George Washington, prolific mare Red Evie and last season's Irish Derby winner Dylan Thomas among a host of top-class performers remaining in training. The last named, winner of the Group One Prix Ganay at Longchamp in April, leads what is already looking a tight chase for the Cartier Older Horse Award, with 44 points. Aidan O'Brien's charge is only four points ahead of the Andre Fabre-trained Manduro, who scored an easy success in the Group One Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp on May 20.

The 2005 Ladbrokes St Leger winner Scorpion landed the Group One Vodafone Coronation Cup at Epsom on June 1, to take his tally to 36 points, while Red Evie's Juddmonte Lockinge Stakes win takes her to 32 points and Notnowcato, narrow conqueror of Dylan Thomas in the Group One Tattersalls Gold Cup at the Curragh on May 27, has 25 points.

The Rod Millman-trained Sergeant Cecil is one of the most popular horses in training and his success in the Group Two Emirates Airline Yorkshire Cup at York in May puts him on 17 points, one more than Allegretto who won the Group Two WBX.COM Henry II Stakes at Sandown on May 29, and the French-trained Lord Du Sud. The sprinting division, which promises to be a fascinating spectacle this season, sees Group Two Prix du Gros-Chene Mitsubishi Motors first and second, Beauty Is Truth and Peace Offering, leading the way with 20 points apiece.

The Kevin Ryan-trained Amadeus Wolf, winner of the Group Two Duke Of York Hearthstead Homes Stakes is next best on 16 points, the equal of

Group Two Betfair Temple Stakes heroine Sierra Vista. Harry Herbert, Cartier's racing consultant, commented today: "The very high standard of the Classics so far is encouraging for the rest of the season and it will be fascinating to see how Authorized, Darjina, Cockney Rebel, Finsceal Beo, Lawman and Light Shift progress.. "The Cartier Racing Awards reward excellence and, with so many good older horses waiting to test the mettle of the Classic crop, we can certainly expect more exceptional performances in the coming months."

Grand Central Retired

The regally bred Grand Central has been retired and will take up stallion duties at Summerhill Stud in South Africa. By Sadler's Wells out of the Group 1 Coronation Stakes winner Rebecca Sharp, Grand Central comes from an outstanding Hascombe Stud family and - such was his promise as a two-year-old - that he was one of the winter favourites for the 2005 Derby when trained by Aidan O'Brien. A runaway four-length Leopardstown maiden winner as a two-year-old, he went on to be placed in the Grade 1 Secretariat Stakes in Chicago as well as both the Group 2 Derrinstown Derby Trial at Leopardstown and the Group 3 Leopardstown 2,000 Guineas Trial at the same course. He was subsequently purchased by the Hong Kong Breeders' Club to join David Oughton in Hong Kong.

Major-General Guy Watkins, a former Chairman of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, organized the placement in South Africa and described Grand Central as "probably the best bred horse ever to race in Hong Kong." Greg Muir, stallion manager at Summerhill Stud, said: "We are excited to have Grand Central with us and standing a horse with his credentials was an opportunity we could not turn down.

Top Class Entry

Dual Classic heroine Finsceal Beo tops a superb 51-strong entry for the £300,000 BGC Sussex Stakes, run over a mile on Wednesday, August 1, the second day of Glorious Goodwood 2007. Jim Bolger's charge, who followed success in the 1,000 Guineas over Newmarket's Rowley Mile on May 6 with victory in the Irish 1,000 Guineas at the Curragh three weeks later narrowly failing to land an incredible hat-trick when touched off in the French version in between - could face very stiff competition in the Group One contest, with a host of top international performers entered, not to mention last year's champion two-year-old and stable companion, Teofilo.

