## Progress Made On Conditions For Investment

### BUT IDA UNDER FIRE

Waterford County Council is making progress on putting the right conditions in place for inward investment with €700,000 so far raised for a new enterprise centre in Dungarvan, while 14 hectares of land have been zoned industrial in Monang along with a raft of other initiatives right around the county.

Speaking at the local authority's September meeting, Brian White said the council is also looking at how to develop significant landbanks in Lismore, Ardmore and Kilmactomas on a public-private partnership basis; is looking at stimulating the private sector; putting the right infrastructure in place; networking with the business community; supporting entrepreneurs and has succeeded in getting publicity focused on the county.

The comprehensive progress report came on the first anniversary of the Invest In Waterford initiative, which was set up at a seminar in Clonea and followed on from significant job losses with the closure of Dungarvan Crystal.

"We are making progress in creating a climate to induce investment in the county," Mr. White told the elected members. "We're constantly trying to put the message out there that this county is a good place for investment rather than just

being a rural county between two gateways (Waterford City and Cork City)."

Around four hundred and fifty jobs were lost with the closure of the Crystal plant at the Spring in Dungarvan a number of years ago. A task force was set up involving a number of agencies to re-train staff, and help them find new employment.

"Only twenty-two of the 450 migrated to long-term unemployment from Dungarvan Crystal," Mr. White claimed.

County Manager, Ray O'Dwyer praised the leadership shown by the elected members in making sometimes unpopular decisions in pursuit of putting the proper framework in place. (continued on page 8)

## Concerns Over Cappoquin Boathouse

### FEARS THAT HOUSING DEVELOPMENT WILL IMPACT ON ROWING CLUB

A Rowing Club, which has operated for two hundred years in Cappoquin, fears for its future after a nearby housing development was granted conditional planning permission by Waterford County Council.

Cappoquin Rowing Club, which operates from its popular Boathouse headquarters, fears the development of 4 two-storey townhouses over 4 single-storey apartments on the Lismore road,

Cappoquin will seriously impinge on their training water tank.

They also fear it will also have implications for what they claim are already limited car parking facilities.

A total of twenty conditions were attached to the grant of planning permission to Twigbog Ltd.

Speaking at the October meeting of Waterford County Council, Fianna Fail councillor, Kevin

Wilkinson said there is a "significant level of fear" among the rowing club that the development will have a serious impact on the boathouse.

"I would ask that the council would work together with the developer and the rowing club to minimise the impact of the development," Cllr. Wilkinson added.

The development is ultimately expected to be appealed to An Bord Pleanála in the coming weeks.

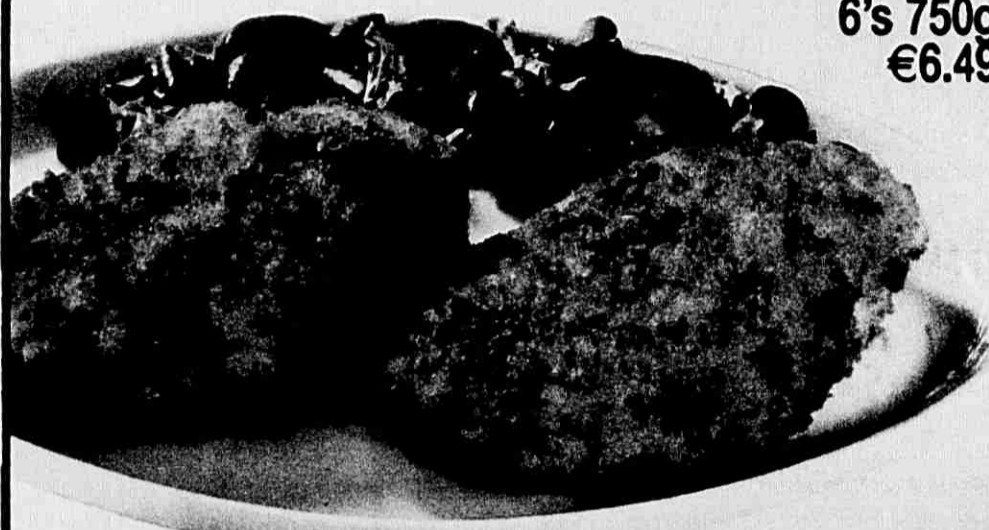

# HSE Clarifies Position Regarding Consultant Position at WRH

### REPLACEMENT BREAST SURGEON WILL BE IN PLACE IN A YEAR -HSE CLAIM

The Health Service Executive has claimed in statement issued to the local media that a replacement breast surgeon will be in place at Waterford Regional Hospital in around one years time.

The statement follows a motion put forward by Fine Gael councillor Mary Green at the September meeting of Waterford County Council calling for an appointment of a Breast Surgeon Consultant following the retirement in April of this year of

Gordon Watson.

In his reply to the motion, the HSE's Hospital Group South East Network Manager Richard Dooley has confirmed that the replacement process is underway. They said Mr. Watson's post has in fact been filled on a temporary basis, pending the permanent appointment of a Consultant Breast Surgeon to WRH.

The statement says, "The recruitment process and filling of a Consultant's post on a permanent basis can take a period of time to bring to a conclusion, due in part to prior contractual commitments on the part of successful candidates."

"The HSE expects that the replacement Breast Surgeon post will be in WRH on a permanent basis in approximately one years time."

Q: My boyfriend and I are first-time buyers

delighted with the removal of stamp duty and are busy house-hunting with a slightly higher budget. However a friend told us that the banks are now making it harder to take out a mortgage which would be a blow for us. Is it true and why?

A: The two issues are not related. The removal of stamp duty (backdated to March 31, 2007 for first-time buyers who have already bought) has created a financial breathing space for many people to help them to get on the property ladder. The stamp duty issue had been stagnating the market somewhat so the decision has been broadly welcomed.

Separately, the Financial Regulator is undertaking a review to see if it is appropriate that tougher 'stress test' apply to all borrowers. At present it is normal for lenders to factor in an extra 2pc rise in interest rate when assessing if borrowers can afford their new mortgage repayments.

The regulator is suggesting this might rise to 3 pc in light of increasing interest rates. The regulator has said that "stress testing is an important feature of good lending practice: and is resisting calls to relax it.

The result, if implemented, is that thousands of first-time buyers like yourselves may well find that the amounts they can borrow are reduced substantially, possibly wiping out the benefit of the stamp duty reforms.

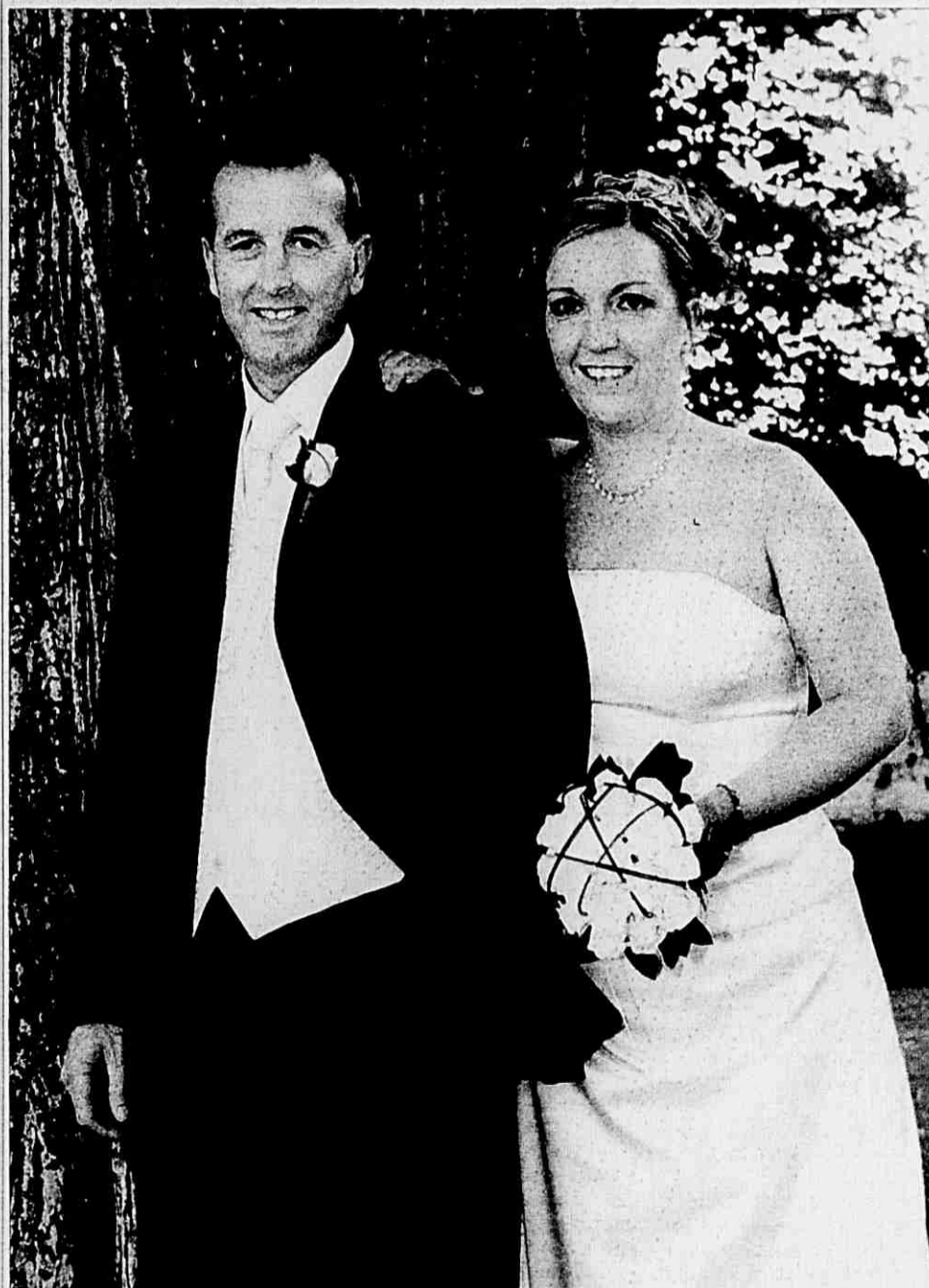

### BIO PIN FEARS

Concerns are mounting over the plans of German paint manufacturers, Bio Pin, whose plant on the IDA site at Clougherane in Dungarvan has been delayed for several years.

