## Nursing Home Quash Rumours Over Future

### GOLDEN MEADOWS MANAGEMENT COMMITTED TO LONG TERM

Golden Meadows Nursing Home and Retirement Village, built two years ago by the Clonakilty-based developer, Dan Lordan, in a multi-million euro deal, have quashed widely circulating rumours over the future of the home.

The new management team at the helm of the nursing home, appointed within the last month, have given their long-term commitment towards the care of their residents.

Speaking to the Dungarvan Leader, Manager, Linda Gill acknowledged that there have been a number of issues surrounding the operation of the nursing home.

#### RUMOURS

"There are rumours out in Dungarvan that we're to be sold, and that we're to be made into a hotel which obviously causes concern for our residents. What I want to get out to the public is that we're here to stay. We are under new management and we're committed to a future for Golden Meadows," she said.

"We obviously also have got apartments and bungalows for people of retirement age. The rumours are that we're going to let all our apartments and bungalows to people other than retirees.

#### RETIREES

"The general public think that we're only here for people over 65 years. This is not the case. They are also for people retired at 55 or older. What we're trying to do is all about dispelling the rumours and getting things put straight."

Ms. Gill, who took over management of Gold-

en Meadows five weeks ago, is originally from the UK and has worked in elder care for the past twenty-three years, starting as a carer and working her way up in management where she has gained 14 years experience of managing retirement villages.

Together with Ms. Gill, a new Director of Nursing, Gillian Nuttall has been appointed. Ms. Nuttall has a wealth of experience and qualifications in the health care sector with extensive training and experience in elder care.

#### COMMITTED TO LONG TERM FUTURE

The nursing home will remain a nursing home and retirement village regardless of ownership, the management team says.

In a recent announcement, the Minister for Environment & Local Government Mr. John Gormley TD has confirmed a €272,000 package for Ring water supply.

According to the announcement, work is expected to start on overhauling the Ring scheme in 1998.

Cllr. Ó Céilleachair, who has long campaigned for the upgrading of what he claims is an aged and deficient water supply in the Ring locality, has written to the Department and the local authority to seek clarification on the extent of works envisaged and timeframes for delivery.

Cllr. Ó Céilleachair says the quality and quantity of water supply has been an issue for some 30 years in the community and he wants assurances that the situation is going to be corrected for once and for all.

"There are previously stated commitments to effect a new supply infrastructure for both Ring and Old Parish. The quality of Ring's water supply is a constant matter of contention, with problems emerging in Old Parish in more recent years.

"I've been making representations on the issue since 1997, and have had various correspondence in return, which refer to a range of surveys, reports and plans - in-

cluding the most recent move to examine the possibility of linking to a supply source in Ardmore (which I hope would also benefit Old Parish)."

He said a Senior Engineer, acknowledged to him in 2005 that there has and continues to be problems in relation to both quantity and quality of water. But despite this, Cllr. Ó Céilleachair claims that Waterford County Council has approved an "extraordinary" level of development in Ring.

"The local community needs to know the details behind the latest announcement", he went on to say.





## Results of Gaeltacht na nDéise Survey Launched

Results cause for optimism according to Udarás na Gaeltachta Chief Executive. The fact that the Irish language is still alive in the small Co Waterford Gaeltacht of An Rinn/An Sean Phobal is a cause for pride and optimism according to Udarás na Gaeltachta Chief Executive, Pádraig Ó hAoláin. Mr. Ó hAoláin was speaking at an event in Halla Colmáin in An Sean Phobal last night (Tuesday 25 September), where he launched the results of the Gaeltacht na nDéise survey. The survey, which was commissioned by Comhlacht

Forbartha na Gaeltachta, was carried out last year with support from Udarás na Gaeltachta. The research, which was undertaken in April and May 2006, focused on four different areas. These included, the current state of the Irish language in Gaeltacht na nDéise, Child Care services in the area, qualifications and work experience of the Gaeltacht na nDéise community, and the housing needs in An Rinn and An Sean Phobal. Representatives from Cork Institute of Technology, who collated the data, presented the results and a report of the

findings to the local community at last night's launch. While the results present a number of challenges for this small Co. Waterford Gaeltacht (particularly in relation to the Irish language, employment, childcare and education), they are also cause for optimism and inspiration for the local community, according to Pádraig Ó hAoláin. One of the most interesting figures shown was that almost 97% of the Gaeltacht population filled in the questionnaires and of those, a massive 97.7% felt that Gaeltacht na nDéise should keep its Gaeltacht status.

The results of the survey have now been published in the form of a report, which included a set of Overall Recommendations. The challenge for the locals now is to draw up a development plan based on these recommendations and to act upon it in the best interests of the future of the area. Speaking at the launch, the Chairman of Comhlacht Forbartha na Gaeltachta, Tadhg Ó Maoileoin said that the people of Gaeltacht na nDéise possessed a valuable asset and they were now faced with difficult work ahead in order to protect and cultivate the language and the area. He said the the results of the survey would serve as a road map to guide the Gaeltacht community and the state agencies in the right direction.

