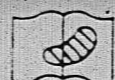

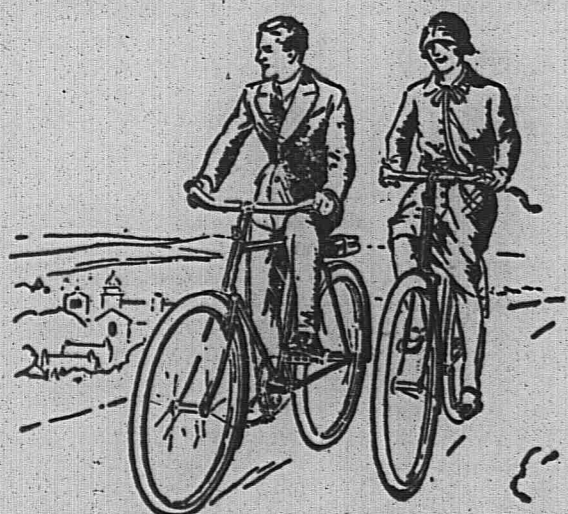

YOUGHAL NOTES.

CIVIC WEEK.
Civic Week, commencing on the 10th inst., is the principle subject on the tapis of late. The council and the committee appointed by them are leaving no stone unturned to make it a big success. If the project did nothing else but awaken some decent civic spirit locally, it would be doing a good work. As Councillor Clancy pointed out, every week in the year ought to be a Civic Week, with the result that the whole twelve months round would be a Civic Year. It is really strange, and to a large extent incomprehensible, to see the number of people of the towns of the countryside going elsewhere for commodities which they could get as good and, in the majority of cases, nearly as cheap at home. The towns are hard hit enough by vans of all kinds and sizes and shapes rushing round the countryside distributing goods without many of their inhabitants, who make their living therein going outside for their stuffs. What would be thought, for instance, of a local trader anywhere appealing for a local custom by means of a poster printed elsewhere, which could be done just as well and perhaps almost as cheaply at home? Yet even that anomaly is witnessed amongst us sometimes. Perhaps the old proverb would help to explain, though not excuse, this invidious spirit—"Cows afar off wear very long horns."

THE ROADS.
Our beautifully finished main road, which has been taken over by the county, and which appeared and promised to be such a boon, has proved to be a bit too perfect from some points of view. In wet weather the surface is so glassy and slippery that it has turned out to be a bit awkward for ordinary horse and cattle traffic. In fact it has been categorically stated at several meetings of the Urban Council that many country people are afraid to come into town and risk their animals, which find it difficult to negotiate the too smooth surface. Of late the council has spread fine gravel in the vicinity of the fair field on the approach of the fair day. It was cleared away again a day or two after. However, the stuff was left on the road after the last fair day, with beneficial results. At a recent meeting of the council Mr. M. Broderick advocated the extension of this treatment to all the main roads in the immediate vicinity. As quite a number of accidents had taken place on the untreated surface previously, this seems a really excellent idea. Both cattle and horses have fallen; worse still, in one case it is said that a lady sustained a broken arm by the fall of a pony. The trouble is what about the road outside the urban area. The County Council, who are responsible, will do nothing whatever to remedy the complaint.

TALLOW TO YOUGHAL.
Nothing has yet been done to improve the wretched condition of this important thoroughfare, which is daily becoming worse and worse. This road is very largely used in linking up the traffic between West Waterford and East Cork. Some of it belongs to the County Cork and some to the Co. Waterford, so that it is the unhappy position of being a kind of nobody's child, although it belongs to two big bodies. Would there be any chance of putting some end to the doubt and difficulty involved by applying something in the nature of a "Solomon's judgment?" Anyhow, as the road now stands, it is more than a disgrace to those two important counties—it is a positive disgrace to civilisation. If anything, the portions under the jurisdiction of the County Waterford is better cared than—or to be more correct—not so neglected as the rest.

SERIOUS ACCIDENT.
On Thursday morning, 22nd ult., Mr. Thos. Roche, farmer, Bewley, met with a most regrettable accident when he fell into a quarry near his residence. When picked up the unfortunate gentleman was found to be suffering from serious injuries to the spine, while he had also sustained severe wounds on the head and one of his legs. He was promptly attended to by Dr. White, Cappoquin, who found his condition so serious that he had to be conveyed by motor to the Bon Secour Nursing Home, Cork, where an operation will be performed as soon as his condition permits it. Mr. Roche is an ex-British Civil Servant in receipt of a large pension, and since coming to reside in Bewley some years ago he has won the respect and esteem of all owing to his gentlemanly qualities and his upright and honourable character in all his business transactions as a prosperous and extensive farmer. Much sympathy is now felt for his respected and popular wife and young family over the sad occurrence, and the wish of their numerous friends is that Mr. Roche may be fully restored to his usual good health in the course of a short time.

