A Young Strike.—A young strike took place in Dungarvan on Wednesday last when the employees of a local public man suspended work by leaving a cart and walk at the employer's door on the Square. The dispute was on the bonus question. The differences having been adjusted, the strike ended.

It is the only way by which the voters can be initiated into the tricks of Proportional Representation.

Kilmeath and Dungarvan met already, and after a most exciting game the latter won, but an objection being lodged, a replay was ordered. Blackguard Unbridled.—The constant destruction of the public property of the town is the source of debate at the Dungarvan Urban Council regularly, but nothing is done to cut this wicked and disgraceful scourge. If the Municipal Authorities are helpless why don't they form "a Citizens' Guard" as Lloyd George did last week.

Turkey and Us.—When peace is ratified with Turkey, Ireland will get Home Rule, says an English authority. But as there never was and never will be peace with the Ottoman Empire, why do we not permit ourselves self-determination? When there is no strike on in England the Cabinet fills up its spare-time by evading means to get over the Irish difficulty, though if it meant the loss, which it does not, the question could be settled in two hours. Every scheme and plan for the supposed settlement of Ireland is a trick and a dodge with no honesty attached.

On Thursday a meeting of the Comairle Ceannaird of Nion Fein was held in Dungarvan at which an enormous gathering of delegates was present. Mr. Cathal Brugha, M.P., was present and delivered a stirring address on the general situation. Dealing with a statement made locally during the recent strike he explained the facts of the case as they appear elsewhere in those columns in a letter we have received from Mr. Brugha. He declared that every man should get his living wage, and as an employer he held that he called upon the Editor of the "Dungarvan Observer," as he regards it as the duty of the democratic programme passed at the first meeting of Dail Eireann, the wording of which was that the State should control everything. The State should have the right to make a man free from business and not the business itself if the employees are not granted a living wage. When they were in complete control of the country as far as he was concerned he would see that that was carried out (applause). Full details next time.