Mr Ó Maoileoin thanked all those who helped to draft and organise the collection of the data, including Udarás na Gaeltachta, Cork Institute of Technology, Meitheal Forbartha na Gaeltachta, Coiste Chúram Leanaí an tSean Phobail, the enumerators and the people of An Rinn and an Sean Phobal.

The Higher Diploma in Television Production is run by Nemeton in conjunction with WIT. There are no fees for the course as it is supported financially by Udarás na Gaeltachta. # Cllr. Doocey Welcomes Planned Student Grant Reforms

Education Minister, Mary Hanafin's plans to introduce reforms that would transfer the handling of all college grants to Vocational Education Committees, has been welcomed by the Chairman of County Waterford VEC, Fine Gael councillor, Declan Doocey.

The VEC's handle about two-thirds of the 60,000 applications for maintenance grants, but will take over the remainder from local council's when the Student Support bill is passed. Ms. Hanafin first announced the selection of VEC's to run the schemes in June last year, and planned to introduce the necessary laws in time for students applying for grants this summer. The statutory scheme will mean each VEC must process applications by a target date every year.

But work on the bill to facilitate the changes has been ongoing for more than a year, while plans to publish it before the election were unsuccessful. The Minister said she now hopes to introduce the bill in the Dail before Christmas, but she was unable to guarantee the reforms would be in place for students applying for grants next summer. "This is my intention; once the legislation is passed there'll be no

delay in doing it", she said. Meanwhile, Cllr. Doocey is also calling on the Department and CIE to reform the school catchment boundaries for school transport. The boundaries have been unchanged for the past 40 years and are outdated, he said. The boundaries need to be changed for the benefit of students, parents and schools in West and Mid-Waterford, Cllr. Doocey went on to say.



# New Footpath Planned Outside Waltons Park

Sinn Fein Cllr Brendan Mansfield has confirmed that a new footpath outside Walton's Park will be put in place.

He said he has received numerous inquiries from local walkers and runners as to why the footpath outside the playground in Abbeyside as far as the bridge on the bypass has been closed off.

"A lot of locals have concerns

that this section of path will not be reopened," he told the Dungarvan Leader.

### FLOODING

"I wish to state that this path will be replaced. It has been closed off to alter its route. As locals will know only too well, the section between the roundabout and the bridge - because of its low level - was prone to flooding.

"As part of the redesign of Walton's Park it has been to

decided to alter the route of the footpath and bring it through the park. I welcome this decision, as the old section was nothing short of a mess on wet days.

### CONCERNS

"While I would have concerns about the length of time the redesign of Walton Park is taking, I feel it will be worth it in the long term.

"On a recent visit to the site with the Town Clerk, Mr. Joe O'Flaherty I was amazed at the openness of the Park when you are inside it. When I was first elected to the Council, one of the first issues I raised was the anti

social behaviour taking place in the Park. I placed a motion before the Council calling on them to remove the hedging along the Causeway, as one of the main issues in policing the Park was the lack of ability to see into it.

### COMMUNITY AMENITY

"I feel that when it finally reopens the new well lit Park will become the community orientated amenity it should have always been, after all the best way to ensure that there is no anti social behaviour there is to have the local community using it," Cllr. Mansfield went on to say.

# IDA Have Forgotten Dungarvan

## No Site Visits For 12 Months Despite Closures

Fine Gael Town Councillor, Micheál Cosgrove has criticised the IDA for failing to make any site visits to Dungarvan over the last twelve months.

This information has recently been furnished to John Deasy T.D. in response to a Dail question to Minister for Enterprise and Employment Micheál Martin T.D.

"How are we to attract investment to Dungarvan if the IDA considers that Dungarvan is not even worthy of a site visit?" Cllr. Cosgrove asked.

### FAILURE

"Considering that we have two Government TD's, one a Minister in the Constituency, this is a failure on their part to the people of this constituency.

"While we have many local, commendable initiatives in the county, such as Business

conferences, websites etc. to attract investment, all this is in vain if the body responsible for attracting investment to the country fails to consider Dungarvan worthy of a site visit.

### NO SIGNIFICANT INVESTMENT

"Dungarvan has not had any significant investment in recent years. Since the closure of the Waterford Crystal plant the industrial base of Dungarvan has been weakened. What has been the positive outcome of the task force set up in the aftermath of the closure of the Glass Factory?"

"With the ongoing downturn in the economy, Dungarvan needs a strengthened Industrial Base. We have excellent sites in Dungarvan fully serviced with all the modern methods of communication. Yet the IDA do not consider us even worthy of a site visit," Cllr. Cosgrove said.

# WRH To Be Made 'Specialist Centre'

The range of cancer care service available in Waterford is set to expand significantly after the Waterford Regional Hospital was designated one of eight specialist cancer centres in the country.

WRH will provide treatment for all forms of cancer, including breast cancer, involving diagnostic, surgical, medical and radiation oncology services under the plan.

The announcement was given a broad welcome by local representatives.

