



SHEEP DIPPING IN 1920

As the sheep dipping season commences on 1st June, the Department desire to direct the attention of sheep owners and all concerned in the execution and enfor ement of the Sheep Dipping Orders to the argent necessity for securing the dipping of all sheep in the Free State during the prescribed dipping periods, and in acordance with the requirements of the

The principal object of the Order of 1915 and the supplementary Orders which enable Local Authorities to require the prescribed dippings to be carried outinder the supervision of local Inspectors, has done much to retard the development of the sheep industry and to injure the ountry's vaimable export teade in sleep and lambs. Under these Orders the Local Authorities have ample means of ensuring the freedom from scab of all heep in their respective districts, and of hereby enhancing to a very considerable degree the value of the sheep industry as a whole. The present position of the industry is not satisfactory, and the export trade is handicapped by Sheep Scab Re-

rulations which came into force across

Channel last year. Every British farmer who has sheep scab in his flock is now liable to a fine of £20, with £5 additional for every sheep affected after the first four. Reporting and treating the disease will not save him from this penalty. The British Sheep Scab Regulations oblige him to take adequate steps to protect his sheep from disease, and Irish sheep will not be in lemand unless the prospective buyers have some guarantee that their purchases will not involve them in heavy fines. As matters stand, they have no reasonable security. The number of isolated outbreaks of scab, and the altogether too frequent discovery of the disease among slicep presented for shipment to, or shortly after landing in Great Britain. are strong indications of a widespread existence of the disease in this country. and Irish sheep will be regarded with suspicion as long as these indications continue. The recognised remedy is dipping. and Local Authorities have a very serious responsibility in regard to the Orders which make dipping compulsory. It is to be expected that in the coming season they will leave nothing undone to make the policy of compulsory dipping success-

sility for the cleanliness of Irish flocks rests on sheep owners themselves. Every wner of sheep is bound to dip his Sheep Dipping Order, and every consideration of luty and self-interest should urge him o discharge his obligation.
