AFTER LAPSE OF 17 YEARS.

Another Senior Hurling Championship is lost and won after an absence of seventeen years the premier honours have gone back to Lismore, on the banks of the Blackwater. Sunday's final was not over brilliant but a close hard struggle was the order of the day. Watching Lismore play on Sunday last I was very much impressed by their display, and their first-time pulling boys were rathuimhally to lose in a field in the first few minutes of the game. Still the other fourteen played like trojans and held the Lismore team in a tight grip. Mick Regan, skipper of the Lismore men, is to be heartily congratulated on his masterly display at centre. Joe Duggan played a man's part in Lismore's win; though suffering from severe facial injuries he put in a hectic hour's hurling. Mick Regan in goal gave a sound display during the hour. "Gonkey" Foley at full-back, ably assisted by Vaughan and Healy made an excellent trio of defenders. W. Moore and O'Sullivan, with Regan were no easy half-back line to penetrate. Young Eransfield and Duggan were an ideal centre-field pair, while P. Moore, O'Gorman, Ormonde, J. Healy, McGrath and McCarthy showed rare dash and determination in the Lismore forward line. The vast majority of the Lismore boys are still very tender in years but their hurling was a treat to watch on last Sunday evening.

Jim Ware, in the city men's goal, brought off save after save. In fact Lismore's first goal only went a few inches inside the line. His lengthy drives from goal were always a menace to the western back division. His brother Charlie, veteran of Waterford hurling, proved on Sunday that he is still the County's premier full-back. Johnny Fanning, at left full-back, showed he has lost none of his old vigour. Matty Creed, a centre-half played a sound game, his lengthy ground drives being a notable feature of the game. Muir Ware, on the centre-fourty mark was Erin's Own most dangerous forward, and many a thrilling tussle was witnessed between him and the Lismore skipper.

Mr. Joe Kelly had lost no stone unturned in the preparation of the Lismore team for the occasion. Every Lismore change made in the course of the game proved an unqualified success. When the game was lost and won the Lismore spectators did not forget to carry the trainer shoulder high off the field as well as the players.
