Late Kev. John O'Shea, Bally-porcen.—Expressions of regret were heard over a wide area when the news was received of the death of Very Rev. John O'Shea, P.P., Dally-porcen, Co. Tipperary and a native of Lismore, which sad event took place at the Parochial House, Bally-porcen on Saturday, 19th inst. Belonging to a well-known Lismore family, Fr. O'Shea had been in failing health for some time and failing health for some time and while his passing was not altogether unexpected his loss is deeply felt by his sorrowing relatives and parishioners and his hosts of friends; throughout the County, Spending his early student days at Mt. Melleray, Fr. O'Shea studied later at St. John's College, Waterford, and at Maynooth where he was finally ordained. His first appointment was on the Scottish Mission and he spent about Scottish Mission and he spent about years at St. Peter's, Patrick, in the Archdiocese of Glassow. Recalled to his native Diocese he served for a number of years as Chaplain in Waterford City. After this he served successively as C.C. in the following parishes: Kilgobinet, Aglish, Ardmore Fr. O'Shea figured prominently in the rescue of the erew of the "Teaser Montrase" which was wiecked on the rocks off the Ardmore coast, being one of the four more coast, being one of the four men to reach and board the ill-fated ship in the teeth of a terrific gale. The others were Coastguard O'Neill, Mr. Daniel Lawton, Lismore, and Mr. Harris of Ardmore, and of these only the two last named now survive. For this gallant action Fr. O'Shea and his ompanions were decorated by the King at Buckingham Palace with the highest possible award—the Gold Medal of the Life Saving Association. About 11 years ago Fr.
