Unlawful Assembly in Dungarvan.

CAPTAIN WHELAN ARRESTED. HE REFUSES TO RECOGNISE THE COURT.

On Good Friday when Mr. Patrick Whelan, Captain of the Dungarvan Volunteers, went to dinner at his father's house in a force of police he was arrested by a force of police and removed to the Court House in Dungarvan.

The offence with which he was charged was with unlawful assembly at Dungarvan on the 29th March according to the Crimes Act. Captain Whelan refused to take off his cap when ordered by the court and his head-gear had to be removed by Sergeant Harrington.

Sergeant Harrington deposed that on the evening of the 29th March he was on duty in Dungarvan with Const. Bolger. He saw a number of men meeting up the street from the Town Hall. He saw the accused amongst them. He was on the left front and appeared to be in command of the party. There were about 70 men there and 12 of these were equipped with caps, belts and bandoliers. Witness knew by his own knowledge that the accused was Captain of the Dungarvan Volunteers. He asked for a remand that he could produce further evidence.

Mr. O'Keefe—Do you wish to ask this witness any question? Answer—No. D. J. O'Keefe—I would ask you to remand him until Saturday, 6th April. R.M.—Do you wish to say anything? Answer—I have nothing at all to say. I don't recognise this court at all. R.M.—I will have to commit you to prison. D. J. O'Keefe—I would be prepared to accept bail if I would give it—that is if your worship would accept it. Answer—I don't want any bail at all. I would not take bail. Mr. Deo, President Dungarvan Civil Court—Is this a military or civil court? R.M.—It is a civil court. Mr. Deo—Under what Act was Mr. Whelan arrested? D. J. O'Keefe—Under the Crimes Act. R.M.—Under the common law of the land. Answer—That makes no difference at all. It is all the same. R.M.—How is it to be tried otherwise is another matter. I have nothing to do with it. It might be under the common law of the land. It could be tried before a judge and jury. This is not a military court at all. Mr. Deo—He will be tried on the 11th. D. J. O'Keefe—That is what I think. Answer—It is all the same. I don't know, but that is my opinion. Captain Whelan was then remanded in custody until Saturday, 6th April, to be tried at the Court House in Dungarvan.