Now, the company has publicly announced a falling out with their Chinese partners, and are apparently struggling to find a suitable distribution market for their paint binding materials which, under their original plans, would have been developed in the town.

It comes as a double blow, sidling alongside last week's news that the IDA itself hasn't made a site visit to Dungarvan in the past year.

It's perhaps too strong to say all this is an indictment of the IDA's treatment of Dungarvan.

But it is at least a serious blow to the town's confidence in the agency.

Job losses have come quick, fast and heavy, and Dungarvan's local authority and Business Community have been left to pick up the pieces and do the best they can with a bad situation.

Virtually no help has been coming from the state bodies.

In fact, as far as Viewpoint can recall, Bio Pin was the only piece of good news on the jobs front emanating from the IDA over the past number of years. Count that against the 1,000 or so jobs lost in key industries like Waterford Crystal and Waterford Co-Op.

Apparently, the problems at Bio Pin started with a fall-out with their Chinese business partners after they enticed away one of the German company's leading laboratory workers, thus destroying the basis of co-operation between them.

"Due to this unforeseen development the demand for our binding agents dropped dramatically so that our Dungarvan plant is still on trial operation.

"At the moment," the Bio Pin spokesperson said, "we are fighting to find new markets for our products."

From these comments, it would appear that the chances of the company starting up in Dungarvan in the short term are distant, and we won't see new employment at the company on this side of 2007 at the very least.

Meanwhile, condemnation of the IDA's treatment of Dungarvan has come thick and fast. Indeed until the intervention of Mayor of Dungarvan, Cllr. Damien Geoghegan Dungarvan didn't so much as even warrant a profile on the IDA's website. When Cllr. Geoghegan pointed this out to IDA representatives at a meeting of the South East Regional Authority it took another FIVE MONTHS for a profile of Dungarvan to finally appear.

Contrast this to the excellent work of the county council, who through their Invest in Waterford Initiative and the Business Development Officer, Fergal Reidy are doing all in their power to improve the investment situation.

Without aid on a national scale, however, it's difficult to foresee any major business setting up in Dungarvan or indeed the county.

A concerted push from the IDA, together with the work already in place on the ground, is the only way forward if we are to see the ultimate goal of major new industry in Dungarvan.

## GOLDEN MEADOWS HERE TO STAY

Golden Meadows Nursing Home and Retirement Village was launched two years ago with the type of fanfare deserving of a multi-million euro development.

However, due to a lack of continuity of management personnel, a less than coherent message was emanating from within and without the walls of the art facility.

Following owner, Clonakilty based, Dan Lordan's decision to sell a similar facility of his in his hometown, and the sale of a piece of land fronting the nursing home to a developer, rumours throughout the town soon became fever pitched that the nursing home was about to be sold too, and changed to use as a hotel.

Even the village surrounding the home was the source of speculation, with rumours circulating widely that they were to be let to people other than retirees.

Understandably, this caused more than a bit of concern to residents, and family members, as well as to the staff themselves.

It was also off putting to people interested in retiring in the comfortable surroundings of Golden Meadows.

However, the new management of the nursing home are fully committed to a long term future, and issued a public statement assuring residents that it will stay a nursing home and retirement village, regardless of ownership.

This is certainly a welcome assurance for all concerned, and will hopefully put to bed wild and groundless speculation once and for all.

"You made some very significant decisions which will provide a long term benefit for the county," he added.

He said the plan sees each directorate of the council working on delivering key infrastructure and removing blocks to providing investment in the county. "With your support and advice," he told the elected members, "I have no doubt that we will continue down the right road".



Fine Gael councillor, Damien Geoghegan, while welcoming the progress report, hoped other public bodies would move to help promote Dungarvan and the county.

In particular, he said the IDA did not even see fit to include a profile of Dungarvan on their website although towns within a 30 mile radius including Clonmel, Youghal and Fermoy were all profiled.

He raised the matter with IDA representatives at a meeting of the South East Regional Authority but it took another 5 months before this was rectified.

The IDA has also been criticised in the past week for not making any site visits to Dungarvan in the last 12 months despite making 15 to Waterford City.

## Council Criticised For Advertising In National Papers

It may be de Paper, but Waterford County Council should have advertised an important variation of the County Development Plan in the local papers rather than in the Irish Examiner, according to Fianna Fail councillor, Pat Daly.

But, Cllr. Daly found this a "feeble" excuse, and said he could think of a number of areas where the council was wasting money, and said the fairness issue could be resolved by advertising by rota.

Mr. McCarthy said he will examine the issue in the future.

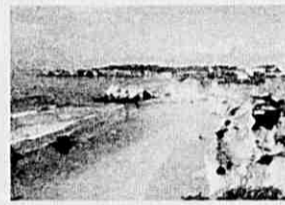

## THE PERFECT FLYING MACHINE

Birds are superbly built for flight. Their light, strong bodies give them the lift they need to fly. Even their feathers are designed to help them fly. Flying uses lots of energy, so birds spend much of their time eating to keep their energy level up. Birds' skeletons are all basically the same, one that is best adapted to the stresses of flying.



#### Birds Have Hollow Bones

A birds bones are light but strong. They are light because they are hollow. The larger bones are strengthened with a honey-comb of crossing struts, rather like the struts inside an aeroplane wing. A bird has about 175 different muscles, the biggest being those that work the wings. More than half of a bird's weight is in its muscles.

#### Flights Of Fancy

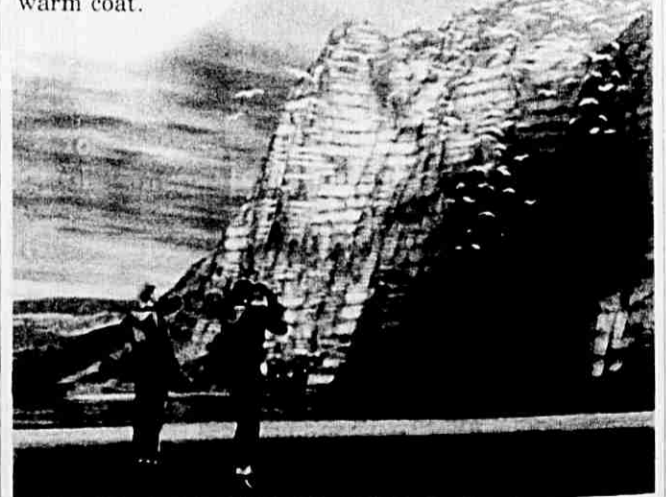
Wings are designed for different types of flight. An owl has especially soft wings to that its prey does not hear it approaching. Most sea birds have wings that are long and narrow, which are excellent for gliding. The wandering albatross has the largest wing span of any living bird. From tip to tip the average span is 3.15m (10ft 3in), which enables it to glide for long periods without flapping its wings.

#### Fastest And Slowest Fliers

Most small birds fly at about 30 to 50kph (20 to 30mph) but the fastest bird, the peregrine falcon, can reach 270kph (168mph) in a dive/ Ducks and geese are the fastest fliers in level flight with speeds of up to 104 kph (65mph). The slowest flying bird is probably the American woodcock which only achieves a top speed of 8 kph (5mph), which is roughly the same as an adult human walking briskly.

#### Feather Facts

The number of feathers on a bird varies at different times of the year and from species to species. Feathers get battered and worn by wind and rain, but luckily they are replaceable. This process is called moulting. In most birds the new feathers simply push out the old ones. Birds that live in very cold areas cannot afford to be without the insulation that feathers provide. Because of this, the old feathers are not discarded until the new ones are fully formed. The new feathers fuse themselves onto the old ones so that the bird always has a warm coat.



### DID YOU KNOW?

- A hummingbird may have only 940 feathers but a mutet swan could have over 25,000.

## Breast Cancer Awareness

Breast cancer is the most common type of cancer in women, yet surprisingly few women regularly check their breasts or are even aware of the danger signs. October is breast cancer awareness month which provides an ideal opportunity for women of all ages to become more informed about this devastating illness.

Breast cancer is most prevalent in the over 50s age group but it can also affect younger women. The tendency to develop breast cancer is genetic but there are numerous other factors which can influence whether or not the condition is actually triggered.

The occurrence of breast cancer is closely linked to hormone levels, particularly high levels of oestrogen and prolactin. Long term use of the contraceptive pill or hormone replacement therapy increases the risk of breast cancer, while pregnancy and breast feeding are protective factors. In recent times, oestrogen-like substances found in many foods have been implicated in the increasing occurrence of oestrogen-dependent conditions such as breast cancer. These include fruits and vegetables which have been treated with pesticides, non-organic meat and dairy products, and products stored or heated in plastic packaging.

The excess oestrogens and other toxins which can accumulate in breast tissue are responsible for development of abnormal cells. Failure of the immune system to destroy these abnormal cells allows them to spread out of control, and a tumour develops. Any factor which significantly weakens the immune system, including trauma or emotional stress, may contribute to the development of cancer in a susceptible individual.

It is vital that women of all ages check their breasts regularly for any signs of the disease. These include a lump in the breast tissue, swelling, puckering or dimpling of the skin over the breast, changes to the nipple such as indrawing or flaking of the skin, or any unusual discharge.

Breast cancer may be diagnosed by an ultrasound scan or mammogram, which is followed by a biopsy if necessary. Treatment usually involves surgical removal of the lump but in some cases it may be necessary to remove the breast together with the lymph nodes in the armpit. Surgery is usually followed by treatment with chemotherapy or radiotherapy to destroy any remaining cancerous cells.

Unfortunately the use of these treatments has not had much of an impact on the survival rate of women treated for breast cancer. In fact chemotherapy and radiotherapy can damage healthy cells as well as cancerous ones, and can also cause nausea, vomiting, gastrointestinal inflammation and malnutrition, which reduces the efficiency of the treatment.

However, there are ways to help prevent breast cancer in susceptible individuals, and to improve the success of treatment and minimise side effects in those who have already developed the condition. A professional medical herbalist can provide an individually-tailored herbal prescription, nutritional supplements and detailed advice about cancer prevention and improving the chances of recovery. Of course there is no magic cure for cancer, but taking a holistic approach to healthcare can help to create an environment in the body which does not encourage its growth, and can help to give the immune system the upper hand.

