

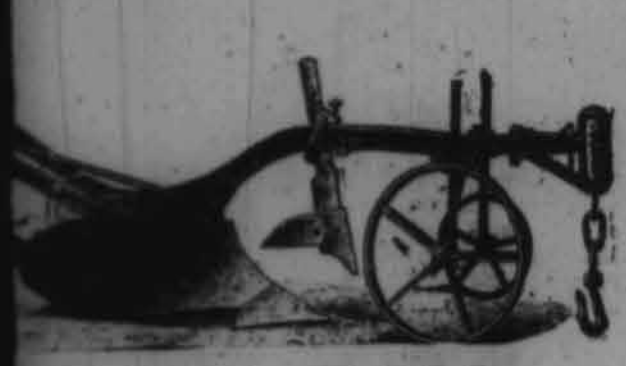

Mr. P. Sexton, J.P., chairman, presiding. Also present—Messrs. M. Brennan, J. Walsh, M. Byrne, P. J. Moloney, J. Curran, Capt. Foley and W. Stack.

The total on the pay sheet amounted to £15 lbs. 3d. Of this £10 lbs. was expended on the streets, £1 7s. 6d. on the town's improvement, sanitary, etc.

Mr. Walsh—If you make an application in writing it will be much better. Chairman—The room will have to be repaired. The roof is in a very bad condition.

Mr. Walsh—I think the board would be unanimous in granting the room for 1d. per week. Mr. Brennan here asked the clerk how they stood with regard to the old council room.

Mr. Walsh—I think that those people who are applying for the use of the room are prepared to pay a more reasonable sum than that.

Mr. Walsh—The clerk said that a resolution had been proposed by Mr. M. J. Casey in 1914 granting the use of the room to the local hand.

Mr. Walsh—That does not alter the situation. Mr. Walsh said he did not see the necessity of rescinding the resolution, as the hand and its committee were not in existence now.

Mr. Walsh—I think that before leaving there was just another matter on which he would like to say a few words. This was in connection with the pledging of the local rates.

Chairman—I think the best thing to do is to present what was to be done to the members of the board at this question will be up at the next ordinary meeting.

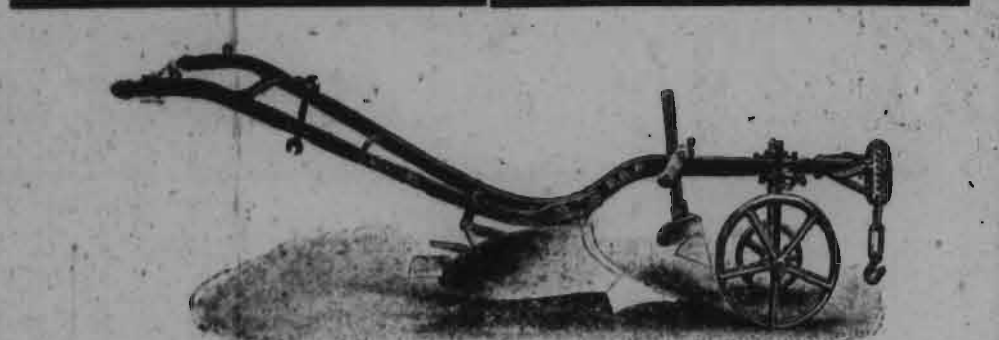