Fianna Fail Minister, Martin Cullen said: "This decision is about best patient care and I am delighted that Waterford Regional Hospital will deliver and lead the delivery of care in this area.

"This is a tried model for cancer care in that cancer control networks in other countries are organised around similar population sizes like the one we have in the South East. "This will enable full advantage to be taken of the resources available to ensure the delivery of services to the people of the South East that are of the highest quality and are equitable and accessible. Cancer patients and their families deserve nothing less," Minister Cullen said.

Deputy Brendan Kennelly, meanwhile, said under the plan they were now focusing resources where they're needed most in modern medical care.

## VIEWPOINT

### NATIONWIDE FOCUSES ON DUNGARVAN

Dungarvan has featured on television quite a few times over the years – but more often than not for entirely negative reasons. In the last ten years alone, the television cameras have descended on our town on numerous occasions to report on job loss after job loss.

It's welcome indeed then that RTE's popular countrywide magazine show, *Nationwide*, chose to concentrate on the positive side of life in Dungarvan.

Often everything has not been so rosy.

As former Irish Examiner journalist, John A Murphy – one of the foremost documenters of the towns highs and lows in print over the last four decades – said when talking about the economic changes of the past decade, over 1,000 jobs have been lost in key manufacturing sectors because of the devastating demise of Waterford Foods through amalgamation, and the closure of Dungarvan Crystal.

But Dungarvan has proved ultra-resilient, positioning itself as a service industry hub, with, as Darragh Connolly of Dungarvan Chamber of Commerce pointed out, over 350 jobs being created in Dungarvan Shopping Centre alone.

GSK and Century Homes have also become key employers, along with hundreds of other smaller, but no less vital enterprises.

Dungarvan has transformed itself, thanks to good planning from the council, Government incentives, and the business community's readiness to develop and create new ventures and directions for the town.

Tourism is one of those new directions – possibly over time it will be the most important. And anyone looking at the television pictures of Dungarvan, the seascapes, the mountain views, or indeed our impressive mix of old and new buildings, from the castle entrance and the courthouse to the shopping centre and Civic Offices, couldn't help but be impressed by the beauty of Dungarvan.

Hopefully, this twenty-five minute *Nationwide* special will help spark even more interest among visitors who will come and stay in one of our hotels, play on our golf courses, visit our impressive beaches, walk, shop or engage in any other aspect of life in the town and the surrounding area and aid the work already well underway by the tourism, business and leisure interests in making Dungarvan central in visitors plans when visiting the South East.

### SWIMMING POOL PROPOSAL MAKES A SPLASH

A motion by two Fine Gael Lismore town councillors to explore the possibility of developing a swimming pool in the historic West Waterford town is certainly making a splash.

Cllr. John Heneghan and Cllr. Orla Russell, both seen by the local press core (whatever that counts for), as being among the most eloquent and hardest workers on the current council, are expected to put forward the proposal at a future meeting of the town council.

But, the question most are now asking is, is this really a runner.

It's a question Cllr. Heneghan was keen to face head-on, mentioning at the time his own reservations when he first heard the idea from an unnamed Welsh lady who apparently has some experience in the field of developing municipal swimming pools.

He said large Government grants are available for the development of swimming pools, and he foresaw the main stumbling block as being operating costs.

But quite simply, in Viewpoints humble opinion, the operating costs alone will be enough to drown the proposal at birth.

Even within the Fine Gael party there's been some rumbling about the motions very ambitiousness. One Fine Gaeler, speaking to Viewpoint, lashed the proposal as ridiculous and said he couldn't believe his eyes when he saw the motion on the front page of this newspaper some weeks ago.

We will learn more in the coming months about whether this is just another pie in the sky proposal, or a realistic endeavour that will overcome genuine disbelief.

### ERIE DELEGATION A WELCOME INITIATIVE

Viewpoint is already after nailing his colours to the mast on this one, and he is not about to row back on it – the Erie trip was a welcome initiative.

Some have – unfairly – branded the trip as another junket lumping it in with Waterford County Council's annual excursion to New York.

But Viewpoint honestly doesn't believe that to be the case, and maybe he is being naïve, but he believes the bone fides of those that went on this trip.

Certainly the merits of it have been somewhat overblown in the rush to justify – Erie after all has several twinning arrangements with other towns around the world – and while the cost of sending the councillors themselves apparently came out of their conference expenses, one wonders how the other four or five members of the delegation who didn't have this mechanism to draw from paid for their trip. That's a minor quibble, however.

The main beneficiaries of the Erie trip will be St. Augustines College. Over the years, many St. Augustines students have gone on to study at Mercyhurst College.

However, this link was somewhat broken in recent years, and it is certainly welcome that it now looks like being renewed again. Other links will be forged including in the economic, maritime and tourism fields. It's all about packaging Dungarvan as a worthwhile product, and Viewpoint thinks that this trip was another step in the right direction along that road.