For example, herbs such as agnus castus inhibit the production of oestrogen and prolactin, the hormones which encourage the development of breast cancer. Herbs such as burdock root detoxify the tissues and support the liver and lymphatic system which are responsible for cleansing the body. There are also herbs such as periwinkle which help to prevent the spread of cancerous cells. Herbs such as Echinacea help to ensure the immune system is functioning effectively which in turn controls the spread of the disease. Other herbs are available to help the person to deal with the emotional impact of the disease, and to help the body to cope with the demands of orthodox treatment.

If you are suffering from breast cancer or have a family history of the disease it is advisable to eat plenty of fresh organic fruit and vegetables, particularly those which are coloured such as carrots, sweet potatoes, greens, cherries and other berries. These contain nutrients known as antioxidants which are deficient in most cancer patients. Avoid meat and dairy products, and any foods stored or heated in plastic packaging. Refined sugar and processed foods encourage the build up of toxins, while a low fat, high fibre diet helps to clear excess oestrogens and toxic substances from the body.

Avoid wearing a tight fitting or underwired bra all day as this restricts lymphatic drainage, which in turn prevents removal of toxins from the area and interferes with healthy immune function. Make sure you go outside for a walk every day since the main source of vitamin D is the action of sunlight on the skin and people who are deficient in this vitamin more likely to develop breast cancer. Finally herbal remedies and other measures such as yoga can help to reduce stress and anxiety which can contribute to the development of cancer.

**Question:** Can you tell me exactly how the Affordable Housing Scheme works?

**Answer:** Affordable homes are homes provided at a discount to the market price for people who cannot afford to buy a home on the open market. An affordable home is a home that you buy at a discount to the market price. Your affordable home is for you to live in as long as you want. If you sell it within 20 years, you will have to pay back a percentage of the sale price to the local authority.

The houses are bought with a mortgage that can be provided by either local authorities or individual mortgage lenders. The loan can be up to 100% of the price of the house. Households may be entitled to a mortgage subsidy depending on their income in the previous tax year.

**To qualify for an affordable home, you should:**

1. Be a first-time buyer (but there are some exceptions, for example if you are divorced);
  2. Have enough income to meet your mortgage repayments after you have paid all your other costs; and
  3. As a guide, earn between €25,000 and €58,000 if you are applying on your own and up to €75,000 between both of you if you are applying with someone else. These are the approximate income limits only - higher/lower income limits may apply.
- You are eligible to buy an affordable house provided under Part V of the Planning and Development Acts 2000 - 2002, if 35% of your income is not sufficient to enable you to buy a house. If you sell your house within 20 years, you will have to pay the local authority a percentage of the proceeds of the sale. This percentage is expressed as the percentage difference between the sale price and the market value of the house. This amount will be reduced by 10% each year after you have owned your home for 10 years. So, if you sell your home after 20 years, you will not have to pay anything to the local authority.

**How to apply**

In the first instance contact the local authority in the area where you want to live for an application form and information pack about the Affordable Housing Scheme in your area.

You may be required to supply the following information with your application:

A current payslip from your employer  
An Income tax form (P60) or a PAYE balancing Sheet (P21)  
Other documentation that may be requested by the local authority. You may also be requested to submit a letter from your employer confirming that you are a permanent employee. For self-employed people, you may be required to submit audited accounts for the previous three years.

If you are currently living in rented accommodation, you may have to produce a statement of your weekly rent signed by the landlord or you can submit a copy of your with your application.

# Night Of Nostalgia As Minnies Squash Club Launch Book

It will be a night of nostalgia and a night of glorious and golden memories.

A night too that will relive the bygone years of the game of squash and the monumental role the Minnies Club in Abbeyside so excitingly played in the progression of what was then a minority sport.

Minnies Squash Club, with its magnificent state of the art four courts, closed its doors in 2000 – twenty seven years after it was founded by Paddy O'Brien who was licensee of the landmark pub

that gave it its name.

Almost inevitably the decision was taken following the club's closure to record for posterity the activities, the successes, and the many other features of those epic twenty seven years in book form. Now "Minnies Squash Club, The Memories", published by the same Paddy O'Brien and his son Pat who today is manager of the famed "Minnies" pub, has made it into book form and it will be officially launched at what promises to be an unforgettable night in Minnies (where else!) on Thursday

night of next week, October 18th with an 8 o'clock starting time. The compilation of the book has entailed a massive amount of research and attention to detail. So massive in fact that there were times when even those most closely associated with the project must have been asking themselves about the wisdom of undertaking it. All's well that ends well however and what will be a cherished keepsake for anyone and everyone who has had an involvement with Minnies Squash Club throughout its 1973/2000 existence will be more than eager to get their hands on the book.

While the O'Brien father and son combination have had an integral part into its delivery there are so many other people without whose valued and vital input it just would not have happened. Most importantly all are Willie White in his role as editor/researcher, and Fred C. Forsey who has been the project co-ordinator.

This duo have all but worked miracles to make the October 18th official launch a reality, along with a host of other contributors whose input has also been so important.

The whole idea for the book came from an informal chat Paddy and Pat O'Brien, Willie White and Fred Forsey were having in the aftermath of the closure of the squash club in 2000. Their concern at that time was the fate that would befall the many photographs that adorned the walls of the club.

Out of that chat emerged the proposal, followed by a definite deci-

sion to write the history of the club and publish it in book form. Seven years down the road that objective has been realised and the moment of exciting truth is at hand.

The trawl through the local newspapers was often cumbersome, but without it the book would never have become a reality. The co-operation of those same newspapers has not been lost on the publishers and the certainty is that on launch night there will be a fitting and indeed appropriate acknowledgement of that co-operation.

On all occasions like October 18th there will be a sense of poignancy mixed with the excitement and the emotion. In this instance it will be the absence of former school principal, the late Tom McHugh of Abbeyside, who passed away so unexpectedly just a few short years ago. Tom was honoured by being unanimously elected the first president of Minnies Squash Club in 1973 and it was under his inspirational presidential leadership that the roots of the club were so firmly sown to enable it to thrive even in those testing formative years. No doubt he will be remembered on October 18th when due tribute will be paid to his illustrious memory.

Incidentally while the launch of the book is indeed a very special milestone in the story of "Minnies" it will not be the first such publica-

tion directly linked to the squash club. To mark the 10th anniversary of its foundation a booklet entitled "Playlet" was produced in 1983 and it also went down the proverbial treat. In hindsight it was to be a forerunner for "Minnies Squash Club – The Memories".

Over all those twenty seven years of intense activity Minnies Squash Club commanded a proud name and an equally proud reputation within the sport throughout the length and breadth of the country.

The club also produced many great players at a variety of levels,

but most importantly of all the produced players who represented the club with immense pride, honour, and no little distinction whenever it was their sporting travels that took them.

Thursday night October 18th then is a day and date not to be missed with Minnies the all important venue. For all of the people who had an involvement with the club over those twenty seven years of its existence it will be an unforgettable sojourn down memory lane. For Paddy and Pat O'Brien and family it will be all of that and so much more.

# Jay Bourke Says Networking and Partnership is Positive Way to Grow

Well known entrepreneur Jay Bourke spoke to a crowded room in the Clonea Strand Hotel. Speaking off the cuff on his own experience gained since his first venture into pub ownership at the age of 22. Jay strongly advocated networking and partnership as a way to grow your business. Bourke began in the restaurant and pub trade in 1988 at the age of 22, when he took advantage of a government scheme for young entrepreneurs. He heard a speech by then minister for finance Al-

bert Reynolds, and cut out the newspaper clippings the next day. Bourke had just left Trinity College with an economics degree, and he opened Wolfman Jack's in Rathmines with a loan of €50,000. "I was an arrogant little so-and-so," he said. "I wrote to the chief executives of the four clearing banks, and three days later we were in AIB Bank Centre and we had a loan. "It was unsecured money, and we managed to open the restaurant without having to go to mum and dad. "I

was 22 and €50,000 was an awful lot of money. You could buy an awful lot of plastering and building work with that." Five years later, the Wolfman Jack's business slipped due to a currency crisis, and the restaurant closed. This first failure was difficult but Bourke had his eyes on a site on South Great George's Street, and in 1993 he joined forces with Galwegian Eoin Foyle to open the Globe bar and Ri Ra nightclub. "Eoin had areas of expertise that I didn't have, and I like to think that I had expertise that he didn't have," said Bourke. "He provided the music and the club expertise, and I provided the business acumen and plans. We had different strengths, which is obviously the basis for a decent relationship."

Bourke strongly advocates building business networks as a means of growing your business. He is currently looking at joining forces with Brody Sweeney of O'Brien's sandwich bars in order to leverage from Mr Sweeney's experience of franchising. "Don't view others in the industry as the enemy, as people with complementary skills can help each other a lot".

This view was echoed by Rosie Sheehan of Broadway Bagels, who shared the podium with Jay Bourke on Monday night. Rosie emphasised the practical help that a network can provide - be it a much needed piece of equipment or an insight into a distribution issue.

Rosie and Jay had met when he co-presented 'The Mentor' and more recently the 'Mentor Revisited' programme on RTE Television with Dr Jeanne Bolger where the team advised entrepreneurs on the direction of their business. Rosie and her husband Des have since gone from strength to strength in establishing their bagel business on the wholesale market both in Ireland and the UK.

It's hard to express in words the shock and sadness felt with the recent passing of John Devine, Reenacoolagh, Ballysaggart, Lismore following an accident on Friday, 7th September.

