SHEEP DIPPING IN 1936.

As the sleep dipping season commences on 1st June, the Department desire to direct the attention of sheep owners and all concerned in the execution and enthe for ement of the Sheep Dipping Orders to the urgant necessity for securing the dipning of all sheep in the Free State during the prescribed digning periods, and in acordence with the requirements of the

The principal above of the Order of 1915 and the supplementary Orders which enable foral Authorities to require the rescribed dippings to be carried out under the supervision of local Inspectors. is the eradication of scab, a disease which has done much to refard the development of the shoop industry and to injure the ountry's vaimable export trade in sleep and lambs. Under these Orders the Local Authorities have ample means of ensuring the freedom from scab of all sheep in their respective districts, and of hereby enhancing to a very considerable. degree the value of the abeep industry as a whole. The present position of the innatey is not satisfactory, and the export trade is leandlempted by Sheep Scab Replatices which came into force across Danmel last year.

Every British farmer who has sheep cals in his flock is now liable to a fine of 230, with 25 additional for every sheep facted after the first four. Reporting nd treating the disease will not save himom this penalty. The British Sheep eab Regulations oblige him to take adepusie steps to protect his sheep from ineans, and frish sheep will not be in lemand unless the prospective buyers mve some guarantee that their purchases will not involve them in heavy fines. As maiters stand, they have no reasonable ecurity. The number of isolated outreaks of scab, and the altogether too request discovery of the disease among beep presented for shipment to, or settly after landing in Great Britain. ere strong indications of a widespread sistence of the disease in this country. and Irish sheep will be regarded with superion as long as these indications conone. The recognised remedy is dipping, and Local Authorities have a very serious espensibility in regard to the Onlers high make dipping compulsory. It is to bey will feave nothing undone to make he policy of compulsory dipping success-

In the last resort, however, responsiality for the cleanliness of Irish flocks rests on sheep owners themselves. Every owner of sheep is bound to dip his Sheep Sipping Order, and every consideration of luty and self-interest should urge him is discharge his obligation. If Local Anarities require him to have his sheep lipped at a time and place appointed by the Local Authority, he should make arangements to have the whole of his flock place biaself, and give the Local Authority due notice, so that they may be represcaled at the dipping should they so desire. Forms for the purpose of this rotice and of the declarations required. speciately, (1) to accompany sheep to airs, and (il) to be stude at the end of each dipping period, can be obtained from the Loral Authority or from the Garda Whether the dipping takes place under

local regulations or not, or under supervision or not, the dipping should be by thorough immersion of the sheep in an apreved dip. In the Summer Dipping Period (from 1st June to 31st July) the sheep must be dipped once, and must have been aftern before dipping, unless they are lambs under sine months old. In the autumn dipping period (1st August to 16th November, inclusive) sheep must he dipped twice within an interval of not less than 7 or more than 14 days. The interval is important having regard to the life history of the scale parasite. The first dipping will probably kill the parasites, but their eggs may remain and get hatched out, and the second dipping is necessary to kill the young parasites befare they, in turn, lay their eggs. Where, a prisonous dip is used, it is advisable that the interval between the dipping should be at least 10 days. Every approved dip is retailed in a packet or yessel bearing a label indicating that the use of the dip in certain proportions have been approved by the Department for the purposes of their Orders relating to Sheep Scab and Sheep Dipping, and containing directions (which should be carefully fellowed) as to the preparation of the dip-

It is a matter of great importance that sheep owners should, from time to time, carefully examine their sheep for indicahioms of scab. This should always be done before sending them to a fair, market or part for slopment, at, in the event of any simp being found diseased at these places, the infected animals, and also all those which have been in contact with them, will be seized by the Veterinary Authorities and dealt with in accordance with the provisions of the Sheep Scale Order. In such circumstances, the owner of the discused sheep inflicts gravious harm on the owners of the other sheep, as well as rendering himself liable to prescrution for not reporting the existence of the disease on his farm, and for exposing discased sheep in the fair or ars, or for mending them to a port, as the case may be. The authorities of the fair, market or port are, moreover. involved in expenditure which might have been avoided, as they are required to have the place in which the sheep in question were expessed specially cleaned and disinfected.







For the purpose of improving the breeds of mountain sheep in County Waterford, the Waterford County Committee of Agriculture are prepared, subject to the approval of the Department of Agricul-ture, to locate a limited number of propagrade Black-faced Rams on the commonage areas of the Conscragh Mountains and the Waterford area of the Knockmealdown Mountains on the following conditions:— 1.—The Committee shall grant to each selected applicant a Premium of £5 towards the purchase price, the ram to be maintained in good and healthy breeding condition for two breeding seasons.

2.—Purchasers of rams shall be required to insure the animals against

quired to insure the animals against death for one year for the proportion of the price payable by them.

3.—In the allocation of rams preference will be given to applicants who apply on behalf of sheep owners who are prepared to make the rams to selected ewes.