### LIZARDS

There are about 3,750 species of lizard ranging in length from small geckos just a few millimetres long, to the Salvadori monitor of Papua New Guinea, which can be up to 4.75m (15ft 7in) in length. Lizards are found in most parts of the world. Many live in deserts but some live near water, and are excellent swimmers. Most lizards have legs, but there are some that have no legs and look like snakes.

#### Skinks Are The Commonest Lizards

With some 600 different species, skinks are the commonest of all lizards in the world. Most skinks are found in tropical Africa and Asia, although there are others to be found in Australia, Europe and North and South America.

#### Lizards' Tails Can Grow Again

If a predator grabs a lizard by its tail, the tail snaps off and the lizard makes its escape. A new tail grows in the old one's place.

#### Lizards Perform Tricks

The chameleon can change its colour to merge with its surroundings. The gecko has special pads on its feet which enable it to walk up walls and even upside-down on ceilings. Some lizards, such as the flying dragon of South-east Asia, appear to be able to fly.

The flying dragon does not really fly but it can glide for 20m (66ft) or more to escape danger.

It has a flap of loose skin on each side of its body, which can be opened out to form a pair of 'wings'.

#### Lizards Can Run On Tiptoe

Several lizards can raise themselves up on their hind legs to


run for short distances. The sand monitor, or goanna, of Australia can run so fast on its toes that it is nicknamed the racehorse goanna. The basilisk lizard of South America can even run across the surface of water for short distances, at a top speed of around 8kph (5mph), to escape from predators.

#### A Lizard Can Have A Ruff

The frilled lizard of Australia and New Guinea runs always on its hind legs when threatened. If is cornered, it raises a large ruff around its neck to make it look bigger. Then it opens its mouth wide and hisses to make it appear frightening. The bearded lizard not only has a ruff, it also has a collar of scales at the sides of its throat which stand out when the lizard opens its mouth. It does this when frightened, turning bright yellow with orange bands.


### Mí na Meala




## Eminent Cancer Surgeon Concerned At Not Being Replaced

A former breast cancer surgeon at Waterford Regional Hospital says he is concerned at not being replaced.

Gordon Watson retired in April and is yet to be replaced by a full time consultant prompting Waterford County Council to adopt a motion on the issue.

Dr. Watson says there is a legitimate reason for concern.

"It was certainly my intention when I retired that while I would be replaced temporarily by a locum surgeon and that very quickly my job would be advertised, and I would be replaced by consultant surgeon in breast cancer surgery," he told WLRfm.

"To my knowledge that hasn't happened and as such I remain concerned. I'm concerned for my patients and their continuity of

care which I believe is very important for cancer patients in general and I'm concerned for the people of Waterford if my job is not replaced completely."

Meanwhile, Dr. Watson said the delay to the National Radiotherapy Plan is unacceptable. The HSE has confirmed that a satellite unit to Waterford will be delayed by at least three years.

Dr. Watson who sat on the Hollywood Commission three years ago said the delay is a big worry.

"It's a great shame that recently it has been announced that we won't really see these types of development until 2013 or 2015. That's really not good enough because the incidences of cancer are expected to double by 2020.

"If that is so, we're really going to be playing catch-up."



## EMERALD FINANCIAL CORNER

#### Question:

I am trying to get on the property ladder, but feel property is too expensive. Is the affordable housing Scheme a good option for me?

#### Answer:

First Time Buyers can't catch a break at the moment, with huge house inflation over the past few years, many first time buyers may find they cannot get on the property ladder. Affordable housing is therefore an option for those who didn't contemplate it before.

Affordable homes are definitely not for people out for a quick buck. You'll lose the discount you got on your new home if you sell within 10 years.

To get an affordable home, you have to meet a few conditions. You have to show evidence of earnings, usually your last three pay slips, and evidence of any savings you may have. You'll also have to put up three per cent of the total cost. Once you get approval from your local authority, you have it for one year.

There is a good chance, but no guarantee, that you'll be allocated an affordable home within that time.

You will also have to get a Mortgage. Once you're deemed eligible by the local authority, your given a 'Confirmation for Lender' certificate, which you can use to get a mortgage from a bank or building society.

Once the property is found, there's also legal work to be done to make sure there are no complications. All this work, and the mortgage approval process, usually takes six weeks.

The main point to consider when contemplating the affordable housing option is the claw back of your discount if you sell your home. For example, if a couple pay €196,000 for a €280,000 home (i.e. 30% Discount) and then sell it a year later for €330,000, they would seemingly be making a profit of €134,000.

However, they would have to pay back 30 per cent of the new purchase price, in this case €99,000.

After 10 years, the amount you have to pay back is worked out by taking the percentage discount and decreasing it by 10 per cent a year. In other words, sellers who got 30 per cent discount would have to pay back 27 per cent of the price of their home after 11 years, 24 per cent after 12 years and so on.

After 20 years the home can be sold without refunding any money.