## RETIREMENT PARTY

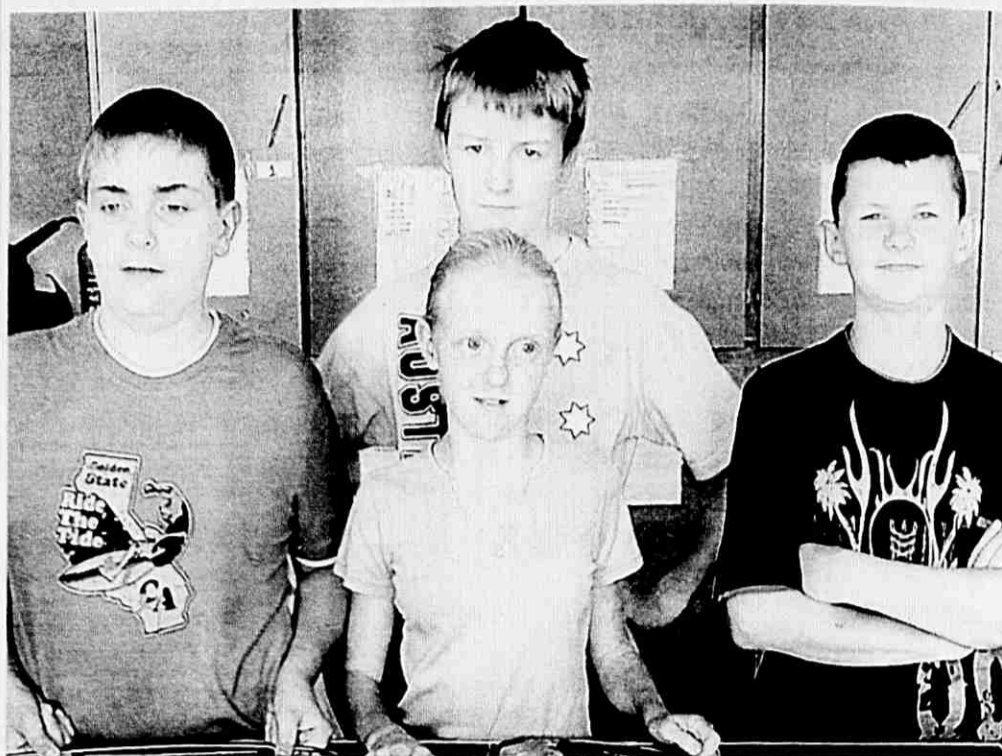

## EuroLink

### OVER A MILLION EUROPEANS DEMAND DISABILITY RIGHTS

A petition of more than a million signatures has been handed over at EU headquarters in Brussels, demanding stronger disability legislation across the bloc. Over 20,000 people signed the petition in Ireland - 240 per cent of the national target quota of signatures. The 1Million4Disability Campaign was launched by the European Disability Forum last January, in a bid to achieve a legally-binding directive in all member states to end discrimination against people with disabilities. The list of names was officially presented at a ceremony on Thursday to President José Manuel Barroso of the European Commission and President Hans-Gert Poettering of the European Parliament. James McClean, Chairperson of PwDI (People with Disabilities in Ireland), was among those participating in the handover. He said, 'This campaign has received such an excellent response at home - it speaks volumes for how Irish people feel about equality for people with disabilities. What we want is equal access to education and training, to the health services and to employment - we simply want to play our part in the social and economic life of our own countries.' Independent MEP Kathy Sinnott congratulated all those who helped to collect signatures throughout Munster; 'People have been working so hard to achieve almost double our quota of names, but the real hard work starts now. We must convince the European legislators to take this petition seriously. This campaign is sending a strong message that disability rights are a priority for the people of Europe.'

### POSTAL MARKET OPEN TO COMPETITION FROM 2011

The postal market in Ireland and in most EU member states will be open to competition from private operators from 2011, following a decision by EU communications ministers this week. It means that new entrants will be allowed to compete with state-run monopolies for deliveries of standard letters weighing under 50 grammes, the most lucrative segment of the postal market. Parcels and letters that weigh over 50 grammes are already open to competition in Ireland. The move has been welcomed by An Post, which claims that 65 per cent of its business is already available to rivals. Spokesperson Angus Laverty hinted that An Post might move into the European market after liberalisation, saying 'Our main priority is domestic post, but we're also considering further afield.'

Fianna Fáil MEP Brian Crowley said, 'The most important part of this deal is that there will still be a universal service obligation. That means postal deliveries must still be made a minimum of five times a week to all residential households and businesses in all parts of Europe.'

Charlie McCreevy, the EU Internal Markets Commissioner, had wanted to open the postal market from 2009, but the date was pushed forward following pressure from several countries including France and Italy. Under a further compromise, eleven EU states have won the right to delay liberalising their postal markets for another six years. Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Greece, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Poland, Romania and Slovakia do not have to open their postal markets until 2013.

### EXPERTS CALL FOR LEGISLATION TO COMBAT HEART DISEASE

Two senior Irish cardiologists have addressed a meeting in Brussels to set up a multi-national committee aimed at tackling heart disease. Cardiovascular disease causes almost half of all deaths in Europe - by this time next year almost 2 million Europeans will have died from it. It also costs the EU an estimated €169 billion every year. Michael O'Shea, Director of the Irish Heart Foundation, told a group of MEPs that the medical profession is relinquishing control of the disease and urging politicians to get involved. He described it as a societal problem: 'the American way of death - inactivity, poor diet, obesity, diabetes and smoking - all risk factors in heart disease'. Professor Ian Graham of the Adelaide and Meath Hospital in Dublin said, 'We can provide the background science, but we can't deliver the changes that are needed to allow the citizens of Europe to get healthier. It's critical that the message gets out there into the public domain. We need to begin the process of education for a healthy lifestyle at school.'

On the reverse side of the postcard are the words "What would you like for a present", signed Arthur. The card is addressed to a lady in Tullamore, Kings County and carries a one penny stamp. On the extreme right of the card are ten very small crosses.

Then again we are all experts in hindsight. This, however, must count as a serious chance gone a begging. Without ever having anything near full return for the lavish possession we enjoyed in the first half we faded in the final quarter and allowed Abbeyside the openings, which to their credit they exploited to the fullest.

From the outset Tallow looked comfortable and in control but it took ten minutes to register our first point from a Paul Kearney

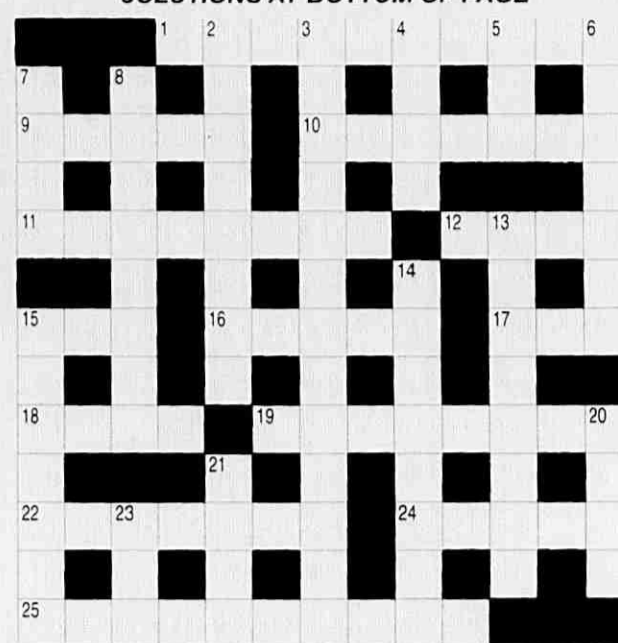

### Senior Alliance

The South East Senior Alliance had their first outing of the season in Dungarvan on Sunday last. On a glorious Autumn day, the Alliance had a great start to the 07/08 Winter season of golf. Well done to Dungarvan Golf Club member Tony Brady, who had a scintillating 67 net off 7 handicap to win from the cream of the South East's golfers.

### Handicaps

The English Golfing Union says that, in response to the changing needs of golfers, CONGU (the council of national golfing unions) will introduce a facility in 2008 to allow an affiliated club, at its discretion, to run 'qualifying competitions' (for handicap purposes) over 9 holes. It is envisaged that 9-hole qualifying competitions will be particularly attractive to clubs and their members on summer evenings and in the restricted daylight hours of winter weekends. 9-hole competitions could also be the means by which a greater number of senior golfers are encouraged to make returns for handicap purposes.

The format for these competitions will be Stableford, with a 'neutral' 18 points for the 9 unplayed holes added to a golfer's score. As there is no desire to change the traditional way in which competitive golf is played over 18 holes, the number of 9-hole events at a club will be

restricted to 10 per year. Scores returned by Category 1 golfers in 9-hole competitions will not qualify for handicap adjustment. I have heard nothing yet from the GUI; I wonder will it catch on here?

### Ryder Cup 2008

Of all golf competitions the Ryder Cup has attracted a huge number of viewers in this country in recent years. Perhaps it is due to the success of the European team over the USA, and the success of Irish players in the tournament. In case anybody needs reminding, Europe won by the same decisive margins in both 2004 and 2006, i.e. 18 - 9. Somebody asked me about the European team selection process for the 2008 event at Valhalla GC, Louisville, Kentucky in September of next year.

The selection system will reflect that used in 2004 and 2006, with five players qualifying through the World Points List, based on the World Ranking points accumulated from world ranked tournaments over a 12-month period. The period began in September, and will continue to August 31st 2008, the final event being the Johnnie Walker Championship at Gleneagles - host venue for the 2014 Ryder Cup. A further five players will earn places in the European team through The Ryder Cup European Points List, based on money won in European PGA Order of Merit events. Nick Faldo, European team Captain in 2008, will complete the 12-man line-up by selecting two Captain's picks at the conclusion of the qualification process. "If it ain't broke don't fix it" said Faldo, referring to the selection process which led to victory on both sides of the Atlantic - at Oakland Hills and the K Club - in recent years. Let's hope Ireland has a strong representation.

