JUNIOR HURLING SEMI-FINAL.

On Sunday last the junior hurling final of the West, or county semi-final, was decided at Modeligo before a good gathering of spectators, the contestants being Cappoquin and Dungarvan. It was a dour struggle from start to finish in which victory by the narrowest margin went to the Dungarvan bunch who were the heavier side. A thick veil of grass particularly from centre field to the lower goal militated against good ground hurling resulting in much bunching of players, wild pulling and leading up to freezing temperatures. The Dungarvan bunch who started very promisingly held a lead of seven points at one period in the first half but Cappoquin slowly but surely wore down the opposition offered by the back line and at half-time were only one point in arrears. The score sheet reading, Dungarvan 2-2, Cappoquin, 2-1. During this moiety Dungarvan were disallowed a goal which led to much controversy. The second half was a repetition of the preceding half, goal after goal, but Dungarvan were the hard ground hurling being the order. In this half Cappoquin were the back division and they notched a further goal and two points to tie the score for Dungarvan. It was only the magnificent defence put up by the Dungarvan back division that frustrated Cappoquin forwards, particularly during the last quarter, that kept the margin of victory so low. The final score was: Cappoquin, 3-3; Dungarvan, 3-2. Best for the winners were Donoghue, English, Ahearn and Sargeant, while the losers were well served by McGregor, Cashin, Butler and O'Brien. DUNGARVAN PARISH COUNCIL

FUEL FOR POOR

Very Rev. T. Canon O'Brien, P.P., V.F. Chairman, presided at a meeting of the above in the Town Hall on Monday night last. Invitations to the meeting were extended to the members of the Parish Council and members of the business people of the town. The following were in attendance: Messrs. P. J. Moloney (A. Moloney & Sons, Ltd.); N. Dunne, B.S.; E. Maier (Manager, Dungarvan Co-Op Creameries Ltd.); W. Ryan (Sheehan Ryan & Co.); J. McHugh (Messrs. K. Williams & Co.); C. Manin (Messrs. R. A. Merry & Co.); T. C. Williams, solr.; Mr. Morrissey, T.D.; L. A. Vesie, U.D.C. Ed. Butler, Jas. Langman, U.D.C.; Jas. Curran, H.M.; J. Lyons, T. A. Kyne, U.D.C.; Thos. McCarthy, C.U.D.C.; Mr. Kelly, Station Master; Mr. O'Meara, Jas. Langman, Provincial Bank; Mr. C. J. Murphy, hon. secretary was also in attendance.

The Rev. Chairman, explaining the purpose of the meeting—the provision of fuel for the poor during the coming winter—said that up to the present only one man was helping that was Willie Ryan. He was doing his best and his output was good, but that output would want to be increased by seven or eight times the amount now turned out. Therefore, he now asked the other fuel supplying firms for their co-operation and their views on what they were prepared to do in the matter. Mr. Moloney said that his firm were offered big logs at £2 a ton, these should be cut and he understood the controlled price in the area was £2 a ton.

Mr. Maher asked why the public were not appealed to and the collection could then be put to the purchase and subsidising of fuel 'Nugent' for the needy poor. He suggested approaching Miss Nugent and buying 200 or 300 tons of timber. If the timber was available for the needy poor.

Mr. Veale referred to the fact that this is now a turf area, but that all the turf cut in Comragh had gone to the Turf Development Board.

Mr. Maher said there is plenty of turf cut but not being used because of a lot would depend on the weather for the next two or three weeks.

Mr. Secretary said that Miss Nugent had done all she could for the Parish Council. They had already got all the timber around the Waterfall.

Mr. Ryan referred to the difficulty of getting this to the roadway and the cost of having it delivered.

Mr. Maher said as far as timber for the needy poor was concerned it would not be a question of cost.

Mr. Kyne expressed the opinion that the timber at the Waterfall could be got out.

Mr. Moloney spoke of the difficulty of getting saws, benches, etc., at present and asked about the advisability of substituting timber with turf.

Mr. Kyne—Turf without timber is no use to the woman or man who is trying to light a fire.

