

SAD DROWNING FATALITY AT BALLINACOURTY

Dublin Journalist's Fate Thomas M. Carey, a well-known Dublin man, met his death at Ballinacourty on Saturday evening last under tragic circumstances.

Mr. Carey was born in Middleton, Co. Cork. He began his career as a journalist on the "Cork Herald" over half a century ago.

While working on that paper he was sentenced to a term of imprisonment in Tralee Jail during the Coercionist regime. He afterwards joined the staff of the "Freeman's Journal" in Dublin and became one of the best known reporters in Ireland.

His professional work brought him into association with some of the most historic incidents connected with the national struggle.

In his work he took more than a mere professional interest, owing to his strong patriotic sympathies.

There was no part of Ireland, or of the inhabited islands off its coast, which Mr. Carey did not visit in the course of his eventful career, and there were few great Irish events of which he was not the painstaking and accurate chronicler over an extended period.