### Progressive 45

The usual game is 'One Hundred and Ten', played with panache (by some) and argument, local rules, gossip, small money changing hands, with novices sent on a bus to Kilmac on Monday nights for lessons! 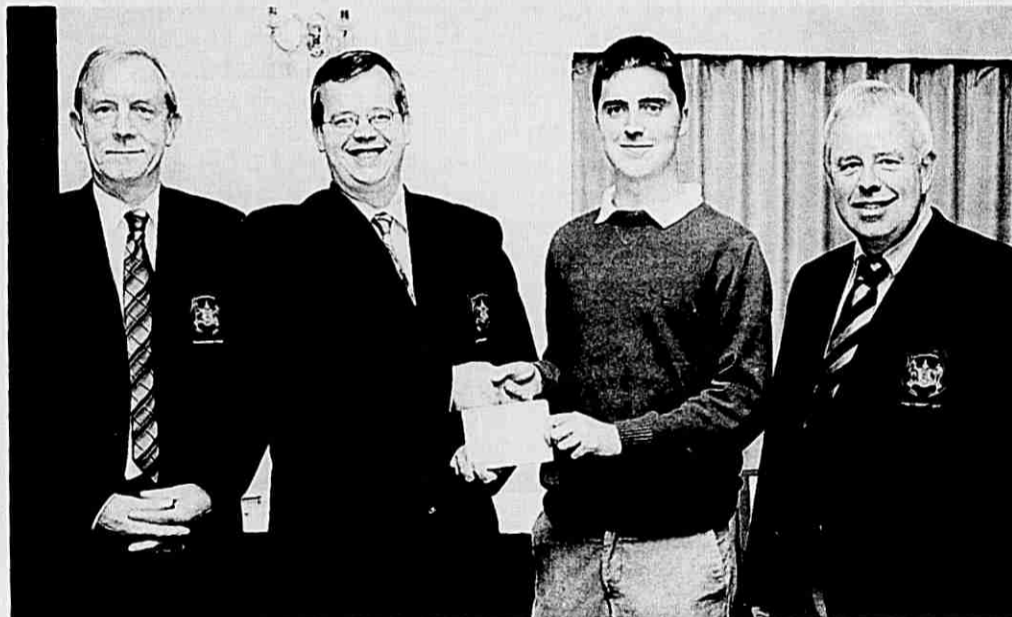

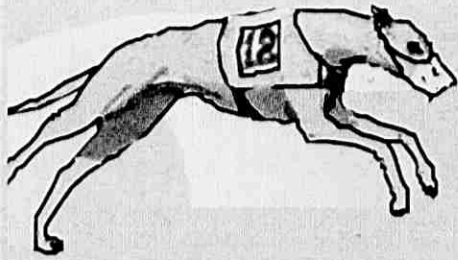

## Roseville Pixie In Full Bloom

Having only her second race in public last Friday night the Andrew Weldon owned Roseville Pixie (Honcho Classic-Graysland Chic) 6/4 was by far the fastest winner on view streaking to a red-hot 28.67 success in race four. Taking a flyer from trap two Roseville Pixie bounded clear from Forge Lady and racing in splendid isolation up front March 2006 whelp Roseville Pixie cruised to a nine and a half lengths success over Determined Wolf.

County Wexford owner George Roche consolidated his lead at the top of the leading owners race at this venue sending out a nice priced double courtesy of Swift Milly (Hotshow Ben-Bettivenmilion) 2/1 and Mall Lane (Sycamore Dan-Ultimate Rush) 2/1. The early paced Swift Milly held the early call over a tightly packed group at the first bend in race one and despite the close attendance of Cactus Vieri and Druids Smokey on the back stretch a determined Swift Milly kept on well to deny a running on Druids Smokey by two lengths in 28.94.

Mall Lane took a heavy fall at Enniscorthy on Thursday night but this dog showed his resilience by taking a two-bend dash in 16.39. Ima Cooper Cool broke smartly from trap five but recovering from a slow start from trap one Mall Lane motored into overdrive and heading the pack at the first bend Mall Lane strode on to record a three lengths success over the always prominent Wilcox Monet.

In the second contest Lord Shauna set the early gallop from trap one but after a slow start the well supported Black Vienna gave chase down the back stretch. Black Vienna joined issue up front off the final turn but it was the Don't Care Syndicate owned Brindle Storm (Boherduff Light-Mahogany Crystal) 3/1 who lived up to his name flying home on the wide outside to outstay Black Vienna by two lengths in 29.48.

Taking on race dogs the Louis and Jimmy Dowley owned and Eamon O Donovan trained Dunbane Black (Hondo Black-Scarna Lil) made a pleasing debut in a two bend dash to score in 16.45. Backed in from 3/1 to 4/6 Dunbane Black had Moonveen Sputnik for company up front but when "Moonveen" drifted wide into the home stretch Dunbane Black was allowed a free run in to beat Moonveen Sputnik by a cosy four lengths.

We moved up to the 730-yard trip for the fifth contest. Wilcox Fairy was out front from an early stage but recovering well from a poor start the Tom Power, Butlerstown, owned Leaders Scholes (Droopys Scholes-Suirside Lass) the evens favourite charged into a third bend lead. Once in front Leaders Scholes kept on well in the lead to run out a deserved length and a half winner over a running on Builders Butty in a much-improved time of 41.16.

The sixth contest was confined to first timers. Drawn in trap three Minglers Heather made a slick exit from traps and duly motored into a handy early lead over Clic N Nic and Ribot. Showing a fine burst of back stretch pace however the Tom Power, Tramore owned and Lester Power trained Ribot (Crafty Romeo-Little Misshappy) closed right up on Minglers Heather and once he straightened out for home the coursing bred Ribot accelerated into the lead to forge clear for a four lengths win over Minglers Heather in 29.31. The winner is named after that great thoroughbred Ribot and is pronounced "Reebo".

The William O Brien owned Butts Charm (Royal Impact-Butts Away) 5/2 to 4/6 landed some tasty wagers en route to a 29.14 success in race nine. Showing significant improvement from

previous efforts Butts Charm looked in trouble early on as Fancy Claw motored into a handy back stretch lead but with the leader drifting very wide into the home stretch Butts Away was left in the lead to run out a handy three and a half lengths winner over Fancy Claw.

The Maura and John Fitzgerald owned and Phil Gough trained Sparta Lola (Droopys Kewell-Making Merry) 6/4 produced an eye catching performance in the ninth contest posting back to back victories in 29.11. Having been hampered at the first turn Sparta Lola found herself well off the pace as Any Westerns stretched clear of Stumpys Again and Murtz Blue but cutting through the pack like a knife through butter Sparta Lola stormed home on the wide outside to short head Any Westerns.

The camera was also called upon to divide the principals in the tenth event. Despite moving to the outside from her trap two draw the Seamus Mullaly owned Posh Doll (Pinewood Blue-Nicks Doll) 3/1 still managed to lead from Star Kav and Cill Dubh Jet and while Star Kav was running on strongly at the death Posh Doll dug deep to triumph by a neck in 28.92.

In the concluding 550 yard contest the Christy Jacob and Jackie Roche owned and Vic Roche trained Cailin Liath (Climate Control-Quivers Lodge) 2/1 returned to winning ways with a vengeance posting a well deserved 30.17 victory. In the front rank throughout Cailin Liath led down the back from Bengal Bay and sticking to the task in hand Cailin Liath got every yard of the trip to defeat Bengal Bay by a comfortable two lengths.

The final of the Salvie and Sheila Drohan sponsored Boherduff Light A5 event produced a personal triumph for County Wexford owner - breeder Tom Walsh as his two finalists bearing the "Betty's" prefix filled the first two places home. As this final was run Rourkes Again kicked on into an early lead and when October Surprise and Wilcox Miroslav crashed out at the opening turn Rourkes Again led down the back stretch from Betty's Legend and War General. Taking over in the lead at the third bend however a strong running Betty's Legend (Teds Jet-Davids Image) 5/1 kept up the gallop from here on in to beat his staying on kennel mate Betty's Ebony by a length and a half in 29.15.

In the opening four bender the early paced Larkhill Dreamer made a solid bid to make every stride a winning one but with the winning line in sight Larkhill Dreamer was collared in the dying strides by the always well placed Shanays See (Droopys Kewell-Geneva Gypsy) this 4/1 shot striking late for owner Willie Waters and trainer Eamon O Donovan to land the spoils by the minimum distance in 28.89.

The Isobel Copeland Eccles owned and John Nichols trained Three Spots Off (Droopys Woods-Feels Like Gold) 3/1 is certainly improving with age and racing up with the pace in a 300 yard sprint Three Spots Off was soon at the head of affairs to motor on for a well deserved three lengths success over Mullaghmore Fire in a career best 16.33.

In the third contest Powerful Ella and Black Wok drew well clear of the pack early on and while they locked horns the length of the

back stretch the Sion Syndicate owned and Alan Robinson trained Powerful Ella (Top Honcho-Penny A Paw) 3/1 eventually got the better of this dour struggle by a short head in 29.33.

In the fourth event the early leader Winnies Top was carried wide just beyond the second bend by a challenging Leaders Top. The Tom Drohan owned Snakehill Joe (Droopys Kewell-Lisnakill Cindy) 3/1 was left in pole position from that point on and despite the constant presence of Inchydoney Brook from the last bend home Snakehill Joe held firm to score by a neck. Time 29.23.

The versatile Dravid (Top Honcho-Wilcox Jet) 3/1 credited Slieverue trainer Eamon O Donovan with his second success of the night capturing a six-bend marathon for Wexford owner Ray Causer in a lifetime best clock of 40.57. In front from an early stage Dravid motored into a four lengths lead over Honey Secret and while "Honey" ran her heart out she failed by one and a half lengths to peg back a free flowing Dravid who was posting his sixth win.

Even Par and Loose Toy enjoyed a good buckle in the early stages of the sixth contest but heading out on to the back stretch the Pat Kirwan owned and Catherine Redmond trained Loose Toy (Droopys Scholes-Bobbies Baby) 4/1 eased his way to the front. It was all Loose Toy from that point on as the Model County entry went on to account for a staying on Ushie Disel by three lengths. Time 28.87.

There was no shortage of early pace amongst the top three dogs in race eight where the Tubber Lane Syndicate owned and Michael Delahunty trained Zip Fastener (Elite State-Affleck Patsy) 5/2 shaded the first bend from Balymurn Shark and Annacurra Jack. Making the long dash for home Zip Fastener was never in any subsequent danger breezing in all of four lengths clear of Balymurn Shark in 28.96.

The remaining three races on the card were first round heats of the Queally Walsh Engineering A2 Stake.

Heat one-Despite being up four grades after his previous success the Larry Evoy owned Perrys Tom (Blackjack Tom-Chesters Chick) 3/1 proved equal to the task posting a trap to line success in a best of night 28.58. Taking a flyer from trap one Perrys Tom had the opposition in big trouble from an early stage leading from Impact Boy and when the latter was taken wide by Fahee Agassi off the home turn Perrys Tom increased his advantage to run out a clear-cut eight and a half lengths winner over Fahee Agassi.

Heat two-The Kevin Kennedy and Mick O Donovan owned and Jude Hennessy trained Gurrane Bond (Judicial Preview-Felicia Jo) has certainly hit a purple patch of late and he continued with his running run capturing this qualifier in 28.95. Poking up the inside of the front running Kacys King at the penultimate bend Gurrane Bond stayed on well thereafter to defeat Kacys King by three quarters of a length.

