The Elections

The letter also stated that the Minor Water Scheme has been passed to the Borough Surveyor (Mr. Bowen) for his views thereon. You will remember, the letter added that this scheme has been outstanding since January, 1941, and you notified us on 27th January, 1941 that the scheme had been deferred. We, therefore, do not see our way to allow the matter of payment to remain outstanding for a further indefinite period, and we trust that early arrangements will be made to meet this account also.