Well-known storyteller, Eddie Lenihan will be coming from County Clare to speak on fairies and the otherworld ('Síoga & an Saol Eile') and he will also be telling some ghost and fairy stories

Local singer Ciarán Ó Gealbháin will host a sean-nós singing session on the theme of "Roinnt Amhrán ón Sean Phobal" and Pádraig Seosamh Ó Mathúna will read from "Fíor Mhóra an tSean Phobail". ## Row Over Media Gagging Order

One of the Unions representing the workers at Waterford Regional Hospital says it will take very seriously any attempt to discipline members who speak to the media about a recruitment freeze.

Staff were told that speaking to the media was a breach of HSE policy which could result in disciplinary proceedings.

A number of staff spoke to members of the local media last week about the freeze.

However, Walter Cullen of the ATGWU said the threat is unacceptable.

"Our view is that this is an attempt by the HSE to gag workers in the hospital and our members from speaking to the media about what's happening in there," he told WLRfm.

"I would advise the HSE to proceed very cautiously in any attempt to discipline any of our members because we will resist that."

"If any of our members are disciplined as a result of the order there will be serious repercussions for industrial relations."

The HSE said there is a communications protocol in place and it's a requirement of all hospital employees to comply with it.



### Heritage Notes

The Heritage Group has had a number of meetings in recent weeks, with work on both the finalisation of the heritage trail and our next publication making good progress. We are working on costing a brace of new projects but will give more details on these if and when they become a reality. In the meantime, a brief update on the two main areas of work at present.

We have one more book meeting before everything is finalised and, by mid October, things will move on to the printers, for formatting of pages etc. The book, coming in time for Christmas, will focus on the educational history of the area along the bend of the Blackwater, with close to 250 pictures to be included. The publication will include scenes from secondary school life in Melleray, St. Anne's and Cappoquin Vocational School, as well as groups from as many of the primary schools as we could gather, southwards as far as Aghlish. The team working on this project deserves the highest of praise, not least because the total number of names to be identified in the photographs could well run to over 4,000 by the end. The title is being kept under wraps at the moment but be assured that this will be a very useful Christmas present for anyone who ever went to school in the area. Keep in mind also that, while we have nearly 170 non-school pictures in the bank for another publication after the school one,

probably for Christmas 2008 all going well, it would still be great to get more photographs of local life if anyone has some to offer. Kevin McCarthy (Barrack Street) of Cara McGrath (Credit Union) would be glad to take them in.

The main maps for the heritage trail are being finalised this week, and should go on display in the Credit Union window by the weekend, all going well. All of the lecterns and noticeboards have been made at this stage, with some woodwork and perspex fitting to be done in the coming days. The lecterns and notice boards will be erected around the town and then painted, with a colour scheme of charcoal grey, with royal blue and white being employed on the display areas themselves. The Co. Council work team is busy at present in the renewal of the Monument at the eastern edge of the town, for which they deserve much thanks. One of our heritage trail lecterns will be going there, giving an outline of the history of the site over the years. Once the work there is completed, the Council will soon be in a position to install the remaining stone plaques, lecterns and noticeboards for the heritage trail. It is impossible to put an exact timeframe on this but we anticipate everything being done by November.

## FIRE SAFETY WEEK

### What is Fire Safety Week?

Fire Safety Week runs from the 1st to the 7th of October this year jointly throughout Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. It is the time of year when all the Fire and Rescue Services highlight the importance of Fire Safety within our communities.

### What can we the members of the public do about Fire Safety?

Well the latest statistics show that there were over 10,700 fires in our homes throughout the whole island of Ireland which unfortunately lead to the death of 49 people. They also showed that 20% of homes did not have a fire alarm of any type.

From this the Fire and Rescue Services are obviously encouraging people to ensure that they have working fire alarms in their homes.

People can do this by making sure that they are properly positioned in their home, testing them once a month by pushing the test button and changing the battery once a year.

### Can the Fire and Rescue Service help?

Nationally there is a scheme being rolled out by Fire and Rescue Services together with the Local Authorities to install fire alarms in the homes occupied by vulnerable people within our community who are unable or cannot afford to install their own fire alarms.

### What about here in Waterford County?

Here in Waterford County we will be installing over a 1000 fire alarms without charge to homes occupied by these vulnerable members of our community. Therefore we are looking to hear from volunteer groups within Waterford County who would be interested in identifying these households and being trained to install these life saving devices.



It was on Saturday Morning that we all gathered in Glenshelane Scout Campsite & Cabin, Cappoquin, lets just say around eleven o'clock, so as not to embarrass anyone. The main function of today was to get everyone out in the fresh air and teach them some new skills and check on some skills they should have already.

When everyone had arrived it was straight down to some ropework and tying the 'Square Lashing' the scouts broke into smaller groups of twos and threes to practice tying the lashing, this was done very well by all. This lashing also includes the tying of two other knots, 'Figure of Eight' and the 'Clove Hitch'.

