COUNTY BOARD OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Mr. T. D. Connolly, Chairman, presided at the monthly meeting of the above held on Wednesday last in the Court-house, Dungarvan. Other members in attendance were: Messrs. Commissioner S. J. Moylhan, P. Caulfield, J. Cosgrave, E. Cunningham, Jas. Power.

ESTIMATE FOR 1942 '43.
The Secretary submitted the following—
I beg to submit my estimate to be provided for in respect of year ending 31st March 1943, the total amount being £28,652 as against £27,874 last year or an increase of £778.

The difference is due to the general rise in prices and to an increase in Home Assistance of over £2,010 during 1941. Provision is also made for payment to the County Council of a sum of £4,429 15s. 6d. for 2,213 tons of turf supplied to the Board's institutions at Waterford, Dungarvan and Lismore. For these reasons he anticipated a debit balance at the end of the current year of £2,252 more than at the corresponding period last year. Receipts do not show any material change for the year.

HOME ASSISTANCE.
Mr. P. E. Brennan, Assistant Officer, reported the amount of Home Assistance paid out during the month was £1,862 10s. 10d. for the preceding month (the amount was £1,805 9s. 4d. and for the corresponding period last year, £1,956 7s. 6d.).

APPOINTMENT OF NURSES.
A letter from the Department sanctioned a salary of £230 a year with post and other allowances for the post of Nurse Practitioner at the Co. Hospital, Waterford. The letter also sanctioned a scale salary of £100 rising by annual increments of £2 to £120 for the post of Night Superintendent of that Institution.
