CONTRACTORS FOR MILK SUPPLIES REQUIRED

The Commissioner administering the affairs of the Waterford Board of Public Health, will at meeting to be held at the Secretary's Office, County Home, Dungarvan, on Wednesday 10th March, 1937, consider Tenders for the supply of Milk under the Free Milk Supply Scheme approved of by the Minister for Local Government and Public Health for the half-year ending the 30th September, 1937.

Tenders should state the price per gallon for:—

(1) Milk delivered at the houses of the recipients.

(2) Milk supplied to recipients at the Contractor's premises.

The Scheme applies only to the Waterford County Health District and persons tendering should state the particular district they are prepared to supply.

Tenders will be considered only from persons who are in a position to supply the milk from their own cows, and preference will be given to tuberculin-tested milk, but in the latter case certificates from Veterinary Surgeons must be supplied at intervals of six months for the cows from which the milk is derived have passed a fresh tuberculin test.

Contractors must be prepared to enter into a bond for the due performance of the contract if the Commissioner considers one necessary.