Compatriot George Washington, brilliant winner of both the 2,000 Guineas and Queen Elizabeth II Stakes in 2006, was initially retired to stud after his three-year-old season, but is now back in training at Ballydoyle. His trainer, Aidan O'Brien, is looking for his third BGC Sussex Stakes victory after Giant's Causeway (2000) and Rock Of Gibraltar (2002) and has 15 entries to choose from, including French 2,000 Guineas victor Astronomer Royal and Epsom Derby runner-up Eagle Mountain. Prior to Giant Causeway's success, the previous Irishbased scorer was the Vincent O'Brien-trained King's Lake in 1981. The 22-strong Irish entry also includes Arch Swing, trained by John Oxx, who chased home Finsceal Beo in the 1,000 Guineas at Newmarket before disappointing behind the same rival in the Irish version next time.

The Classic generation could also be represented by Eoghan O'Neill's Vital Equine and Dutch Art, trained by Peter Chapple-Hyam, who filled behind Cockney Rebel in the 2,000 Guineas a the minor placing Newmarket on May 5, while Creachadoir, runner-up in both the French and Irish 2,000 Guineas, is another contender for the Jim Bolger stable.

Godolphin has taken the BGC Sussex Stakes twice with Aljabr (1999) and Noverre (2001) and the Maktoum family's racing operation is well represented with eight entries, among them Caradak, who captured the Group Two totesport Celebration Mile at Goodwood last year, and ex-Italian Ramonti, who ran a blinder on his British debut when touched off by the Michael Belltrained Red Evie in the Lockinge Stakes at Newbury on May 19.

The Criquette Head-Maarek-trained Passager ran his best race to date when a close third in the Lockinge Stakes and could bid for compensation, while the Head family has another entry - trained by exjockey Freddie - in the shape of Racinger, who took the Group Two Prix du Muguet at Saint-Cloud on May 1. France last won the contest with Bigstone in 1993.

A fascinating entry is South African challenger Asiatic Boy, trained by Mike de Kock. The Argentine-bred four-year-old won all four starts on dirt at Nad Al Sheba, Dubai, earlier this year, culminating with a breathtaking nine and a half length triumph from Jack Junior in the Group Two UAE Derby on March 31.

Ed Dunlop lifted the BGC Sussex Stakes last year with the gallant Court Masterpiece and has entered the improving Munaddam, while James Fanshawe, who sent out the classy Soviet Song to land the prize in 2004, has entered progressive six-year-old Cesare, an emphatic winner in Listed company at Ascot last month.

Proclamation gave Jeremy Noseda a famous win when resisting the late charge of Soviet Song in 2005 and his three entries this year includes Rahiyah, who produced a cracking effort on her seasonal reappearance when third to Darjina and Finsceal Beo in the French 1,000 Guineas at Longchamp on May 13, and Sander Camillo who was a top two-year-old before disappointing so far this year.

Sir Michael Stoute's three BGC Sussex Stakes triumphs came courtesy of Sonic Lady (1986), Zilzal (1989) and Among Men (1998). His four possible contenders this year are headed by Echelon, last seen edging home from Bahia Breeze in the Group Three Princess Elizabeth Stakes at Epsom on June 1, with John Gosden's Nannina back in third.

Jeremy, who took the Group Two Betfred Mile at Sandown in April. Home Affairs, not seen since an unlucky third in last year's Diomed Stakes at Epsom, and talented front-running filly Wasseema are the Freemason Lodge handler's other entries.

Dark Islander, trained by John Hills, has yet to score above handicap company in Britain, however he made an impressive debut in America when landing the Grade Two Oak Tree Derby at Santa Anita in October.

Rod Fabricius, Managing Director of Goodwood Racecourse, said: The BGC Sussex Stakes is undoubtedly one of the highlights of the Flat season, and we are delighted with the quality of this year's entry. "It would be wonderful to see Finsceal Beo take on George Washington and company at Goodwood on August 1 and, with South African raider Asiatic Boy adding extra spice, it is sure to be a fantastic race."