MEMORIAL TO A POPULAR PASTOR.
A very handsome and artistic Celtic Cross of Irish limestone has recently been erected in Clashmore Chapelyard over the grave of the late Very Rev. Thos. A. Mockler, who was for many years the devoted and zealous pastor of the combined parishes of Clashmore and Piltown. The inscription, which is in Irish on the front of the pedestal and in English on the back, is as follows:—"O Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on the soul of Very Rev. Thos. A. Mockler, P.P. Clashmore and Piltown, who died on the 20th April, 1927, in the 38th year of his sacred ministry. R.I.P."

The cross is a beautiful work of art, and has been executed by Messrs. O'Keefe and Son, Sculptors, Waterford and Dungarvan, with all the delicacy and perfection of detail usually associated with all classes of such work turned out by this well-known firm of Irish sculptors.

THIRD ANNIVERSARY.
Last Sunday week was the third anniversary of the death of Col. R. H. Keane, Fortwilliam, just three years ago. The occasion was availed of by Mrs. Keane (his widow), Mr. Jas. Lincoln, Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Baldwin, Campfire, and other intimate friends of the deceased, to place fresh wreaths and bunches of flowers both on his grave in Affane Churchyard and at the foot of the Keane Memorial in the town with cards attached bearing the simple but touching words: "In loving remembrance," which proves that the memory of this fine sportsman and popular and enterprising gentleman still remains fresh and green in the hearts of those who knew him so well and appreciated his many sterling qualities while he lived amongst us.

"LET THERE BE LIGHT"
During the present week mechanics of the Electricity Supply Board have been busy in erecting poles to carry the overhead cables for the supply of electric light to the town from the Shannon Scheme, and it is expected that the lighting scheme will be in full working order before next winter. The poles, which resemble telegraph poles, are being erected along the north side of Barrack street, and the south side of the Main street, so as not to interfere with the telephone wires which run along the north side of this street from the post office. A number of local labourers are employed in the work of excavation for the poles at a wage of 36s. per week, which has proved a great boon at a time when employment in other branches is very scarce indeed. The lighting of our town by electricity will prove a great boon, when it becomes an accomplished fact, and will be a welcome improvement on the sickly oil lamps which at present "illumine" our streets, but which only tend to intensify the darkness between them. Despite all the ingenious efforts of Paddy Dineen, our local lamplighter, to make them shed a more brilliant light into the more shady corners of the town.

FLUKE DISEASE IN LIVE STOCK.

In view of the long spell of wet weather which the country is experiencing, the Department of Agriculture think it advisable to renew the warning issued in September against the danger to be apprehended of an outbreak of liver fluke disease in sheep and young cattle unless proper precautions be taken to avert it. The present weather conditions are favourable to the spread of the infection. Farmers and stock-owners generally would, therefore, be well advised to see that all live stock are kept off low-lying pastures likely to carry liver fluke infection. The other precautions recommended are set forth in Leaflet No. 7, which may be obtained, post free, on application to the Secretary, Department of Agriculture, Government Buildings, Dublin, C.17.

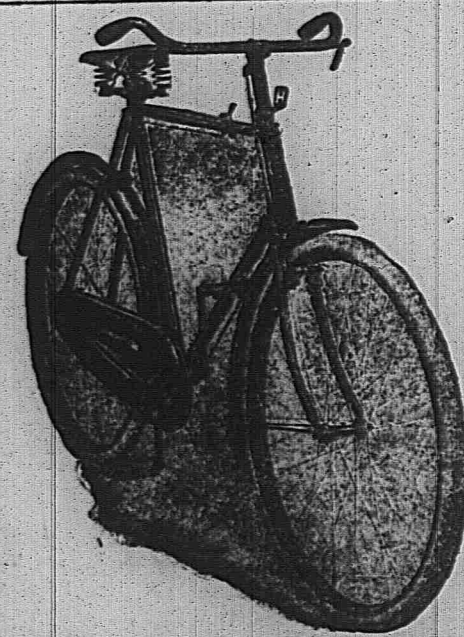

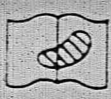

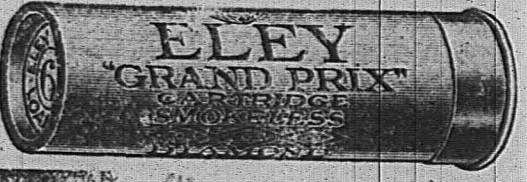
