CONFIRMATION AT CAPPOQUIN

Bishop On The Dangers of Communism

At St. Mary's Catholic Church, Cappoquin, on Wednesday May 28th, the Rev. Lord Bishop, Most Rev. Dr. Kinane, Bishop of Waterford and Lismore, administered the Sacrament of Confirmation over 100 candidates from the Boys National School, Cappoquin, Convent of Mercy Girls School, do., Camphre N.S., Tourin N.S., St. Mary's Boys National School, and the Girls National Schools, do., as well as some boys from Ring College, in charge of an Fear Mor, who were ill when the Bishop made his visitation to that parish some time ago.

The clergy assisting his Lordship were the Very Rev. Fitzgerald, P.P., Cappoquin, Rev. T. Dunphy, C.C., do., Rev. T. O'Gorman, C.C., Lismore, and Rev. T. Murphy, C.C., do., while the sponsors in charge of the candidates were Mr. X. O'Leary, N.T., Cappoquin, Miss Gorey, Convent of Mercy Secondary School, do., Mrs. N.T. M. M. M. Mrs. Craddock, N.T., Camphre and Mrs. M. Sweeney, N.T., Tourin.

His Lordship was celebrated by the Rev. T. Dunphy, C.C., Cappoquin, who preached a powerful and eloquent sermon on the Sacrament of Confirmation, and also addressed the large congregation and said that this visitation was an occasion of great happiness and consolation to him, because he was glad to learn that the people of this parish were well-conducted and good-living, and that they were discharging their religious duties regularly, and he was particularly pleased to hear that there was no case of scandal or immorality in the parish. He was also glad to say that the knowledge of the children in Christian Doctrine was very good, which showed the sound Catholic teaching which they had received in this important subject, and he congratulated both the Teachers and the children on such excellent results.

His Lordship then administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to the children, all of whom were very neatly dressed, and he congratulated them on their good conduct and advised them how they should always strive to be good and faithful soldiers of Christ, and live pure and holy lives, and be ready to sacrifice their lives for Him. He then administered the Total Abstinence pledge to the children until the reach the age of 21 years, after which his Lordship gave Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament, which concluded the interesting ceremony.