The Patrols then went about collecting some wood for making a fire to cook the foods they had brought with them 'Backwoods' style. Once each Patrol had gathered enough wood to cook the foods it was into the Cabin where the Patrols sat around at two tables getting their foods ready. Foods like Sausages, Rashers were just covered in tin foil, while the Potatoes were scored with a knife down the centre and again across. The apples were cored and filled with dried fruit and brown sugar before being wrapped in the tin foil, the pineapple was simple also just being wrapped in the tin foil. The interesting one was the Egg, for this a small hole was made in the top of the egg before being wrapped in the tin foil. The Scouts were shown how to best wrap the foods before it for themselves. For 'Backwoods Cooking' the fire must be down to hot embers and the tin foil parcels are left in the embers to cook, starting with what will take longest to cook, in this case the potatoes, and so on. The eggs being the last put in as they only take a few minutes to cook.

While Joe, Kevin and Brendan looked after the cooking, Muller organised a short walk for the rest of the Scouts. So Tony, Chris, Declan, Ben, Owen, Dylan, Conor, James, Conor, Sean & Ben headed off with Muller, Gearoid and Ciaran up to the tower. On the way back down to the Glen talk went to the various wildlife that can be found around the Glen Area. When Sean found a deer antler on the ground, which was brought back to be put on display in the Cabin.

Back in the Glen the food was ready to be tried. Everyone was pleasantly surprised by what they ate and how good it all tasted, as always when cooking with fire you can often get a kind of burnt taste from some of the foods especially those left to long in the heat. Your first clue that it may taste this way is by the fact that your food may be black and burnt looking!

After eating their packed lunch a quick tidy up was done, before a few games were played. 'Hide N'



### CLASHMORE TIDY TOWNS REPORT 2007

2007 marked the 40th Anniversary of Tidy Towns in Clashmore and we are glad to report that this years effort has once again given our small hard working committee some reward for our effort. However it's the same old story — lots done more to do!

This is what the judges had to say about our beautiful village this year.

### Over all Development Approach

It was a sunny Clashmore that greeted this adjudicator making a first visit to the centre. The village was busy on a Saturday afternoon with a high degree of passing traffic. The grotto dominates the corner at the village entrance and its high degree of landscaping reflects very favourably on the community. Like many towns and villages you are undergoing extensive development that will change the appearance of the village and present you with challenges and opportunities for improvement. Indeed new residents offer potential for more volunteers and research shows the Tidy Towns is an admirable vehicle for meeting people so don't miss the opportunity.

### The Built Environment

Building mentioned last year looked well and we have nominated Beresford for the shop front award. The Heritage Centre has been restored and looks well from the roadway. We were unable to gain access on the Saturday evening and there was no sight to indicate opening times, which seems a pity. The new terraced houses approaching completion opposite the Heritage Centre will enhance this approach and we hope the landscaping outlined by the advertising hoarding will be honoured when complete. We liked the Distillery chimneystack, which is, an important link with the industrial archaeology of the area. Perhaps you could erect an information plaque on the site.

### Landscaping

There is praiseworthy evidence of good landscaping carried out in recent years. Many premises were further enhanced with attractive hanging baskets and good colour schemes. As mentioned the grotto is commendable and very colourful on the focal location. Well done on your walking trails — we visited St Mochua Well and noticed some very poorly disciplined work being carried out on the entrance. The entrance is not visitor friendly because the boulders are preventing visitors from parking and forcing motorists to park on the roadside. We are puzzled at the treatment of the willow trees, are these being removed. The well itself would benefit from an information plaque. The Raheen River Walk is one of your most valuable amenity developments and will grow in importance as demand for its use increases.

### Wild life and Natural Amenities

You are fortunate to have the Raheen River so near the village and all of this area offers potential for raising your marks in the section. Your river walk should be well maintained to a high standard with good signage and further display boards if necessary featuring the wildlife area.

### Litter Control

In general litter control was good apart from a damaged litterbin near the bridge amenity area. Good litter control from all sections of the community is a vital part of Tidy Towns improvements.

### Waste Minimisation

This new category offers potential for raising marks in waste minimisation and should not be confused with litter control. The reduce, reuse and recycle dictum is all-important in this category. Once again we recommend you study the race against waste booklet which gives valuable hints on how to promote waste minimisation.

### Tidiness

Your problems here relate to untidy entrances and poorly kept boundary walls. The wooden sign on the approach from Youghal is obscured by shrub growth and needs attention. Long term you should remove the chain linking fencing opposite this sign as it belongs to a former era.

### Residential Areas


We would urge you to erect appropriate bilingual signs on the housing estates. The absence of some is of little help to the adjudicator especially if they have not been featured on your map submission. Housing estates were well presented and many individuals have very good attractive displays. The use of litter teams is commendable so well done to all concerned.

### Roads Streets and Back areas

Because of the layout of the village many rear and back entrances are quite visible from the principal streets and approach roads. We would urge owners of premises to ensure rear and side entrances are well maintained and presented.

### General Impression

The village has achieved much to date and the planned developments will further enhance your centre. Ideally you should formulate a 3 to 5-Year plan that will chart the way forward. When complete, your plan should then be put to the community for approval and implementation. We wish you well in the future.