Mr. Morrissey, T.D., referred to the serious position in the town regarding fuel supplies, of which he had made a survey and which is alarming. He suggested a committee be formed to deal with the provision of fuel. He quoted extracts from a Press cutting showing what had been done by the Parish Council of a much smaller town in Co. Waterford last year (Tramore), and he saw no reason if a small committee should not be able with their population here, to trouble the work carried out by the Tramore Council. He spoke of what could be done by the organisation of card drives, dances, raffles. He spoke of an appeal to the farmers in Dungarvan area whereby if each one agreed to give a tree it might be possible to get 100 tons of timber. He also referred to the fact that in the year last year which was not availed of but which he thought should be availed of.

Mr. T. C. Williams agreed and said the guarantors when called on did not mean to have their guarantee a useless gesture to be pinned up on the wall.

Mr. Maher, replying to the Chairman, said that with three weeks of fine weather about 4,000 tons of turf would be available. With regard to the Turf Board, he was only one member, but as far as he is concerned he is prepared to deliver to the needy poor at cost price.

Mr. McHugh referred to the suitable oak timber in Inchindrisla

Mr. Thomas McCarthy, Chairman, presided.

Also present, Messrs. L. A. Vesie, V.C.; T. A. Kyne, M.I. Morrissey, T.D.; J. Dahill, J. McCann, H.M., Clancy, Senanayake, T.V. Rajaratnam, Council on Parish Council.—The Chairman was unanimously selected to represent the Council on the Parish Council.

Charge For Hall.—Arising out of a question by Mr. Kyne, the Clerk stated that the charges made by the Manager for the use of the hall were: cinderella dances, 2/-; travelling companies, 2/5 for three nights.

Repairs to Council Houses.—The Chairman raised the question and referred to numbers of buses daily in need of repairs, particularly to the house of Mrs. Waters, Abbeyside reports on the condition of which were before meetings twelve months ago.

The Clerk said application for repairs were now referred to the B.S. by him and the B.S. reports thereon to the Manager.

Mr. Morrissey, T.D., suggested asking the Manager to have a survey made of all Council houses.

Mr. Clancy thought the quickest way would be to have the rent collectors report to the Borough Surveyor. He thought that due to the scarcity of materials only essential repairs will now be carried out.

The Clerk was directed to draw the Manager's attention to the suggestion of a survey being made.

Screen Walls.—On the suggestion of Senator Butler it was agreed to draw the Manager's attention to the necessity of having screen walls erected at certain points in the town.

Waste Paper.—Mr. Morrissey, T.D., dealing with the waste paper drive throughout the country, asked what is being done in that respect locally.

Mr. Clancy said that a huge one giving a big amount of employment and they should do everything in their power to keep the industry going. Looking round that office he could see lots of old ledgers lying around and he was sure that the office all over the County there are tons upon tons of old papers, ledgers etc., for which there will never again be any use. He asked if the start one made by the Boy Scouts, in the house to house collection had fallen through.

Mr. Clancy said that in all public offices, but asked if there could be any effective way devised for dealing with the private collection. Finally it was agreed that the Press give the matter the utmost publicity and that the Manager be asked to deal with the public offices.

Standstill Wage Order.—A letter was read from the Labour Party relative to the Council's resolution on the Wages' Standstill Order, stating that the matter will receive the early attention of the Labour Party.

An acknowledgment was also read from the Fine Gael Party, stating that Mr. Cosgrave and the party generally severely criticised these orders and on several occasions when they were before Dail Eireann the Party voted against the resolution.

An amendment of the Orders which will improve the position of the workers and be fair to the rest of the community will have the full support of the Party.

The Bundoran U.D.C. also wrote stating the resolution was adopted by the Council.

School Luncheon Hour.—A letter was read from Mr. M. Foley, N.T., Abbeyside, on behalf of the managers and staff of the boys' and girls' schools stating that their luncheon hour would be from 12.30 to 1.10 p.m.

Sympathy.—A resolution of sympathy was passed to Mr. Laurence Gough and the other members of the family on the death of his sister.
