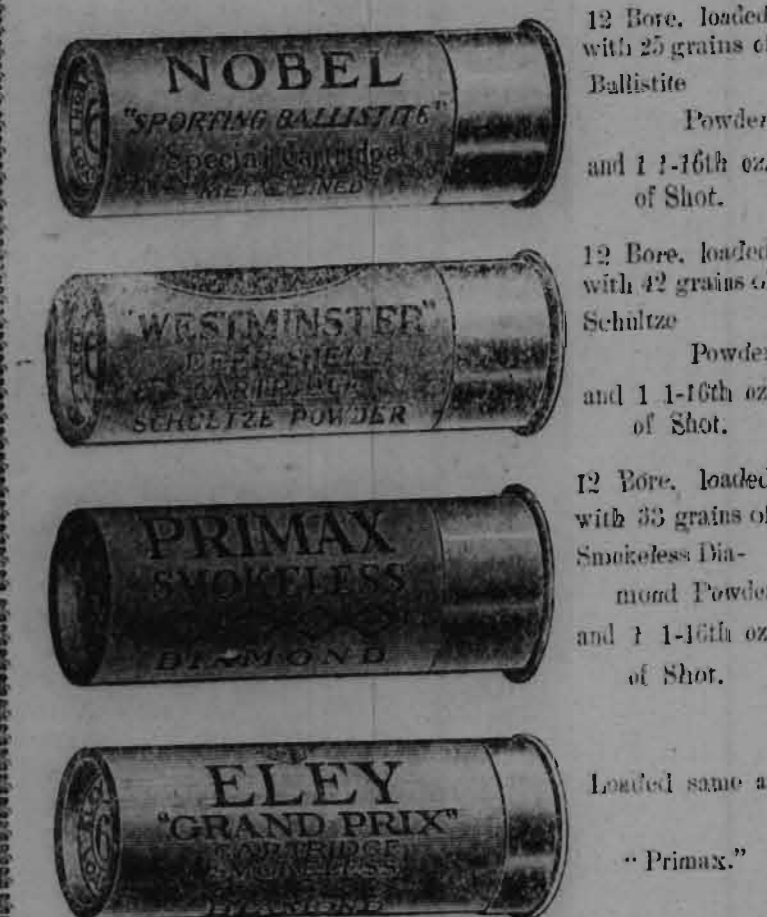

INTERESTING STORY TOLD IN DUBLIN. LOCAL LADY'S ESTATE. SETTLEMENT ARRIVED AT.

In the High Court, Dublin, on Thursday week, the Probate suit of Humble v. Kennedy was on for trial before Mr. Justice Hann.

Mr. Wood, K.C.; Mr. Joseph O'Connor, K.C.; and Mr. Boardman (instructed by Mr. Anthony Carroll), appeared for the plaintiff.

THE EVIDENCE. Mr. A. Carroll, solicitor, said he acted as solicitor for Mrs. Kennedy since 1908.

Mr. Justice Hann—What did she do from? Acute mania. Her head went badly. I think the taking of the land affected her, because she looked upon it as a will her husband in America would get all her property.

Mr. Justice Hann—Did all the instructions for the will come from herself? Witness—Absolutely. I asked her about her husband and she absolutely refused to give him anything.

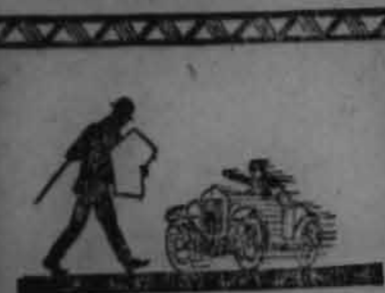