## PROFILE OF JOHN GOSDEN-UK LEGER WINNING TRAINER

John Gosden was born on March 30, 1951, the son of respected trainer Towser Gosden. After Cambridge University, he served as assistant to Sir Noel Murless from 1974 to 1975 and Vincent O'Brien from 1976 to 1977, then embarked on what was to become a successful training career in America, winning the 1984 Breeders Cup Mile with Royal Heroine among other major wins.

In 1988 he took out his first licence in Britain and established himself as a leading trainer on these shores at Newmarket, having his best season in 1992 when he recorded 113 wins. Gosden has made a notable impression in the Vodafone Derby, filling two of the places in 1995, training subsequent St Leger winner Shantou to finish third in 1996 and then having a first success in the Classic courtesy of Benny The Dip in 1997. His third British Classic success was with Lahan in the 1000 Guineas at Newmarket in 2000, the first season that Gosden trained at the famous Manton Estate in Wiltshire. He was previously based at Newmarket in Stanley House Stables and returned to headquarters after the 2005 season and is now settled at Clarehaven Stables on the Bury Road. Other good horses to have been trained by Gosden include the high-class sprinter Oasis Dream, Irish Champion Stakes winner Muhtarram, Queen Elizabeth II Stakes victor Observatory, Prix Maurice de Gheest heroine May Ball, Golden Jubilee Stakes scorer Malhub, Coronation Stakes victor Nannina and Challenge Stakes winner Sleeping Indian. His list of owners among his stable of 130 horses includes Sheikh Mohammed, Hamdan Al Maktoum, the Sangster family, George Strawbridge, Highclere Thoroughbred Racing and Khalid Abdulla.

# O'Brien's Soldier can break Ballydoyle's Arc jinx

## THE FINAL FURLONG (IN ASSOCIATION WITH BETFAIR) WITH PHIL DELANEY

They have important things on their mind in France right now. Organising a Rugby World Cup and trying to win the bloody thing is understandably top of the agenda.

A sloppy first Pool game loss to Argentina hasn't helped their cause and now, as runners up, Le Frogs face the All-Blacks in Cardiff this week.

Most of the best bets in this tournament so far have been on the handicap, but at 17/1 with Betfair, they have a small interest on the holders to win the World Cup outright.

World Cup after World Cup, New Zealand look bombproof until the knockout stages come — and they haven't been tested yet with four hammerings in their Pool. Can we trust them again?

France, on the other hand, have shown dramatic improvement. They have the discipline in defence and the inventiveness going forward to trouble the odds-on favourites. Take the 17/1 to small money, if they were to beat the All-Blacks they'd be second favourites at around 9/4, and would be a certain lay-back.

But while the World Cup will come and go, thankfully, there will always be the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and on Sunday we have another fascinating renewal.

If there's a negative it is that injury has deprived us of seeing the potentially great Manduro take his place in the race.

But it stills promises to be a cracking race with one of the most impressive Derby winners of recent years — Authorized — bidding to win a fourth Arc for the charismatic Frankie Dettori.

We have opposed him three times this season and, accordingly, have been wrong twice! Credit where it is due: he has done little wrong, and his convincing victory over Dylan Thomas in the Juddmonte at York is as solid as form goes.

Stamina doubts were extinguished by his eye-catching five-length victory at Epsom in June and it's going to take a career best run from his rivals to lower the colours of Peter Chapple-Hyam's pride and joy.

Meanwhile here in Ireland, the Arc is a

race that Aidan O'Brien has never won and the Master of Ballydoyle loves nothing better than a challenge.

It's been this column's opinion since the Irish Derby in July that Solider of Fortune has been earmarked by O'Brien as his Arc horse for 2007.

His profile reminds me of former winners Sinndar and Sakhee, victorious in Paris in 2000 and 2001. Irish racing fans will remember Sinndar with fondness. A facile winner of the Irish Derby, John Oxx sent the son of Grand Lodge to Longchamp to win the Prix Niel, a recognised Arc trial, before taking the big prize in October of that year.

Sakhee (second to Sinndar in the Epsom Derby as a three year-old) was a similarly uncomplicated animal and hacked up in the Arc for Frankie Dettori.

Punters following the column's ante-post advice will be sitting on 8/1 on Solider of Fortune for Sunday's race and I think he has every chance of upsetting Authorized on Sunday, for a whole host of reasons.

With just one prep race since the Irish Derby (the aforementioned Prix Niel) he hasn't been over-raced by O'Brien and preparations for the race are, reportedly, spot on. He relishes a cut in the ground, something which seems assured at the weekend. He has already shown a liking for travelling abroad, having twice won in France, both times at Longchamp and once over course and distance.

There was a suggestion that Soldier of Fortune fretted a little before his races earlier in the season but, according to his trainer, with age has come maturity.

He showed a tremendous willingness in winning in France last time out on ground surely firmer than he would have liked and had another market rival, Zambesi Sun, held back in third.

Soldier of Fortune can confirm that form at the weekend and if he has improved enough — like we hope he has — to go stride for stride with Authorized in the drive for the line, O'Brien's wait for an Arc de Triomphe can end in glory.