Heat three-The concluding qualifier was a four-runner affair. A prominent Mays Orpen opted for a middle course thus allowing a slow starting 3/1 shot Mount Annville a run up his inside on the run to the third bend. Owned by Tom Kearney and trained by Paddy Gaffney Mount Annville (Larkhill Jo-Duhallow Lady) stuck it out to the bitter end to deservedly triumph by two lengths over a wide running Mays Orpen in 28.85.

The John "Shako" O Mahoney fund raising launch takes place at Tramore races this coming Thursday when well known National Hunt riders Ruby Walsh, Davy Russell, Ken Whelan and Shay Barry join Deise GAA stars Ken McGrath, Dan Shanahan, Seamus Prendergast and Tony Browne to name but a few to lend their support to this very worthy cause.

## RACING POST SALE

The Racing Post was sold last week to the Irish based FL Partners, which is fronted, by Peter Crowley and Neill Hughes. The purchase price received by previous owners Trinity Mirror was £170 million. Dubliner Alan Byrne has been installed as Editor in chief. Lets hope the he brings the coverage of Irish racing up to the same level to that afforded to UK race meetings. Currently previews of Irish racing falls some way short of the previews of British fixtures. FL Partners is a private equity firm. Technically they have only minimum interest in horse or greyhound racing and this purchase is a business venture to them. They will endeavour to increase the profitability of the Racing Post and sell it on at a profit four to five years down the road. Incidentally the purchase price fell £40 million short of the price sought by Trinity Mirror earlier this year.

## Profile Of Trainer Saeed bin Suroor

Godolphin's trainer, former police officer Saeed bin Suroor, was born in Dubai on October 10, 1967. He has been champion British trainer four times - in 1996, 1998, 1999 and 2004. Coupled with his phenomenal achievements with Godolphin, bin Suroor trained the unbeaten Lammtarra for Sheikh Mohammed's nephew, Saeed Maktoum Al Maktoum, to win the 1995 Vodafone Derby, Ascot's King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond Stakes and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. That the horse raced only four times in his career and yet was trained by bin Suroor to succeed in those three pre-eminent Group One events is an achievement which cannot be overstated. Bin Suroor is aided by racing manager Simon Crisford and an excellent team of staff. Cape Verdi's 1000 Guineas win completed the full set of British classics for bin Suroor in 1998. His domestic classic winners are Stan James 1000 Guineas (1998 Cape Verdi, 2002 Kazzia), Stan James 2000 Guineas (1996 Mark Of Esteem, 1999 Island Sands), Vodafone Derby (1995 Lammtarra), Vodafone Oaks (1995 Moonshell, 2002 Kazzia) and St Leger (1995 Classic Cliche, 1998 Nedawi, 1999 Mutafaweq and 2004 Rule Of Law). Godolphin has enjoyed numerous other big-race wins worldwide and 2003 saw Godolphin

achieve 100 Grade/Group One races with Sulamani's victory in the Arlington Million. That figure has subsequently risen to 135 Group/Grade One victories. A very quiet 2006 yielded no Group One victories in Britain and a total of five in Europe, although Discreet Cat and Ashkal Way scored at the highest level in the US to complement Electrocutonist's Dubai World Cup win.

Ramonti is proving a great servant to trainer bin Suroor in 2007 and he registered his third Group 1 victory of the year capturing the recent Queen Elizabeth II Stakes at Ascot.

## CHELTENHAM LADIES DAY AMBASSADOR

Cheltenham Racecourse recently announced that Jacqui O'Neill, one of the most high-profile women in Jump racing, has agreed to become its Ladies Day Ambassador for 2007/08. Jacqui will be involved in a number of public and media events in the lead-up to Ladies Day as well as taking a full part in proceedings on the day itself. Following a successful introduction last season, Ladies Day is becoming an important part of The Festival and is scheduled for Thursday, March 13 in 2008. Ladies Day at Cheltenham features a number of pre-racing fashion awards, but also includes the presentation of the award for 'The Outstanding Contribution made by a Lady to Jump Racing', selected from a short-list made up of nominations from the public. In 2007, this was won by Heather Atkinson, the senior nurse in the jockeys' hospital at the racecourse. In addition, Ladies Day allows Cheltenham to help raise funds for and awareness of Winston's Wish, a locally based national charity which helps bereaved children and young people rebuild their lives after a family death. Commenting on the news, Jacqui O'Neill said: "I'm thrilled to become the Ladies Day Ambassador and to help spread the word about this great addition to The Festival. Last season's Ladies Day was done with a real sense of panache and I'm hopeful that we can build even more interest in the events on and around the day in 2008." Edward Gillespie

Cheltenham's Managing Director, added: "Everyone in racing knows Jacqui as a stylish, energetic and extremely friendly character and I'm really pleased that she has agreed to accept this role. It is even more special given her life-long connection with the county of Gloucestershire."

Jacqui, wife of Jackdaws Castle trainer and former dual champion jump jockey Jonjo O'Neill, has strong ties to the home of Jump racing. She is a Gloucestershire native, having been brought up and schooled in the area - and she and Jonjo were actually married at Cheltenham Racecourse in January, 1997. Jacqui plays a vital role in Jonjo's successful training career. She helped the Cheltenham Gold Cup-winning jockey turned trainer establish a 70-horse, 50 winners a season yard at Penrith, Cumbria before moving to the state-of-the-art Jackdaws Castle complex at Temple Guiting near Cheltenham in 2001. Jackdaws Castle sent out 126 winners last season and there are already 49 in the bag this time before the main part of the season gets under way later this month with The Showcase at Cheltenham (Friday, October 19 and Saturday, October 20). Jonjo once famously said of his wife's influence on his life and career: "Without Jacqui, I wouldn't begin to bother." Jacqui O'Neill is the epitome of the modern woman, raising a young family, while finding the time to be actively engaged in running one of the most powerful stables in the land, and is often seen representing the stable at the races.

Kieren Fallon has been called many things in his time but boring? Never. Monday mornings in racing yards aren't as lazy as other workplaces. There is a re-adjustment after the weekend's blitzkrieg of race meetings but it's always about the next race, and nowhere is that attitude more prevailing than at Ballydoyle. They hit the ground running.

These big yards can have a funny dynamic and the stable's retained jockey has a certain prestige. Fallon and his ilk would be in constant consultation with his employers over future targets for horses but that doesn't preclude him from the grim work, and the riding out multiple lots of horses at the crack of dawn.

On Monday, despite the thought of a 5am start, the Clareman would have given anything to be cantering up a woodchip gallop in South Tipperary. Instead he was in the Old Bailey in London for the kick-off of a trial which seeks to adjudicate whether or not he and five others defrauded Betfair customers by fixing races. The court proceedings are expected to last for months and we'll revisit the ins and outs at a future date.

What's intriguing is that even when half the country were wearing hairshirts, the Coolmore partnership were out in their Fethard paddocks, raking in the money. They are exceptionally shrewd men who show no signs of losing that edge. Clearly they believe that a) Fallon is innocent of these charges or, b) Fallon has convinced them that his version of events is true.

Either way they have shown tremendous loyalty to their stable jockey in the most trying time of an extraordinarily controversial career.

If punters were wondering why they saw it on Paris on Sunday, Fallon hasn't had a good season with his confidence clearly dented. More than ever, in mundane races in Ireland this year, the former champion jockey has been making mistakes that you wouldn't expect him to make.

But at the weekend he was again imperious, not in the way he threaded Hurricane Run up the rail two years ago, but this time in the strength he showed to throw Dylan Thomas towards the winning line in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

If winning the race wasn't enough it

came with two added bonuses. Dylan Thomas is from the late, great Danehill and for Coolmore to get a champion from him (and with Dylan Thomas's great physique too) was a godsend. And, not that they'd admit it, but to beat Sheikh Mohammed's multi-million purchase Authorized in the process probably was the icing on the cake.

Our ante-post tip, Soldier of Fortune, ran well but just wasn't quite good enough. It can take another big middle-distance prize though on ground a little less lively than Sunday's.

We did get one result last weekend. As predicted in the column last week France were worth a bet to win the Rugby World Cup. By the time their quarter-final kicked off against New Zealand they were 20/1 with Betfair to win the tournament. They're now a top-price 7/4 so you can choose whether to lay back and take a profit, or lie back and let your bet roll!

It's a great pity that Ballydoyle ran Duke of Marmalade in the other week's QE2 - a tough run means that he is unlikely to line up in Newmarket on Saturday for the Champion Stakes. A ten furlong race at English racing's HQ would be just perfect for him. Ah well...

But his absence allows us to tap into something that's hardly a new phenomenon: under-estimated French-trained horses running in big races in the UK.

Last week we saw Natagora available in the morning at 5/1 for the Cheveley Park despite a sparkling second behind Myboycharlie in the Prix Morny. And this weekend, in my opinion, we'll have another under priced French winner of a Group 1.

Jean-Claude Rouget plans to send Literato over for the race and this rowan-coloured Kendor colt has a wonderful chance. Second to Lawman in the French Derby, he has won eight of his ten career races. Since that race at Longchamp he has won both ten furlong prep races. He is currently trading at 7/1 on Betfair but could be bigger. Take a chunk.

Next week, having avoided the issue 'til now, I'll be offering a strong ante-post suggestion for next year's 2,000 Guineas. And it ain't any of those short-priced ones.

