They were able to be their own... and have... The necessity of having a trained nurse for the poor of the town. They thought it as necessary as other towns similarly situated. The idea was that their original scheme might be supplemented by Father Ahern's, and in that way they could work it properly. He would like to discuss the point of view, the importance of having a trained nurse who could visit the sick poor in their homes, and from what he knew of the council he thought they would do everything possible to meet that very pressing and urgent matter.

Father Ahern said his experience during the recent epidemic convinced him of the necessity of doing something to look after the sick poor in their homes. In other towns of that size they had Sisters of Charity, who undertook the work, some of the ladies of the town had formed a society and were willing to combine with the council so that they would be able to comply with the regulations of the L.G.B. That being so, he saw no obstacle in the way, for any additional funds required could be met by subscriptions and entertainments. He would like to know the limit of the rate allowed.

The Town Clerk said he didn't think there was any limit specified in the rate that might be struck for the scheme, and the Treasury provided the council conforming to the regulations of the L.G.B. would contribute half the cost to the rates. The rates they had used on the former occasion was that the resources of small towns like Youghal fully charged as at present were able to meet only a very limited sum, and that they didn't consider having a provision for a fully trained nurse, who would do about the whole amount.

Chairman—Would she be a whole-time nurse? Father Ahern—Yes, a whole-time nurse. The original scheme having been read over.

Dr. Murphy said the cost of the nurse would have been more than the cost of the whole scheme. Mr. Quinn—What would be the probable cost of the scheme? Clerk—You would want about £200. Father Ahern said if they spent £200 they would get back £100.

Dr. Murphy said he would like to remark—as he had heard the notice discussed—that the nurse they would get would not be a midwife nurse, and would therefore not interfere with the local nurses.

Chairman—Is it not better to appoint a qualified nurse through the council as quickly as possible? There is a lot of objection to be done through dealing with the L.G.B. Mr. Quinn expressed that they must do their utmost to get on in the best of the regulations of the L.G.B. and that they must meet the limit of expenditure of £200. Mr. Quinn said.

After further discussion the following appointments were agreed to:—The Town Clerk and Mr. Quinn were very grateful to the council for their favourable reception.

Chairman—It is the duty of the council and you for bringing the matter forward.

Father Ahern and Dr. Murphy withdrew, and the council proceeded to appoint a committee to correspond with the Ladies' Committee.

Patrick's Day. A letter was read from Mrs. O'Ryan, hon. sec. of the Gaelic League, asking for the use of the Town Hall for St. Patrick's Night for the purpose of holding the annual concert. She also thanked the council for the loan of the hall for the classes, granted unconditionally.

The following letter was read from the L.T. and G.W.F. Club:—Dear Sirs—I am delighted by the Executive Council of about 1000 to apply to you on behalf of our club, for the increased rate and conditions of the following:—That an all-round increase of 10s. per week on present weekly wages be granted.

That a notice of local charitable bequests appeared recently consisting of £40 for Masses for deceased souls. A striking example of charity bequeathing at home, slightly selfish thought.

That a lively encounter took place the other night in the Main street between a demolished Imperialist and a local Republican, but unfortunately that the fun was brought to a stop for some middle-class peacekeepers before a decision could be arrived at.

That some are beginning to think that there is too much dancing going on in the Town Hall after night shows, and that it is a blessing in disguise that the "flu" ravage came along to put a stop to it, for a time even. You can have too much of a good thing sometimes.

That people are asking what does "Our Local" mean by reporting in the Cork papers that "there are no cases of influenza here," and then going on to say that "the disease does not seem to be so violent as the last."

That "Wheelman's" contribution in getting more and more interesting that his paragraph about "Glorious Beer" was jolly fine, and that "Our Local" "Columbus" "Observer" and "Hibernia" will have to look to their tanks and fight for them.

That people are asking where would Youghal be for some time but for the "Observer," and why do not local business men patronise its premises by patronising more than hitherto, seeing that not alone is it read extensively in the town and the adjoining County of Waterford, but that it is creeping into the surrounding County Cork districts. Could not "Wheelman" give us more news from East Cork?

That the Imperial Hotel will soon be able to say "We're under new management now," and that striking developments will take place in the very near future not alone in the "Inn," but also in the immediate vicinity.

Lismore Guardians.
Mr. P. Wooley, vice-chairman, presided. Alan Bennett—Messrs. J. O'Donnell, C.C., J. Wall, C.C., J. L. Galloway, E. W. Dowler, J. E. O'Donnell and T. Killy, struck off.

Mrs. O'Donnell, R.H., reported where a man in Cappoquin was getting as a week outdoor relief and also the unemployment donation. Payment was struck off forthwith.

A Child. Dr. Dwyer, M.D., reported on the 14th February, 1919, in order of the committee to inspect the boarded-out child Park, Rourke, who was in the custody of Margaret Goughlan, Fagarid, stated that the child was in a weakened and emaciated condition and recommended that the child be placed in the hands of a more suitable foster-parent.

R. O. Higgins reported that the child died on February 13th. Clerk—That is a serious matter. Dr. Dwyer—I think there was a question of sending her own children home. They all died of consumption there.

Mr. O'Donnell—I was as good as sending them into a graveyard so. After further discussion it was ordered to obtain from the doctor certified cause of death, and also to remove the other two children in this woman's custody.

The matter reported the admission of a girl named Margaret Cawking to the maternity ward for treatment. She was brought before the board and was subjected to a searching examination, and was finally ordered to be discharged as she worked in the Waterford district (Kerny Market) and had only come to Lismore the previous day.

The tender of Miss May Dee, Lismore, to supply four chests of tea at 2s. 6d. per lb. was accepted. Clerk—What have I got your damages? Chairman—You could them down. Clerk—I have given you repeatedly and I give it. Mr. Curran—You are then. It is well for us dealing with a female.
