Treatment of Irish Prisoners.

MEETING OF PROTEST AT DUNGARVAN.

Acting in accordance with the instructions issued by the Lord Mayor of Dublin, a large meeting was held on Sunday last to protest against the treatment at present being meted out to the Irish prisoners, and to demand their release.

The Chairman said they were assembled to consider a very grave matter affecting the welfare of the people of Ireland. At that moment throughout the length and breadth of Ireland men were being held, and the object of them was to protest against the imprisonment of several hundreds of their fellow-countrymen (cheers). They protested in the first place against the arrests of those men, and secondly against the barbarous treatment those prisoners were receiving.

They also protested against the insult that was offered to Most Rev. Dr. McEvoy, Lord Bishop of Down and Connor, and to the Lord Mayor of Dublin (applause). Within the past few weeks over seventy of their leaders who were imprisoned in English dungeons had been released, and this only came to pass after the dramatic escape of Edmund De Valera and the lamented death of that high-souled patriot, James Connolly (loud cheers).

About a year ago a most historic event took place in Ireland, when similar to what was being done in every parish to denounce the imposition of the blood tax on the mainland of Ireland (cheers). At that time the support and guidance of the patriotic bishops and clergy of Ireland and the unity and determination of the Irish people, the power of England to impose such an unjust law upon them had been broken for ever (loud cheers).

Following these anti-cession meetings the Government resorted to pressure again, and at this time their object was to prevent freedom of speech. They held anti-cession meetings in every parish, and these resulted in a signal victory for freedom of speech (cheers). Today they were challenging Ireland's ancient law, and now they demanded the release of their fellow-countrymen from the barbarous treatment to which they were compelled to endure.

There was also a further object in these meetings, and that was to focus public attention on the continuance of this deplorable conduct impossible in their own Christian land (loud cheers).

In fighting the battle of the political prisoners they should all realise that they were fighting the battle of the people of Ireland, for it was part and parcel of the same issue. As long as they were under British rule, the people of Ireland were prisoners in their own land, and when they struck for their own native land (loud cheers). He would now call upon their patriotic pastor, Most Rev. Monsignor Power, P.P., V.M., to read his support and great affection to make a case (cheers).

On rising to speak, the Right Rev. Monsignor Power, P.P., V.M., received a wonderful ovation. He said that he need not tell them behind their great pleasure in being amongst them that day, and was very glad that they had such a large gathering of all creeds and politics. The part assigned to him in the day's proceedings was to read the English charges in the Belfast Jail. at St. Colman's College, Fermoy, had a plot? Yes. And the Excise Officer—It was never intended that land should be taken for the benefit of people of that kind. Do you know Messrs. Stokes had plots there? Yes. Are not all those people well off? I would not say the S.O. and the borough engineer are anything like well off. Has the Urban Council anything to say to it last year? They went security for the plot-holders. How many acres of good arable land are there inside the urban area? I can't say.

Mr. T. Walsh, secretary to the plot-holders, said he had received 70 applications for plots from residents of the town. He would want plots for 100, as now that the benefits of the scheme were known the people were anxious to get them. The members of the Transport Workers would consider the matter that evening.

Inspector—This is the latest inquiry in all Ireland, and the Transport Workers only consider the matter to-day. How much land do you want? Witness—100 acres. We are satisfied others will come along. In his young days great numbers of labourers had plots in the suburban districts, but that had disappeared in the last 20 years owing to the difficulties of getting land. It would be a great acquisition to the people to get these plots. The fact that the time was so late made no difference, as the seasons were going late for the past 20 years.

Inspector—It is desirable that these plots should be given to the people? Yes. The plots were worked in the past two years most satisfactorily. It was quite prepared to give good land to the allotment holders at Carrigrohane.