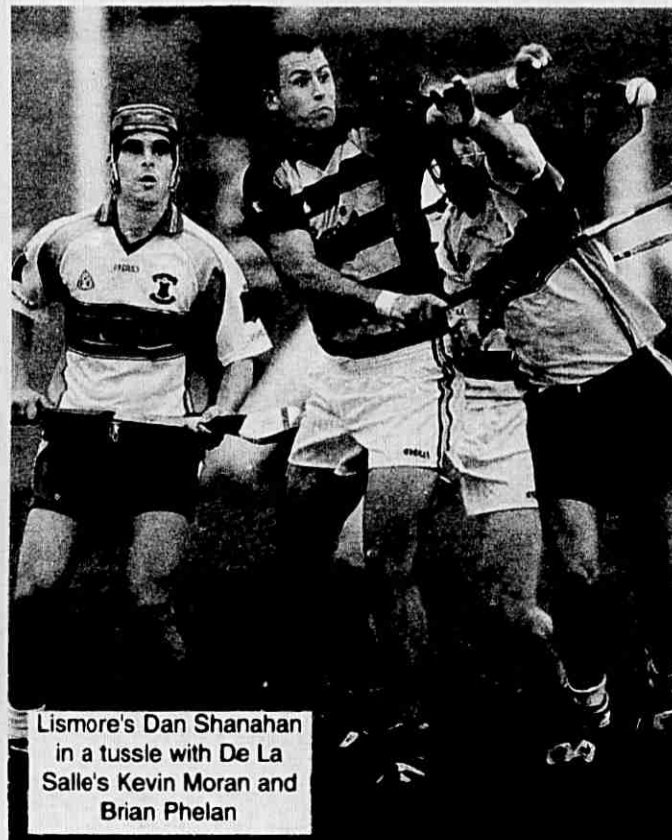

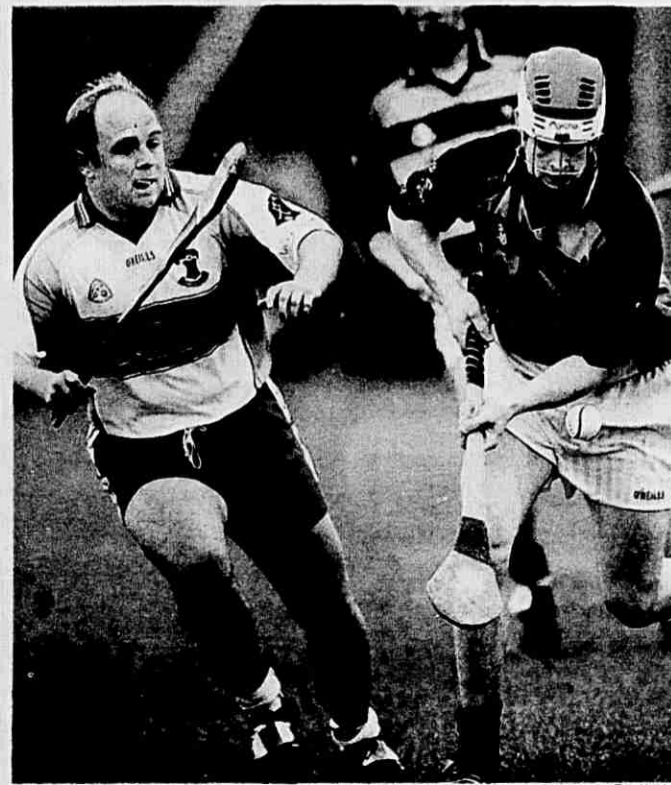

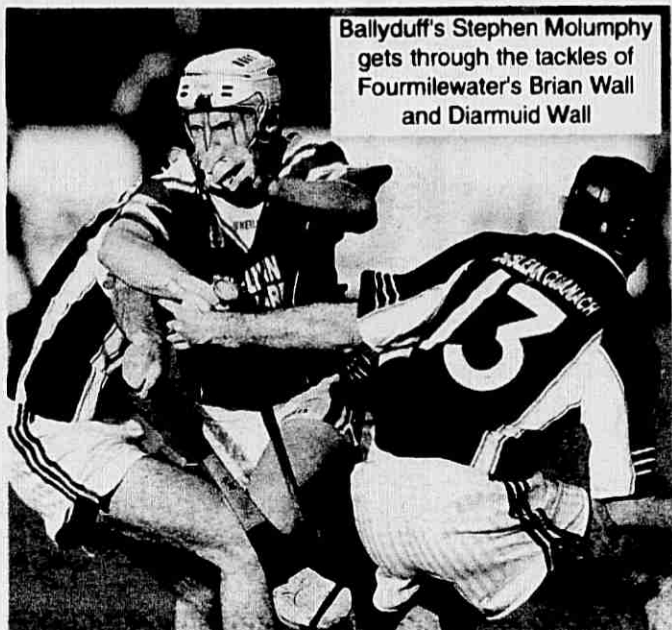

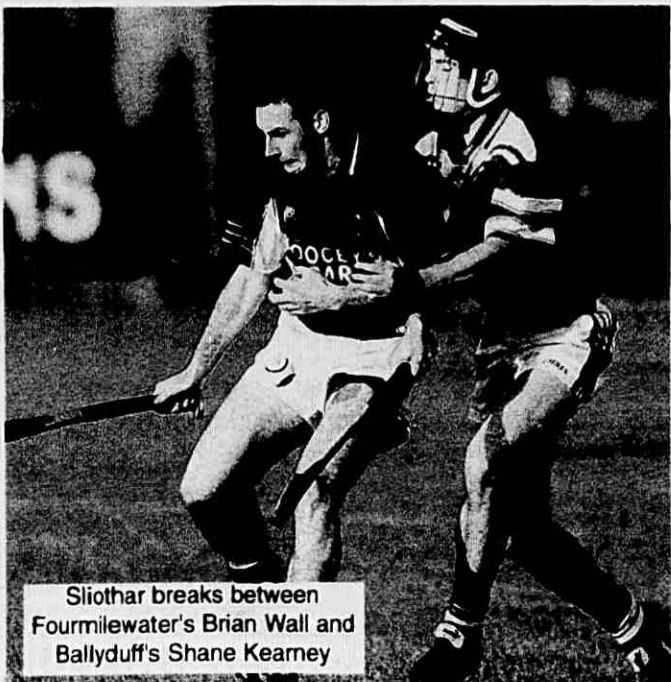

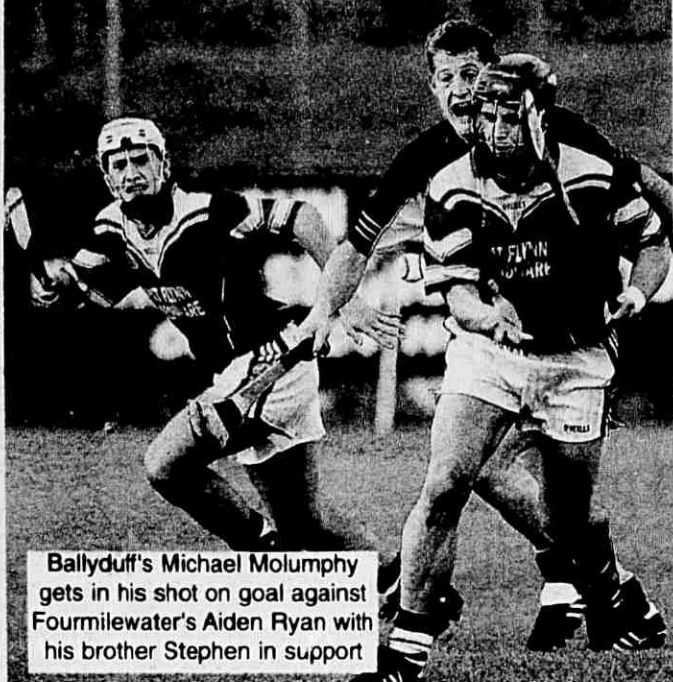

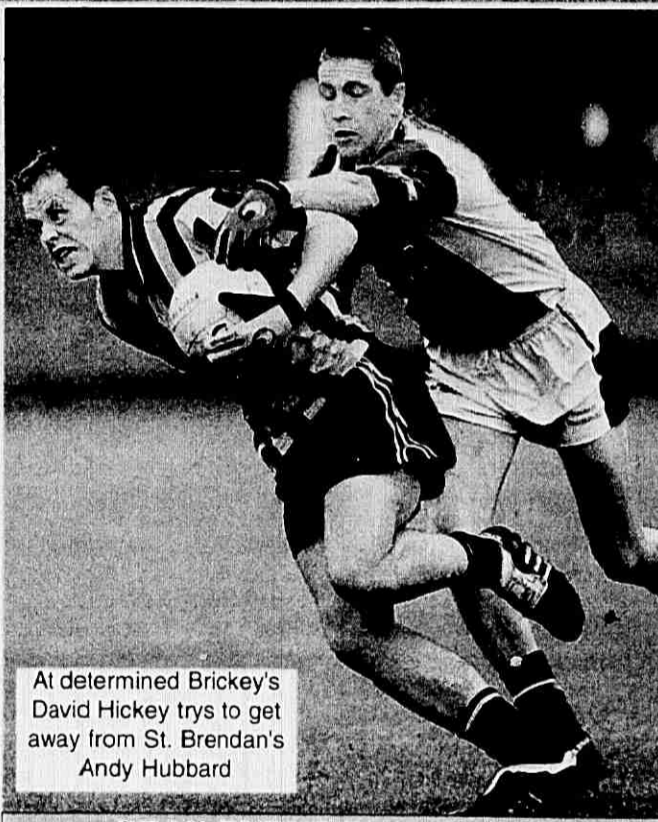

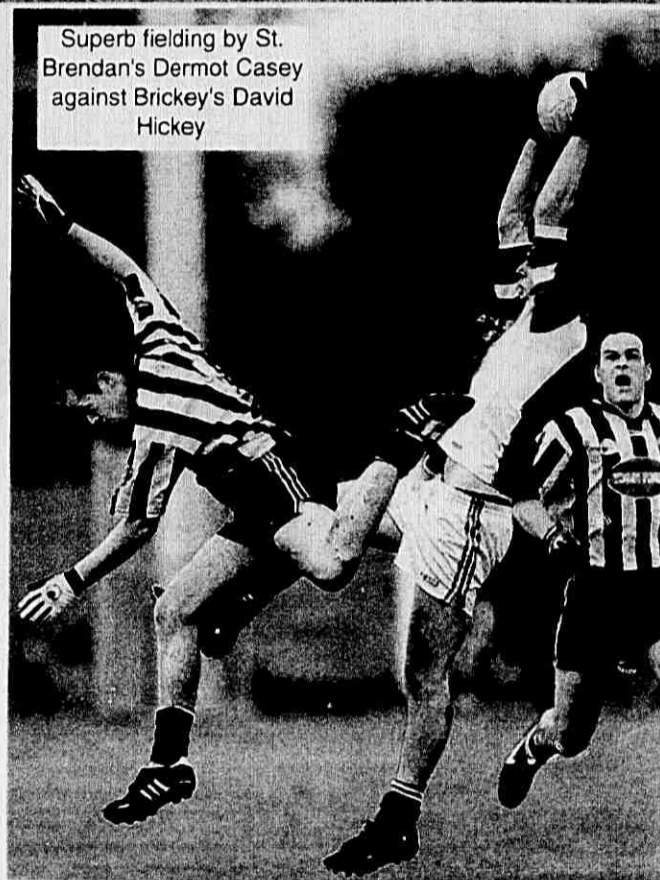


Brickey's Shane McGrath hand pass under pressure from St. Brendan's Niall Hennessy

