PARISH OF TOURNEANA.

To the Editor.
The interesting account of above parish, reprinted by you from Canon Power's "History of Waterford and Liberties," in the "Observer" of May 20th, 1925, has been carried over on Sunday, June 14th, 1925. The name of one of the parish priests who is still remembered by the people here is omitted in Professor Power's list. This is Rev. Edmund Walsh, P.P., a native of Tullow, whose pastorate was immediately previous to the second Rev. Wm. Power. He died and was buried in the church here, where his grave is a notable monument to his memory was to be seen. The inscription on a large flagstone covering his grave gives the date of his death as February, 1870. He was P.P. of Tourneana for 18 years.

DUNGARVAN PROGRESSIVE ASSOCIATION.

To the Editor of the "Observer."
Dear Sir—I have read in last week's issue of your journal where Mr. Power states he is prepared to stand behind the statements he made at the first meeting of the Progressive Association, but he admits it was from Mr. Keenan he received the facts. He must be aware that Mr. Keenan admitted at a public meeting these facts were not correct, and that it was after the statements were made by Mr. Keenan that Mr. Power stated that the council have paid five half-yearly instalments on loans during the past two years, and Mr. Power or any other citizen can have the receipts produced by the Town Clerk. There are yet three half-years due for 1920, 1921, which were not paid to the British Legal Government Department, and the council owe no apology to anybody for that, as they were deliberately retained by direction of our Government of that day, and were subsequently left back from us by the Public Works Department. Regarding the work on the quay, I think it is rather sad to find that the material is laid for, for no more only out of labour, for which I believe we have enough cash available. Anyhow I am quite pleased to see some value for the Public Works Department, and I don't think it is fair to say that the council are not doing their best to improve the quay. It serves a good purpose to belittle the credit of the council that may result.

PRIZES FOR GROWING CROPS OF IMMUNE VARIETIES OF POTATOES, SEASON, 1925.

The Waterford County Committee of Agriculture, having regard to the danger of the spread of Black Rot and Wart Disease in Potatoes, desires to encourage the cultivation of varieties immune to this disease in order that a sufficient quantity of pure seed may be available for Irish requirements without having to procure seed from outside sources where the disease is prevalent. For the purpose of this Scheme Prizes will be offered in each of two Classes as follows:

Class 1—Confined to crops of not less than one acre of any one of the following varieties—Arran Victory, Kerr's Pink and Irish Queen.

Class 2—Confined to crops of not less than one half acre of any one of the following varieties—Tirawell Perfection, Majestic, Irish Chieftain, Hooded King, Arran Grande, Great Seal or Lochan.

SHEEP BREEDING SCHEME, 1925. For the purpose of improving the breeds of mountain sheep in County Waterford, the Waterford County Committee of Agriculture are prepared, subject to the approval of the Department of Agriculture, to lease a limited number of high-grade Black-faced Rams on the commonage areas of the Comeragh Mountains and the Waterford area of the Knockmalina Mountains on the following conditions— 1.—The Committee shall grant to each selected applicant a Premium of £5 towards the purchase price, the ram to be maintained in good and healthy breeding condition for two breeding seasons. 2.—Purchasers of rams shall be required to insure the animals against death for one year for the proportion of the price payable by them. 3.—In the allocation of rams preference will be given to applicants who apply on behalf of sheep owners who are prepared to make the rams to selected ewes. 4.—The Committee will endeavour to secure that only rams of a high standard of quality will be supplied, but they cannot undertake responsibility in case any animal should subsequently prove unfruitful or otherwise unsuitable for breeding purposes. 5.—In all cases of dispute in matters connected with this Scheme, the decision of the Department shall be final.