Profile Of Epsom Derby Winning Owners

Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar are Kuwaiti businessmen whose dark green colours have become increasingly conspicuous in recent times. Prior to their great win with Authorised in the recent Vodafone Derby their biggest successes came when the Jeremy Noseda-trained Araafa raced to victory in the 2006 Irish 2,000 Guineas and the St James's Palace Stakes at Royal Ascot. Their annus mirabilis was capped with Authorized's victory in the Group One Racing Post Trophy, while further big-race success in 2006 came courtesy of Hamoody in the Group Two Richmond Stakes at Goodwood. Al Homaizi, chairman of the multifaceted Al Homaizi Group, which employs 4,000 people, was introduced to European racing by Prince Yazid Saud, with whom he owned 1984 Cambridgeshire winner Leysh as well as Ile de Nisky, fourth to Nashwan in the 1989 Vodafone Derby. He also part-owned 1993 Irish 1,000 Guineas third Goodnight Kiss and the multiple Group Three winner Tropical. He owns Al Fanaar Stables in Kuwait. Al Sagar is chairman of the Kuwaiti shipbuilding and engineering company HEISCO and also has interests in the publishing and electronics industries. Al Homaizi and Al Sagar employ the services of Tony Nerses as their bloodstock advisor and he purchased eight yearlings for the pair at Keeneland in 2006. They have most of their 17 horses in training with Jeremy Noseda, Peter Chapple-Hyam and Brian Meehan in Britain, and Patrick Biancone in the US. Authorised was the first ever Epsom Derby runner.

Profile of Epsom Derby Winning Trainer

Born April 2, 1963, in Learnington Spa, Peter Chapple-Hyam gained valuable experience working for Barry Hills, Fred Rimell and Lynda Ramsden before taking over the trainer's licence from Hills at the late Robert Sangster's Manton complex in 1991. With Sangster as his main patron, Chapple-Hyam hit the ground running, securing major two-yearold Group One victories in his first season, with Dr Devious winning the Dewhurst Stakes and the brilliant Rodrigo de Triano the Middle Park Stakes. The following year brought Vodafone Derby glory as he prepared Dr Devious to run seventh in the Kentucky Derby before taking the Epsom Classic by two lengths. Rodrigo de Triano meanwhile gave Lester Piggott his 30th and final Classic win in the 2,000 Guineas and added a further three Group One successes that term - Irish 2,000 Guineas, Juddmonte International and Champion Stakes. Group One glory continued with the likes of top-class 1993 Italian Derby winner White Muzzle, Turtle Island and Spectrum, winners of the 1994 & 1995 Irish 2,000 Guineas respectively, Revoque, successful in the Prix de la Salamandre and Grand Criterium in 1996, the filly Carmine Lake, victorious in the 1997 Prix de l'Abbaye and 1998 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Victory Note. Seeking a new challenge, he moved to Hong Kong in 1999 but found success hard to come by in the former British colony and returned to Britain ahead of the 2004 Flat season with a point to prove. With his string based at St Gatien Stables in Newmarket, Chapple-Hyam immediately silenced any doubters as he improved the three-year-old African Dream from lowly all-weather claiming class to four straight wins that included a brace of Group Three classic trials. Further big-race success followed that year as Captain Hurricane took the Group Two July Stakes at Newmarket and Montgomery's Arch the Group Two Richmond Stakes at Goodwood. Memories of the glory days of the 1990s were rekindled in 2006 as he saddled the top-class juvenile Dutch Art to four straight wins that included a brace of Group Ones (Prix Morny and Middle Park Stakes), while Authorized collected the Group One Racing Post Trophy, a race the trainer won in 1998 with Commander Collins. Authorised trained on really well as a three year old taking the Dante Stakes at York while he produced a top notch performance to capture the 2007 Epsom Derby .In 2005, Peter Chapple Hyam separated from his wife Jane (now a fellow Newmarket trainer), daughter of Robert Sangster's second wife, Susan.

Profile of Epsom Derby Winning Rider Frankie Dettori

Born in Milan on December 15, 1970, the son of Gianfranco, a multiple champion jockey in Italy, Frankie Dettori arrived from his homeland to join Luca Cumani's Newmarket yard as an apprentice in July, 1985. His first success came on Rif at Turin, Italy, on November 16, 1986, and he rode his first British winner on Lizzy Hare at Goodwood on June 9, 1987. He was champion British apprentice in 1989 and passed 100 winners for the first time in 1990 when recording 141 successes. He has since captured the hearts of racegoers with his flamboyant style, phenomenal riding successes, and charisma in and out of the saddle. Champion jockey in 1994, 1995 and 2004, Dettori created history when riding all seven winners on the first-day card at the Ascot Festival in September 1996.