# HURLING CHAMPIONSHIPS

## SPECIAL CONGRESS

The following decisions were taken at the Special Congress in Croke Park on Saturday last. This county was represented by county chairman, Pat Flynn and Seamus O'Brien.

That Rule 120 (B) for the organisation of the Inter County Adult Hurling Championship - not including Tier 2, Tier 3, Intermediate or Under 21 - as adopted by Comhdhail 2007 - be amended to read as follows:

(b) All-Ireland Senior Hurling Championship - Tier 1

The Championship shall be organised as follows:-

(1) Provincial Championships  
These Championships shall be played on a knock-Out Format. A "Round Robin" Competition may not be organised.

(2) The All-Ireland Championship Series shall be organised as set out hereunder:-

The Twelve Counties eligible to participate in the initial year (2008) shall be as follows:-

Dublin, Kilkenny, Laois, Offaly, Wexford, Clare, Cork, Limerick, Tipperary, Waterford Galway and Antrim.

Thereafter, the Promotion and Relegation Process, as outlined

in this Rule, shall apply.

All Ireland Hurling Qualifier Phase 1 - shall comprise of two Teams i.e. Galway and Antrim. Teams shall play off to determine pairings in Phase 2. Venue shall be on a Home or Away basis and a draw shall be made in the initial year (2008) to determine Home or Away venue with the first Team drawn in 2008 having Home venue in that year and Home Venue shall alternate on an annual basis from 2008 onwards. Should Antrim or Galway be replaced by another Team as a result of Relegation, their replacement shall take their place in the Home/Away Rota.

All Ireland Hurling Qualifier Phase 2 - shall comprise of the Winners and Losers of Phase 1 and the Teams defeated in the First Round of the Leinster and Munster Championships. Teams shall play on a Knock-Out Format i.e. Phase 1 Winner shall play the defeated Team in the First Round of the Leinster Championship and the Phase 1 Loser shall play defeated Team in the First Round of the Munster Championship. The Phase 2 Winners shall progress to Phase 4. Venues shall be on a

Home or Away basis and determined by a draw i.e. first Team drawn has Home Venue.

All Ireland Hurling Qualifier Phase 3 - shall comprise of four Teams i.e. the beaten Provincial Semi-Finalists in Leinster and Munster which shall play off on a Knock-Out Format i.e. a Munster Team shall play a Leinster Team and an Open Draw shall be made to determine the Pairings. Venues shall be on a Home or Away basis and determined by a draw i.e. first Team drawn shall have Home Venue.

All Ireland Hurling Qualifier Phase 4 - The Winners of Phase 2 shall compete against the Winners of Phase 3 - based on a Draw - on a Knock-Out Format i.e. A Phase 2 Winner shall play a Phase 3 Winner. (The Draw shall be structured to avoid repeat pairings, where feasible).

All Ireland Quarter-Finals - The defeated Provincial Finalists in Leinster and Munster shall compete on a Knock-Out Format-based on a Draw - against the Winners of Phase 4 i.e. The Munster defeated Finalist shall play a Phase 4 Winner and the defeated Leinster Finalist shall play a Phase 4

Winner. (The Draw shall be structured to avoid repeat pairings, where feasible).

All Ireland Semi-Finals - The Provincial Champions in Leinster shall compete on a Knock-Out Format against the beaten Provincial Finalists in Munster or the Team which beats them in Quarter-Finals and the Provincial Champions in Munster shall compete on a Knock-Out Format against the beaten Provincial Champions in Leinster or the Team which beats them in Quarter-Finals.

**Promotion/Relegation**  
The defeated Teams in Phase 2 of the Qualifier shall play off on a Knock-Out Format and the losing Team shall contest a Promotion/Relegation Play off with the Winners of the Christy Ring Cup. (This shall be a Home game for the Winners of the Christy Ring Cup).

Venues - Home Venues are subject to approval by the CCCC and must meet the criteria as set down by the National Safety and Infrastructure Committee.

Extra Time - Extra time if necessary shall be played in Phase 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the All Ireland Hurling Qualifier.

## All-Star Nominations

It is good news that Waterford have received a record total of nine nominations for the Vodafone Hurling All-Stars 2007.

Our previous record was eight nominations and out of which we received 3 awards.

Now with nine which represents 20% of the 45 players named for recognition this is as many as we could have hoped for. On the night we will be doing well to get 4 or maybe 5 awards.

Kilkenny, as expected lead the field with 11 nominations. Limerick got their biggest ever number (10), Waterford 9, Cork 7, Tipperary 3, Wexford 2, Galway 2 and Laois 1.

From a provincial perspective, the nominations go to show where Munster stands in the hurling charts as they command 29 nominations, with Leinster having 14 and Connacht just 2.

The actual winners will be announced on Wednesday October 17th just two days before the awards are presented.





# Abbeyside Hold Off Late Ardmore Challenge



control and scored 5 points without reply to leave only a goal between them in the 48 minute.