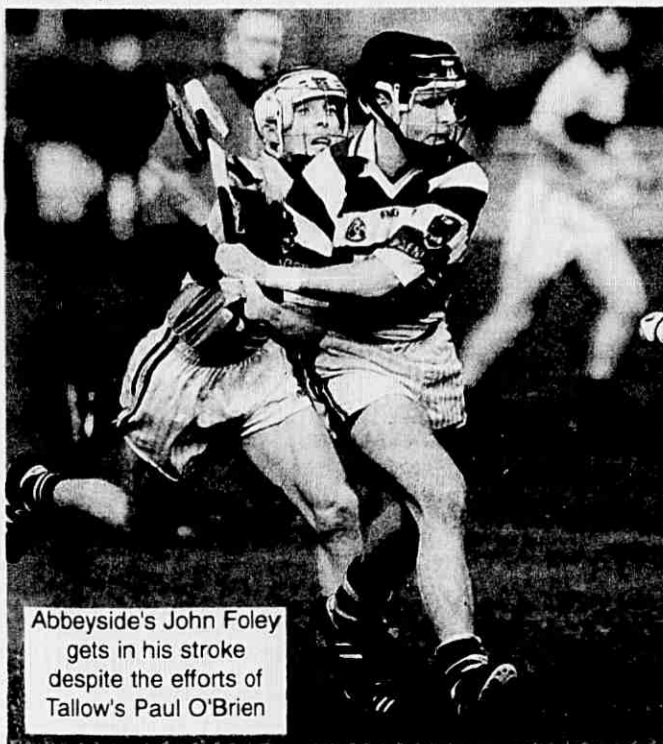

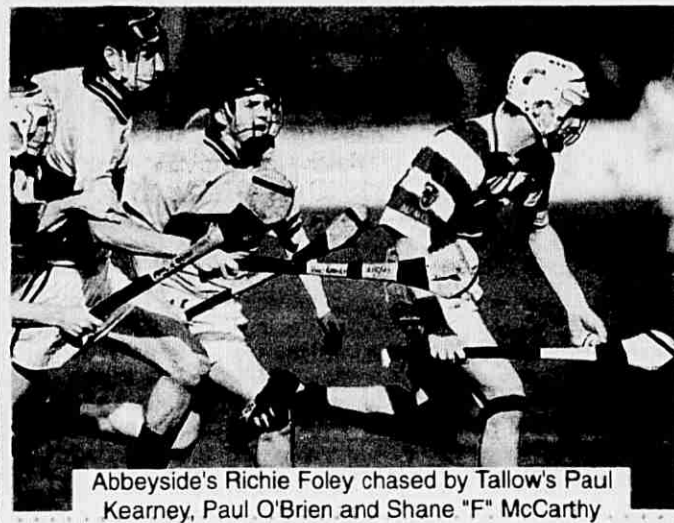

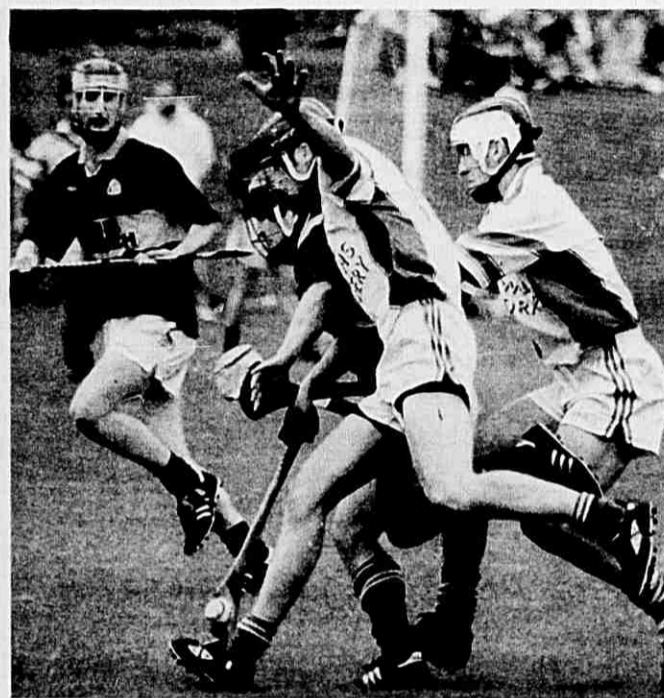

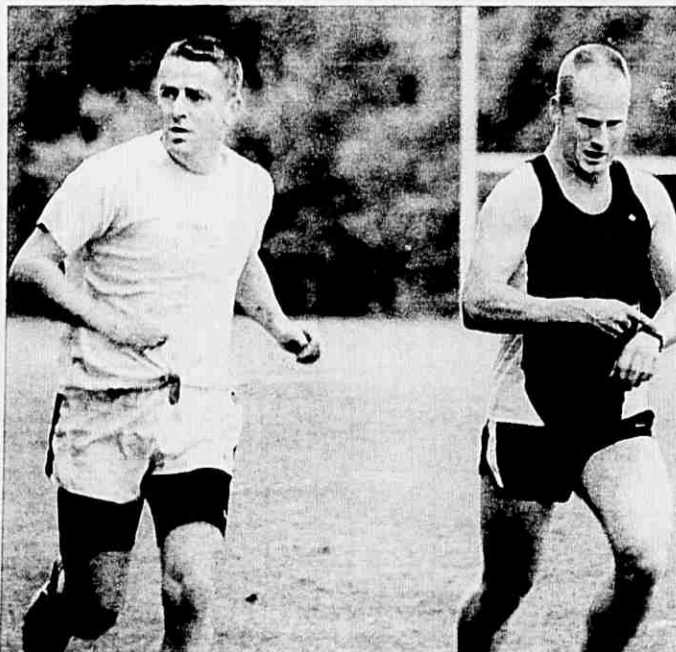

## WATERFORD A.C. LADIES TEAM WON GOLD ON THE DAY

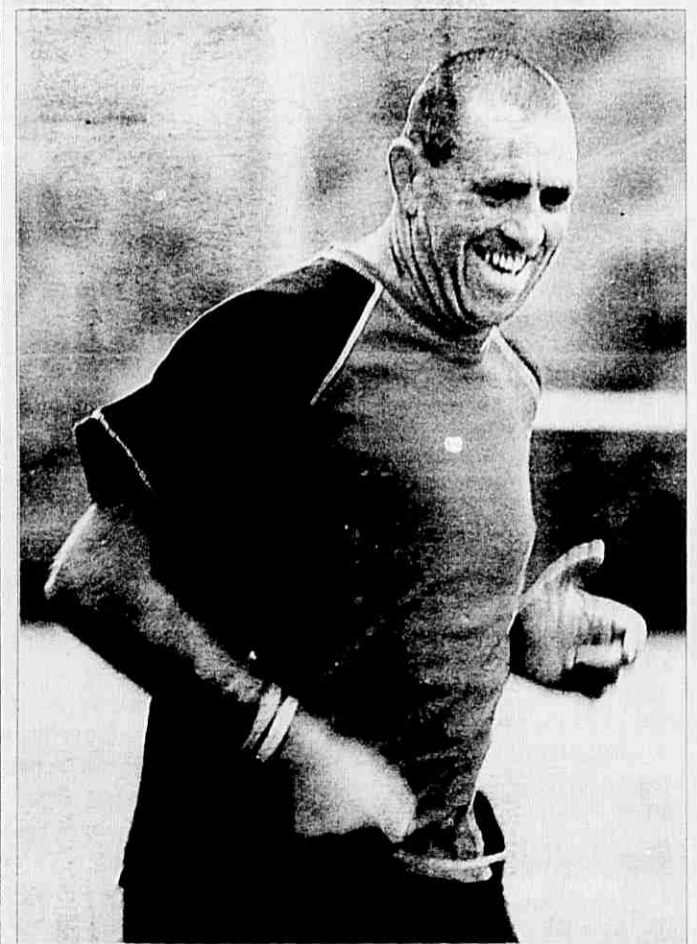

# World Snooker Champions Return To Dungarvan



Two time World Snooker Champion Ronnie O'Sullivan is set to return to Dungarvan for a rematch with Ireland's former World Champion Ken Doherty. In January, both of the players gave an exhibition in Lawlors Hotel. On the night, Ronnie 'The Rocket' O'Sullivan made a maximum 147 break and Ken made a 137 break, much to the delight of the full house present.

The rematch will be held in the ballroom of Lawlors Hotel on Wednesday October 24th at 8.30pm.

Tickets for the previous game were sold out well in advance and many were disappointed to miss the night, which was a huge success. Not only did it receive coverage in the local media, the national media were also in attendance and covered the event. Tickets can be got from the reception in Lawlors hotel, Dungarvan.

VIP tickets will also be on sale, which allow holders meet the players before the game and enjoy light refreshments prior to the match. A few local players including promoter Michael Bumster will take part in warm up game prior to the game.

Ronnie O'Sullivan has won 33 major titles, including the Embassy World Championship on two occasions. In 2001, he beat John

Higgins in the final, three years later, Graham Dott was his opponent when he regained the title. He has also won both the Irish Masters and UK championship on three occasions. Since he turned professional in 1992, the 31 year old has won close to €5 million in prize money. To date he has recorded seven maximum breaks of 147. Local Snooker promoter, Michael Bumster was referee for one of his 147 breaks.

January wasn't Doherty's first visit to Dungarvan, he played an exhibition match before another sell out crowd in 2002. The former World Champion from Dublin remains the only man to double up, as he previously won the World Amateur title in 1989.

If you want to see two of the world's elite snooker players playing on a professional snooker table, get your ticket early or you'll be disappointed.

Promoter Michael Bumster is looking forward to the match, "it's great to see two top players return to Dungarvan, the players who have visited, including most of the top players in the world, all loved their visit to Dungarvan and want to return. They enjoyed the welcome, the atmosphere and loved the scenery, so I've not problem getting them to return to the town."