His ground-breaking exertions brought recognition beyond racings own sphere when he was voted into third place in the 1996 BBC Sports Personality of the Year Awards and was a team captain on A Question Of Sport. Victory in the 2007 Vodafone Derby on Authorised means that he has tasted success in all five domestic Classics at least once (with 12 in total), as well as a host of high-profile international successes, including the 1995 and 2002 Arcs on Lammtarra and Marienbard respectively, the Japan Cup on Singspiel in 1996, Falbrav in 2002 and Alkaased in 2005, the Dubai World Cup on Dubai Millennium (2000), Moon Ballad (2003) and Electrocutionist (2006) and the Breeders Cup Turf on Daylami in 1999, Fantastic Light in 2001 and Red Rocks in 2006. For good measure Frankie also captured the 2007 French Derby on Lawman while last Sunday yielded a French Oaks success aboard West Wind.

Dettori, who is retained by the Godolphin team, survived an horrific plane crash at Newmarket in 2000 in which the pilot was killed. He is married to Catherine with five children, and his autobiography came out



Finance

County treasurer Michael Hogan in his monthly report told delegates that the revenue raised from the racehorse raffle at Bohadoon three weeks ago amounted to €137,000. He said that 137 tickets had been sold at €1000 each. He said it was an outstanding success because of the wonderful work done by the fund raising committee who left no stone unturned in making this the most successful venture of its kind ever undertaken by a sub committee.

He said that the recent golf classic held at the Waterford Golf club was also a great success. The revenue for this is not finalised and will be announced at the next meeting.

CENTRAL COUNCIL REPORT

Central Council delegate S. O'Brien reported that the revenue from the national hurling league showed a 70% increase and that Waterford who won the title will receive a record sum of €161,000. This is the highest amount ever received by a county from National hurling league revenue.

He further reported that the revenue from the national football league also showed a huge increase due mainly to the full house attendance at the Tyrone v Dublin game at Croke Park. Waterfords share of the National football league will be slightly in excess of €40,000 and both these monies will be paid to County Boards before the end of June.







Quay Should Be Pedestrianised For Activities - CLLR. MANSFIELD

PEDESTRIANISATION SHOULD GET AWAY FROM DRINK CULTURE

By Kevin Kirrane

Davitts Quay should be pedestrianised for social activities during the day, and not be mixed up with the drink culture, according to one local town councillor.

Sinn Fein councillor, Brendan Mansfield, a supporter of pedestrianisation, said the quay should be pedestrianised for social events such as the upcoming Daft Raft Race, and not be confused with an excuse to drinking outdoors.

The Gardai scotched plans to pedestrianise the quay over the August Bank Holiday weekend, due to fears of anti-social behaviour. A meeting was held in committee between the Gardai and the town council, but despite the scrapping of the plans, Cllr. Mansfield said some positives did come out of the meeting.

"One of the big problems on the quay at the moment is the parking," the Sinn Fein councillor said.

there, and nobody parks there during the week and yet if you go down to the quay on a Friday night, Saturday night, Sunday night it's very hard to drive up and down there because of the

vehicles parked illegally on double yellow lines.

"So the whole area of enforcing has to be looked at.

"But something that came out of that meeting was that there was nobody against pedestrianising the quay for a set period of time, be it from 4 o'clock to 6 o'clock and having some kind of activity there. Because the whole pedestrianisation of the quay got swept into a kind of idea that it was only being pedestrianised for drinking.

"I don't think that was ever the intention of any councillor. It was certainly never my intention. I supported it to attract visitors and locals down onto the quay.

"After all, the quay is a great amenity when the tides in.

"For example, there's a Daft Raft Race on there in a few weeks for the RNLI. There'll be big crowds down there that day for activities like that the quay should be pedestrianised.


