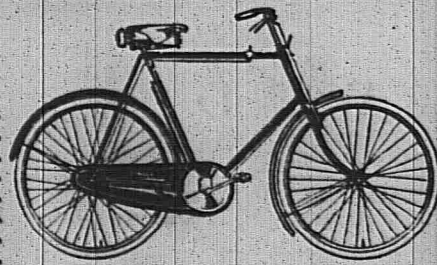

Fishing Disaster in Youghal

THREE MEN DROWNED.

Bank Holiday at Youghal was rendered a day of mourning by reason of the sad occurrence which took place on that morning, three fishermen being drowned close to the shore opposite the Loreto Convent.

In an interview with William Lynch, the sole survivor, an ex-seaman, aged 61, he informed your correspondent that they took their nets off the quay at 6.30 that morning with the intention of pulling out to Moll Goggins' Corner for a "drift."

Since the occurrence the Civic Guards from Ardmore under Sergt. O'Shea have been patrolling the shore at Co. Waterford side of the harbour, the Youghal Guards, under Sergeants Shaughnessy and Corrigan, keeping an eye on the County Cork side.

a close watch has been kept and searches made, none of the bodies have been recovered up to the time of writing.

The relatives of the unfortunate victims of Monday's tragedy were the recipients of wide and deep sympathy during the day. Amongst those who tendered their condolence was Very Rev. Canon O'Donoghue, P.P., who announced his intention of offering a special Mass for the repose of the men's souls.

It now appears that Declan Kenure, skipper of the ill-fated craft, was the chief support of his poor father, who has been an invalid and bed-ridden for the past six years.

As John McGrath, skipper of one of the boats which dashed to the rescue, was fishing all day on Monday, your correspondent interviewed him this morning. He said that as long as he lived he would never forget the occurrence.

On Tuesday afternoon the body of Declan Kenure was discovered by two little boys, Thomas Ryan and John Cahill, who were picking shells in a pool among the rocks at Clifton, and quite close to the scene of the tragedy.

ISLAND RATS.

Two sportsmen who went duck-shooting on Hare Island, in Galway Bay, had a startling experience.

The Island is situated one mile from the shore at Renmore, Galway, which in summer time is much frequented by bathers, the more daring and skilful of whom sometimes swim to the Island. The two sportsmen chose a moonlight night for their shooting, and rowed from the beach in a small boat.

Instead of the duck which they expected, however, they saw, on looking behind them, a huge army of water rats approaching them. The rodents presented an eerie sight in the moonlight, and were apparently intent on discovering who the strange visitors were who had entered upon their territory.

They approached with such rapidity that the sportsmen were at first taken aback, but they then opened fire on the rats with their shot-guns, causing havoc in the ranks.

For a time the progress of the rats was checked, but they again collected and once more approached the two men. It was not until several shots had been fired at them that they finally withdrew, leaving the sportsmen, who had had the unpleasant experience, free to return to their boat and row ashore, after coming to the conclusion that Hare Island was not the pleasant spot in the world to enjoy a good evening's duck-shooting.

Two men who visited the Island in the day-time could find no trace of the rats, which apparently only made their appearance at night.
